

Howe Family Visit

In March, Bethany Union Church was contacted by a member of the Howe family. Descendants of the Edward G Howe family will be in Indiana for a family gathering over Easter weekend. Since they'll be close, they asked to visit Bethany Union on April 1st. They expect at least ten people and perhaps as many as thirty who would come. We are preparing to give them a tour of the church and surrounding grounds. We have also been conversing with Linda Lamberty, one of the Historians at the Ridge Historical Society. She has been most helpful as they have a wealth of Howe family information and resources, as the Howe's were great documenters. One of the most interesting facts is that our Howe House (next door) has long been known as the Edward G. Howe house, but contrary to popular opinion, he was not the first owner. Before the Howe family's residence there, it was owned by the Camillus Cox family, who may have been the ones who built it. The real Howe House may be at 10208 S. Wood St. This house was designed by the famous architect Daniel Burnham for someone in the Howe family. Linda Lamberty is investigating that further. So, our guests will not be disappointed with Lorraine Morgan, who is focused on the Howe-Bethany Union tour, and Linda Lamberty, who is on a deep dig.

Scouting Reports





