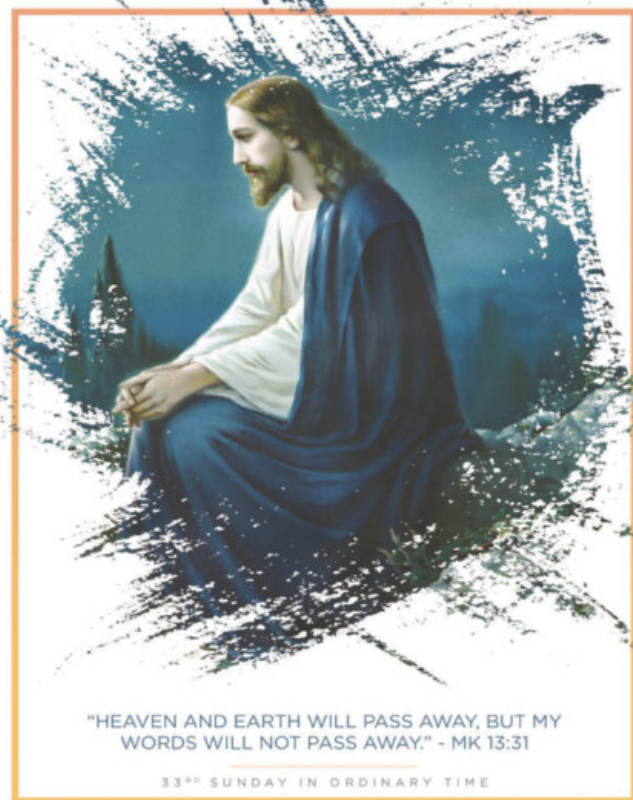

**Gospel Meditation - 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Today's readings are in stark contrast to the joy of the holiday season that is fast approaching, warning us instead of dark times ahead and our inevitable judgment day.

The first reading from the prophet Daniel describes a time “unsurpassed in distress since nations began” and warns that “many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, and others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace.” The second reading, from Hebrews, speaks of Christ who “waits until his enemies are made his footstool.”

However, when we firmly establish for ourselves as individuals - as a family and as a parish that we will give to God the first and best portion of our Time, Talent, and Treasure - the warnings we read in the Scriptures today should be no cause for alarm. In fact, we can view these words as encouragement - “Keep Calm and Steward On,” no matter what comes our way.

One of the blessings of a stewardship way of life is that in challenging times, whether in our homes or workplaces or even our beloved Church itself, we can take great comfort in knowing we have a concrete plan to keep our priorities in proper order. ### Get Your Tourtières

Our Lady of Lourdes began serving French Meat Pies in the late 1800's at its traditional holiday dinners at the church. Many of the French Canadian parishioners also prepared the "tourtières" for their own families to serve at Christmas and New Year's Day. Over the years at Our Lady of Lourdes, people would prepare and serve their meat pies at various parish events. The women who cooked for funerals, in particular, would have different recipes, so they worked through to create a consensus in order to find the best one, which is now the recipe for the parish.

The current ingredients for the pies consist of ground pork tenderloin, bread crumbs, onions and "secret spices." The traditional French Meat Pie Dinners stopped in the 1980's. Since pies were also donated for hunger relief, the parish continues to make the pies, both to support the church and to serve at our Dinners for the Hungry.

The pies can be purchased during the week at the Parish House between 8:30am and 4:30pm and on Sundays after the 8:30am and 11:00am Masses.

The cost of a pie is \$25.00 and each one serves 6-8, depending on the size of the portion. An insulated blue bag with the parish logo is included for free with the purchase of 2 meat pies.
