On October 20, we celebrated St. Magdalena of Nagasaki. She was a martyr in Japan. Japan believed that the influence of people of other cultures were corrupting their way of society. Their answer to this dilemma was to expel foreigners or, in a number of cases, they were killed. St. Magdalena was a Third Order Augustinian and wanted to encourage other Japanese people to hold to their faith.

She became a role model and was executed for her faith. For Japan, this was a time of "One Nation" with no influence from other cultures and other countries.

Today, we seem to be doing the same type of thing. Not with killing per se, but banning certain Religions and Countries to be able to enter the United States as immigrants.

For some, there is a sense that we are a Country of European stock. Some people feel that America is losing it's oneness by letting in Latinos, or people of color and people of different religions.

It is called, "Extreme Nationalism." The reality is that we always were unique and a melting pot of many people of colors and cultures.

We are a blending of many, but we are at the same time one! "E pluribus unum!"

Thanksgiving Food Baskets

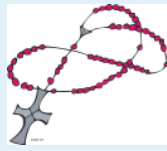

Domingo 30 - Las Fronteras

Hace unas dos semanas escuché una plática donde alguien hablaba de cómo las fronteras entre países son creadas por el hombre.

Me puse a pensar, y caí en cuenta de que lo que hoy es San Diego, antes era México, y antes era España, y antes pertenecía a tribus indígenas.

Las fronteras son creadas por los seres humanos, y por eso se podría decir que son arbitrarias, y resultantes de quien ganó la última batalla. Con el tiempo las fronteras demarcan el espacio para que un pueblo se organice según su cultura y sus valores.

Esto ha sucedido desde que empezaron las civilizaciones, y cada nación adquiere de esta manera un derecho de proteger sus fronteras.

Hoy en día, la situación de los migrantes y refugiados, agudiza las preguntas de la justicia social, que ya Dios planteaba desde el libro del Éxodo, cuando el Señor le dice a su pueblo: "No oprimirás al forastero, porque forasteros fueron ustedes en Egipto."

Cuando los seres humanos nos basamos solamente en los intereses de la nación con la que nos identificamos, las convicciones del pueblo pueden ser manipuladas fácilmente para fines de los que buscan el poder, y los inmigrantes o forasteros pueden terminar oprimidos.

Desde hace ya tiempo la retórica de algunos políticos en este país ha sido anti-inmigrante. No es algo nuevo. En los 1800s hubo un movimiento político en los Estados Unidos con el nombre en Inglés de "Know Nothing" o "Los que No Saben Nada." Se ganaron este nombre porque cuando quemaban templos católicos, los simpatizantes de este movimiento decían que no sabían nada y nadie respondía por los daños.

En esos años la inmigración católica de países como Alemania, y especialmente Irlanda, fue vista como una grave amenaza para los nativos protestantes estadounidenses.

Tal movimiento anti-inmigrante se le ha determinado "nativismo." Pero no solo ocurre en este país.
