CONGRATULATIONS ON YOUR RETIREMENT!! BARBARA DUBOSKY



After 36 years of dedicated work and service to the parish of Immaculate Conception, Barb Dubosky retired from her position of **Chief Financial Manager** and **Facility Director** of both the **church/parish** and **cemetery**! Barb had an amazing career as an employee of our parish which will always be appreciated by the pastors and the people for which she served! Over the years her position grew as her talents and years of experience proved valuable and her leadership unmatched in dedication and brilliance!

It was a simple phone call that she made to the parish office to sign up for the choir that got her an invitation to start her career at Immaculate Conception. Rev. Robert Shuda, our pastor at the time, took the opportunity to ask Barb if she would be willing to come and work for the parish for he needed a book keeper and parish manager. She said yes and would serve Father Shuda and three other pastors for the next 36 years.

Just Like in the Gospel. Those who were found trustworthy in small matters would be asked to share in greater matters as well. Her role and responsibilities continued to grow over the years. She was no longer just the manager of the parish and the school she would also tend to the cemetery and the management of facilities. Her number of years at the parish and the growing role of her position made her invaluable to the success and growth of the parish.

Speaking from Personal Experience – When I came to the parish in 2005 as the pastor, the parish was in major flux with no real direction for the future. We were coming off the failed project of regionalization (Gaudium et Spes) leaving our parish with the possibility of a merger and an off-site office facility. There were so many moving parts and financial burdens that I was at a loss to which direction to focus my attention. I quickly learned that Barb would be my wise sage and partner to the rebuilding of the parish.

“Just 20 minutes a Day” – How many info commercials begin by telling you that you could lose weight, gain strength and grow new hair.... If you spend just 20 minutes a day on a certain regiment prescribe by their company. Most of these schemes are fraudulent or almost undesirable to continue long enough to make a difference. This was not the case with Barb and I as we began every morning (5:30 am) for 20 minutes going over the challenges and the strategies that could get us back up and moving in a positive direction. Whether it were as simple as a \$2.00 monthly ticket or a complete reorganizing of priorities, funds and parish life we developed our plan and scope 20 minutes at a time!

Along with all our staff members and the generosity of parishioners sharing their Time, Talent and Treasure things changed quickly and soon the parish was known for its success and presence of the corner of Second and Oak! Barb managed the buying of property and development of the two new sections of the cemetery which now is served with a substantial endowment. The cemetery now can offer places of sacred burial for years to come! The Finance, Cemetery and Social committees were tended to with her guidance and expertise. The facilities and grounds were reformed and remodeled to meet the parishes growing needs. Every project from demolition to upgrading of our Catechetical/Administration building was under Barb's careful eye.

2,610 days – that is the accumulative time of our 20-minute (4 days a week) conversations over the years that made my administration a success at Immaculate Conception! Many times, we shared ideas, problems, strategies and parish needs that came to fruition through prayer and patience as well as hard work and resolve. Many a morning we would conclude by saying... well if that is to happen... The Holy Spirit would guide us! Sometimes we would say... that is a problem to solve another day!! The Spirit and the day seemed to always arrive and the plan and the work moved forward.


Invested Interest – I think that behind every good pastor there is a great staff. I walked into this parish with the most dedicated people you could ever imagine in every position of parish ministry and life! I thank my predecessors for hiring people who loved their work and the parish as well. Barb had a vested interest in the work she did because it was her parish and she wanted to see it succeed beyond her years as an employee. Every piece of advice, decision and priority that she would collaborate on was for securing and growing the wealth, health and spirit of her parish!

Retiring but Still Consulting! We are blessed to have hired a new parish Finance Administrator, Courtney Ruby. The transition has been smooth because Courtney has the love of the parish in her heart and the experience to tend to the business of the parish. With Barb's overwhelming amount of knowledge of the functioning of a parish and its relationship with the cemetery and Diocese she has agreed to stay on part-time to aid Courtney through the maze of parish management and over the many hurdles of Diocesan policies. The future of our parish is in good hands and when we have a need for direction or just simple affirmation Barb is still there to walk us through every step of the way.

THANK YOU!!

On behalf of the parishioners and the staff of Immaculate Conception we thank Barb for being such a loyal and good steward of the parish! I want to thank her personally for teaching me how to be an Administrator and to trust in the laity for direction and council. I will miss the 20-minute morning meetings but I still know... I can phone a friend when I am trouble!!

Catholic School Vision

Clears the Way to the Lord!!



As we begin Catholic School's week it is, once again, a great chance for me to reflect on the culture of "Seeing with Eyes of Faith" that I was fortunate to be a part of for 12 years! Long before the slogan "WWJD" there were Catholic Schools. What would Jesus do is a cute slogan but if you do not know who Jesus is and what he did... How can you do what he did?



Scanning my heart's mind with my Catholic School vision, I vividly remember every crucifix, painting of Mary and statues of the saints that hallowed the halls and classrooms of our Schools. Your eyes could not wander far from the sanctity of Catholic life and Tradition.

Instead of having the feeling of being "watched" I felt like I was being guided on the path of what it meant to be a follower of Jesus. We prayed, studied and put into practice the life of Jesus that was read to us from the Sacred Scriptures. We were challenged to find the virtues in every story as well as the "pitfalls" to avoid!

We were truly guided by those who had eyes of faith and were always given examples of how to love, forgive, encourage and pray by our teachers.

We also learned how to recognize the needs of our classmates and to count on each other at school, play and in our local neighborhoods. Catholic School kids were treated differently because of our faith and we treated others differently (WWJD) which sometimes made them uneasy.

When you look at a beautiful stained glass window your eyes can be overwhelmed by the many colors and facets of its beauty but with a trained eye (with spiritual vision) you see the symbols, images of Christ and various saints as a school and support system on how to love, to pray, to preach the gospel with confidence and conviction!

Catholic Schools still gives this kind of vision to its students! What can be overwhelming in the light of our world today becomes common place and attainable through the day to day familiarity of the

Truth and the way of Jesus' life shared within the walls and hearts of all who lead the Catholic School experience!

INVITE, ENCOURAGE AND DISCERN THE OPTION OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

MORAL VISION SEES CLEARLY FOR THE SANCTITY OF LIFE!!!

SAVE THE DOLPHINS!!!



Call me naive but when I was growing up right from wrong was evident through the guidance that I received from my parents and teachers. Morality and Ethics were simply equivalent to love God and neighbor. Sure we all had hard choices to make as kids, but they seemed to be just that, choices between right and wrong, sin and grace. So, I was a-bit taken back when I entered an Ethics class in college and found that things were not always black and white for everyone but different shades of gray. In fact, my teacher who seemed to be a former 60's flower girl, was beginning to help me question the distinction between Divine Law and Human Freedoms. While I was constant-

ly criticized by my teacher for not "thinking for myself" and ridiculed for a faith-based morality that she called archaic. One day following class, as I walked across campus, I watched my teacher get into her car. As she pulled away and I stared at the rear bumper of her car the truth was revealed. Perhaps without even knowing it, the two bumper stickers on the back of her car illustrated and reinforced what I knew all along. One sticker read: "**Pro Choice**" the other read: "**Save the Dolphins.**"



I remember thinking to myself kill the babies and save the dolphins. Does this, even for the simplest of men, make sense? This **IS** black and white. At least in this case of the unborn vs. selfishness. At least in this case Divine Law over Human freedoms. The familiar mantra that I heard preached and prayed thousands of times since January of 1973 came to me... It came from the pounding of my heart to my head with conviction and to my lips in a form of a prayer: "Lord, help us all to love and protect and respect all life... From the moment of conception until natural death." **LORD HELP US ALL!**

PRAYERS FOR THE UNBORN THREATENED BY THE CHOICE OF ABORTION

'SPIRITUAL ADOPTION'



To help stop the anti-life push in the world the late great Bishop Fulton J. Sheen encouraged the spiritual adoption of an unborn child. This is done by praying that one particular but unknown child's life be spared abortion and be allowed to continue to live. To help accomplish this, it was recommended, that an individual say the following daily prayer for a period of nine months:

"Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion. Jesus may your peace and your love embrace the hearts, minds and souls of the family, friends and loved ones who encourage this abortion and lead them all to your sacred loving heart."

PERSONALIZING YOUR PRAYER AND CHILD - It is also recommended to give a name to the child you are praying for during the first months of their life. This child may only be known to God but in the world to come it is hoped that you will meet the souls your prayers saved and spend eternal happiness with them.

PRAYER IS AWARENESS – When we pray for a special intention such as an individual soul of the unborn brings about two things: First It allows us to place our trust in the all-powerful and merciful God who responds to our plea on behalf of the abandoned; and Secondly it also brings a greater focus and awareness to a particular atrocity that can become common place. We must never allow ourselves to forget that this is a heinous act against individuals one at a time... chosen by the parents and chosen to be performed by a doctor....

THE OTHER VICTIM OF ABORTION -We cannot forget that the mother of the aborted child more often than not causes herself irreversible spiritual turmoil wondering if there could be forgiveness and healing for her. Please pray all women who are afflicted with the sin of abortion will seek God's forgiveness and love through Project Rachel. CHANGE OF HEART - We must believe that our witness to love of life can change the hearts of those who have disregarded its sacred value. Pray for conversion.

Around the Diocese

Ash Wednesday



Providing for the safety and welfare of the faithful has necessitated many modifications to our ritual practices. To reduce the risk of transmitting the coronavirus, it is not permitted this year to "sign" the faithful with ashes in the customary fashion. Rather, on Ash Wednesday the tradition of being

marked with ashes will take place in a different fashion, through a Sprinkling with Ashes.

Sprinkling with Ashes is a custom observed in many countries throughout the world. The minister, using their thumb and index finger, secures a pinch of ashes from the vessel containing the ashes. Without using words, the minister then sprinkles these ashes on the heads of the recipients.

Through this ancient practice we witness to our intention to undertake penitential practices during these Lenten days. We join with the whole Church throughout the world in acknowledging our need for continuing conversion. We express our hope and firm conviction that through Christ's victory over sin and death our tears shall one day be turned to rejoicing.

The Feast of St. Blaise is celebrated on February 3 with the blessing of throats. This is done to ask God to protect the faithful from diseases of the throat and other illnesses. This year will be different because of Covid. According to legend, a mother approached St. Blaise and begged him to help her son, who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. Blaise prayed, and the bone was dislodged.



Stretching with Scripture - St. Agnes. During the winter months, a body and soul exercise class just for women is offered **every Wednesday at 10am** via Zoom Video Conferencing. It combines gentle exercise with scripture verses for a total body-mind workout. Our presenter is Mary Evers, A.C.E., Certified Group Exercise Instructor. 
