## ASCENSION THURSDAY WEDNESDAY, MAY 12, VIGIL: 6:30 PM THURSDAY, MAY 13: 7:45 AM; NOON & 6:30 PM



Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him. Listen to the words of the Apostle: If you have risen with Christ, set your hearts on the things that are above where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God; seek the things that are above, not the things that are on earth. For just as he remained with us even after his ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him, even though what is promised us has not yet been fulfilled in our bodies.

Christ is now exalted above the heavens, but he still suffers on earth all the pain that we, the members of his body, have to bear. He showed this when he cried out from above: *Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?* and when he said: *I was hungry and you gave me food.* 

Why do we on earth not strive to find rest with him in heaven even now, through the faith, hope and love that unites us to him? While in heaven he is also with us; and we while on earth are with him. He is here with us by his divinity, his power and his love. We cannot be in heaven, as he is on earth, by divinity, but in him, we can be there by love.

He did not leave heaven when he came down to us; nor did he withdraw from us when he went up again into heaven. The fact that he was in heaven even while he was on earth is borne out by his own statement: *No one has ever ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man, who is in heaven.* 

These words are explained by our oneness with Christ, for he is our head and we are his body. No one ascended into heaven except Christ because we also are Christ: he is the Son of Man by his union with us, and we by our union with him are the sons of God. So the Apostle says: *Just as the human body, which has many members, is a unity, because all the different members make one body, so is it also with Christ.* He too has many members, but one body.

Out of compassion for us he descended from heaven, and although he ascended alone, we also ascend, because we are in him by grace. Thus, no onebut Christ descended and no one but Christ ascended; not because there is no distinction between the head and the body, but because the body as a unity cannot be separated from the head.

#### The Ascension of the Lord "The Rest of the Story"

Every fairy tale begins with, "Once upon a time" and ends with, "...and they lived happily ever after". No matter how many disastrous situations or evil characters appear to be in the course of the tale, the beginning is read with hope and the end celebrates triumph. But the end is not the end, for "they" live happily ever after. The rest of the story is left to the imagination of the reader. Fairy tales are bed time favorites, for a child can drift off to sleep and allow his/her dreams finish the rest of the story.

The Gospel is a fairy tale come true. It begins Once upon a time in the small town of Bethlehem, and ends with the ascension of Jesus into Heaven leaving the Apostles with the promise of the Holy Spirit...and they lived happily ever after... and longer.

The Ascension is a reminder that Jesus fulfilled his mission of revealing the love of the Father through His words, deeds and His death. The Ascension leaves His believers in awe of all that took place, and the promise of living happily ever after. Hope is given and triumph won!!

#### What about the rest of the story?

The rest of the story is still being told, **not** in sleepy children's dreams, but by all who have been carried away in the mystery of Christ through Baptism. The rest of the story is our lives in the Spirit, and the hope of sharing with Christ is eternity. The rest of the story is a happily ever after and beyond life itself.



#### A time for prayer and reflection

We celebrate the Ascension to highlight the significant event of Jesus returning to the Father to take His place in Glory. The Ascension is seen not as abandonment, but necessary for the final chapterto begin. So on the Feast of the Ascension we begin a ten day prayer vigil, like the apostles, awaiting the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, which will guide us through the Church, writing with our lives the rest of the story....

#### Happily ever after....

That is how people of faith live awaiting the Kingdom ... In joyful hope for the coming of Jesus Christ!



## **May: Mary's Month**

Father John



One of my most vivid memories of the month of May, as a child, was that the big clothes hamper, that handled the endless flow of dirty clothes to the wash room, became the main attraction in our home. The hamper itself, was no longer just a hamper; draped with the finest dining room table cloth, it became our family's MAY ALTAR. This altar stood in the middle of the upstairs hallway, with our family's treasured statue of "Our Lady" enshrined upon it with flowers from the yard's lilac bush and my mom's flower garden. As you walked into the hallway the heavenly scent of these flowers was a constant reminder that it was May and that it was Mary's Month. It seemed to me that everywhere I turned, at home, school and in church, Mary's "Altar" held a special place for 30 days.

It is no surprise honoring Mary as the Mother of the Church and as our Heavenly Mother,

that we also Honored our own "mom" that month too.

Mother's day (first celebrated in Spain on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception) often takes on Marian Nuances. In England, since the 17<sup>th</sup> CE, The annual "Mothering Sunday" was celebrated on the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

Before our country's "Mother's Day" became a "Hallmark Moment" and the one day everyone should take mom to breakfast, or at least phone her, it had links to the Blessed Mother. The tradition began, through the efforts of Anna Jarvis (1864 - 1948), with church services in Grafton, West Virginia, and Philadelphia Pennsylvania, in honor of Anna's own mother. In 1910, the governor of Oklahoma issued the first Mother's Day proclamation. The following year all the states did so. Congress and the Executive Office cooperated in 1913 in a national resolution establishing the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. *Anna Jarvis died, disillusioned that her religious efforts had become almost entirely secular and commercial.* 

As we approach Mother's Day, we must remember that the best way to honor and respect our own moms, we must first Honor the Mother of Christ, who is the Christian model of motherhood for all today's Mothers.

So, if that simple May altar has disappeared in your Homes, erect one this year. Take time to reflect on the life of the Blessed Mother; bring her flowers; beseech her for motherly care, so that the flowers, the breakfast, or the phone call next Sunday, will be more than a thanks to your mom in her efforts to meet your temporal needs, but will be a sign of your appreciation of her spiritual guidance as well in your life.



"Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people,


who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?"

\*\*The Diocese of Greensburg requires all clergy, parish, cemetery, school employees and all volunteers 18 and older to have all of the following clearances and trainings <u>prior to work or ministry in the diocese</u>:

#### For NEW Volunteers:

- Diocesan Code of Pastoral Conduct
- PA Mandated Reporter Training
- VIRTUS Training (Every 5 Years)
- PA Criminal History Check form (Every 5 Years)
- ♦ PA Child Abuse Form (Every 5 Years)
- FBI Fingerprint Check (Every 5 years. Initial submission must be done through screening agency. Then every 5 years screening agency OR an Affidavit for volunteers only.

#### For **CURRENT** Volunteers who require updated training:

- Volunteers are required to complete VIRTUS training every five (5) years to continue to work or perform ministry in the Diocese
- ◆ The initial course required for all employees and volunteers is "Protecting God's Children Awareness", which is already completed if you are a current volunteer
- To meet the five-year update requirements there are two additional courses from which to choose, "VIRTUS, Protecting God's Children Re-Certification for Adults" and "Keeping the Promise Alive". (Choose one to complete now and the other class will be done after 5 years have passed)


