NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

PENTECOST THE CHURCH'S LIFE IN THE SPIRIT

"We have not so much heard that there was a Holy Spirit"

Pope Leo XIII instructs in his encyclical <u>Divinum Illud Munus</u> that all Christians should direct towards the Holy Spirit the highest **homage of our love and devotion**. We may do this most effectually if we will daily strive to **know Him**, to **love Him**, and to **implore Him** more earnestly. One cannot benefit from gifts that have not yet been opened... and less so if the gift is unknown to the recipient.

DO YOU KNOW THE STATE CAPITALS?

I am sure somewhere in the time while in school I was expected to have learned the state capitals. I just do not remember learning nor retaining that information. I never dreamt that playing with my six year old Godson it would be required of me to know them. He not only wanted to learn them but play a matching game to boot. I guess now that he knows them; he will have a jump on his classmates when that assignment comes along. So if he could learn his capitals, then he certainly could learn the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Sure he cannot fully comprehend their meaning any more than he can the purpose and importance of a state capital.... But it is never too soon.... When he receives confirmation, he'll be ready. So perhaps it is not such a

bad idea for all of us to reinvestigate the gifts of the Holy Spirit by first learning them by heart... Not so much by memory... but by heart for it is there that we can put them to good use. When St. Paul went down to Ephesus, he found disciples that were baptized and yet had never heard of the Holy Spirit. (Acts 19:2) When Paul realized this he laid hands on them and invoked the Holy Spirit to be upon them. As I was reading and praying over Pope Leo XIII encyclical, it became apparent that it is my responsibility to be like St. Paul and reawaken these gifts in those who I serve in the name of Christ and his Church.



Moments of Personal Reflection

Here are a few simple questions to reflect on in the (octave) eight days of our celebration of Pentecost...

- 1. When did you receive the Sacrament of Confirmation? How old were you? What significance did it have?
- 2. Do you know the gifts of the Holy Spirit? Can you name them?
- 3. Do you invoke them in and through your daily prayer? Do you approach every life situation through these gifts?
- 4. Have you read of their meaning in the Catechism of the Catholic Church?

WHAT IS THE NEED OF THESE GIFTS?

By means of them the soul is furnished and strengthened so as to obey more easily and promptly His voice and impulse. Wherefore these gifts are of such efficacy that they lead the just man to the highest degree of sanctity; and of such excellence that they continue to exist even in heaven, though in a more perfect way. By means of these gifts the soul is excited and encouraged to seek after and attain the evangelical beatitudes, which, like the flowers that come forth in the spring time, are the signs and harbingers of eternal beatitude. Lastly there are those blessed fruits, enumerated by the Apostle (Gal. v., 22), which the Spirit, even in this mortal life, produces and shows forth in the just; fruits filled with all sweetness and joy, inasmuch as they proceed from the Spirit. In the secular world that calls us to strive for the golden ring it is easy to lose track of the meaning of our Christian mission. Praying and meditating on the gifts of the Holy Spirit will allow us to remain focused and approach this life, as it is ... a temporary human experience. Since these gifts have been given to us through the Church, it is obvious that the heart of the Church is united one soul at a time through the participation of the sanctifying Grace of the Spirit in the sacraments. As we grow so does the unity of believers. All the more reason our Sunday Obligation becomes necessary for a fruitful life.

OUR RESPONSIBILITY

St. Paul tells us through the Ephesians: Grieve not the Holy Spirit by which you are sealed (Ephesians 4:30). We are the temple of the Holy Spirit and we are to do nothing to impede it's work of sanctification. It is not enough to avoid sin but to act in the abundance of the gift in which we were sealed. In order to assure this Further, Pope Pius XIII writes, we ought to pray to and invoke the Holy Spirit, for each one of us greatly needs His protection and His help. The more a man is deficient in wisdom, weak in strength, borne down with trouble, prone to sin, so ought he the more to fly to Him who is the never-ceasing fount of light, strength, consolation, and holiness.

OUR PRAYER

"Come, Father of the poor! Come, Giver of gifts! Come, Light of our hearts! O, best of Consolers, sweet Guest of the soul, our refreshment! Wash, heal, water our minds and hearts, and to give to us who trust in you the merit of virtue, the acquirement of salvation, and joy everlasting."



We should confidently and continually beg of the Holy Spirit to illuminate us daily more and more with His light and inflame us with His charity: for, thus inspired with faith and love, we may press onward earnestly towards our eternal reward, since He "is the pledge of our inheritance"

- The initial course required for all employees and volunteers is "Protecting God's Children Awareness", which is already completed if you are a current volunteer
- Volunteers will be contacted when it is time to update their Virtus training.



Creed






