NOTES FROM THE PASTOR



Trinity Sunday

The western Church observes the feast of the Most Holy Trinity on the first Sunday after Pentecost. Every Sunday, and every day, being dedicated to God. Therefore, in a measure a feast of the Trinity, a special feast did not become general until the 14th century, and it is still unknown in Eastern rites. It was first used in the church of Canterbury under Saint Thomas Becket and spread from thence.

Light, Radiance and Grace are in the Trinity and from the Trinity A letter by St Athanasius

It will not be out of place to consider the ancient tradition, teaching and faith of the Catholic Church, which was revealed by the Lord, proclaimed by the apostles and guarded by the fathers. For upon this faith the Church is built, and if anyone were to lapse from it, he would no longer be a Christian either in fact or in name.

We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity there is no intrusion of any alien element or of anything from outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energizing reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the holy Trinity is preserved. Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is above all things and through all things and in all things. God is above all things as Father, for he is principle and source; he is through all things through the Word; and he is in all things in the Holy Spirit.



Writing to the Corinthians about spiritual matters, Paul traces all reality back to one God, the Father, saying: Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit, and varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of service but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone.

Even the gifts that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs also to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father.

Similarly, when the Spirit dwells in us, the Word who bestows the Spirit is in us too, and the Father is present in the Word. This is the meaning of the text: My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him. For where the light is, there also is the radiance; and where the radiance is, there too are its power and its resplendent grace.

This is also Paul's teaching in his second letter to the Corinthians: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. For grace and the gift of the Trinity are given by the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. Just as grace is given from the Father through the Son, so there could be no communication of the gift to us except in the Holy Spirit. But when we share in the Spirit, we possess the love of the Father, the grace of the Son and the fellowship of the Spirit himself.

FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH—THE HOLY TRINITY

IN BRIEF

261 The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

262 The Incarnation of God's Son reveals that God is the eternal Father and that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, which means that, in the Father and with the Father the Son is one and the same God.


263 The mission of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father in the name of the Son (*In* 14:26) and by the Son "from the Father" (*In* 15:26), reveals that, with them, the Spirit is one and the same God. "With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified" (Nicene Creed).

264 "The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father as the first principle and, by the eternal gift of this to the Son, from the communion of both the Father and the Son" (St. Augustine, *De Trin.* 15, 26, 47: PL 42, 1095).

265 By the grace of Baptism "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit", we are called to share in the life of the Blessed Trinity, here on earth in the obscurity of faith, and after death in eternal light (cf. Paul VI, CPG § 9).

266 "Now this is the Catholic faith: We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance; for the person of the Father is one, the Son's is another, the Holy Spirit's another; but the Godhead of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal" (Athanasian Creed: DS 75; ND 16).

267 Inseparable in what they are, the divine persons are also inseparable in what they do. But within the single divine operation each shows forth what is proper to him in the Trinity, especially in the divine missions of the Son's Incarnation and the gift of the Holy Spirit.



Diocesan Lenten Appeal Success and Upcoming Projects

I first want to thank everyone who shared in the Diocesan Lenten Appeal again this year! We reached our Diocesan Goal of \$138,116.00. As of June 4th, our parish share is \$87,618.00 We are \$7,382.00 away from our parish target of \$95,000.00. On behalf of Bishop Kulick and myself we thank you for helping us to continue the missions of the Diocesan and parish life. The Diocesan portion helps with the overall mission of the church and the parish share helps us to continue the facilities repairs and upgrades that are necessary for safe environment and growing parish life. Our projects are always managed in a timely fashion and only challenged today by supply and demand.

So here is brief summary of what we are working on to accomplish before summer's end.

- Refinishing the exterior doors of the church This will be the third time during my tenure that we have refinished the exterior doors of the church. They are solid oak and need to be refinished and restored to their original luster. We will also be replacing the door in the alley since the bottom has nearly rotted through. That project began this week.
- ♦ Exterior Lights for the parking Lots This project has been under way with bids on exterior lights that will better light our parking area. These lights will be placed on the administration building and give a safer and more visible parking for all parishioners.
- Parish Organ upgrade Excited about the upgrade of the parish organ with the latest electronic advances but frustrated by supply chain issues. As soon as the parts are available we will begin the renovation.




