
BAPTISM

Thoughts from the Pastor

HOW IS MY DRIVING? CALL 1-800-VATICAN Bless me Father for I have sinned

Before seatbelts, airbags, power steering and Anti-lock Brake Systems we relied on my Fathers driving skill and PRAYER to arrive safely at our destination. We piled into the car and as dad headed up the road—no matter how far the trip—we began our prayer: "Our lady of the highway, be with us on our journey, for all your ways are beautiful and all your paths are peace." This invocation followed by a "Hail Mary" successfully carried the Moineau family from point "A" to point "B" each and every time. Then when I got older I was given the keys to the car myself and was asked to make a commitment to the Sacred Heart and the Driver's Oath before I was allowed to venture out onto the roadways. The privilege of driving was to be respected, recognized as dangerous and approached with moral responsibility. So when the Vatican recently addressed driving as an "occasion of sin" handing down "Ten Commandments" to follow it made perfect sense to me.... Especially when so many people confess their actions behind the wheel as sinful. So, the car can be an occasion of sin or a vehicle of Grace... we must decide...

OCCASION OF SIN COULD LEAD TO DEATH



When our nation went on alert against possible terrorist attacks guarding against anthrax. bombings and military threats we remain caught in the cross-hairs of irresponsible drivers controlling a two-ton missile loaded with combustible fuel. Whether the driver is on a suicide mission or murder suicide adventure we are subjected to threat. Just last week a man paid \$25,000 for the newest of these weapons and within a mile of the dealership he rocketed his mustang into the air nearly killing himself and his passenger, 42,635 people died in auto accidents while 10,143 of those deaths were alcohol-related fatalities. Is it any wonder the commandment: "Thou shall not Kill" comes to mind? So as the culture goes so does the Church in addressing basic moral laws and virtues to our everyday life. People may laugh at the Catholic Church for being "Pastoral" towards their approach to

driving.... But it is no laughing matter.

VEHICLE OF GRACE

Each of us jump into our vehicles and head off to church, work, school, the soccer fields, grocery stores or to visit friends without giving it a thought that our vehicle is an opportunity to practice the Virtues. The statement on "driving" that the Vatican released states that the Virtues of charity of neighbor, prudence, justice and hope are to be practiced as safe driving guidelines.

Charity of Neighbor means to make sure your vehicle is safe for the roadways and does not present potential hazards

to others sharing the road with you. Practicing patience and humility affords one to be courteous to others and aware of pedestrians, cyclists and less skilled drivers. Waving a hand for someone to move into the flow of traffic is preferable to raising one finger in distain of those trying to edge their way into traffic. Love the least of your brother.... AMEN.

Virtue of Prudence can simply be recognizing your own abilities and the limits of the car to perform. Such awareness to speed and braking distances, the use of turn signals and weather conditions allows one to travel safely



through the everyday hazards of the roadways. Personal distractions as the use of radio (louder than the senses) and cell phones should be considered as distractions that can impair your ability to drive safely.


Virtue of Justice requires that drivers have a full and precise knowledge of the Highway Code. Indeed, those who use the roads should know the regulations and take them into account. Furthermore, drivers are obliged to demonstrate that they are in a suitable physical and psychological condition. If they are inebriated, they should never get behind the wheel of a car nor be authorized to do so. Like anyone else, they are obliged to be sober: in fact, alcohol creates a state of euphoria and reduces mental capacity to the extent of giving rise to fatal accidents." Restitution for damage done in careless driving is a moral obligation. The Virtue of Justice must always find forgiveness from the victims toward the aggressors as well.

Virtue of Hope means that every traveler has the hope to arrive safely at their destination. Acting in a charitable way in assisting others who become stranded by car malfunctions or mishaps calls to mind the aid the good Samaritan gave to the man along the road and the aid Joseph and Mary finally received in Bethlehem. Allowing oneself plenty of time to travel safely also plays into the journey being one of virtue instead of an occasion of sin.

ROAD RAGE - NOT A NEW THING

In 1998 the Washington post coined the term "Road Rage" for the over aggressive approach to driving. It has become a matter of extreme hatred for people in other cars Especially for those who are following the laws of the road and if by any chance you are making a left turn you are an idiot and incompetent driver. There is a sense that each highway should be a raceway and every city street a place of contempt for those who are simply driving to work or home.



This is not a new phenomenon, for I think driving and rage have been there since the invention of the automobile. Recently I purchased on eBay a collection of magazines called the "Liguoian" from 1964. As I read through the magazine it seems that the problems we have today are the same problems we suffered some 60 years ago. As I was reading through one magazine I came across a "Drivers Litany" that still applies to todays challenges of driving and go along with this article virtues vs. sin. I want to post it here in this article as well as the Holy Father's Ten Commandments of driving.

A Driver's Litany- May 1964

From Domineering driving, from the vanity of power and infection of speed, God Deliver me

From carelessness and indifference, from the demon of impatience and the tyranny of time. **God Deliver me**. From ignorance and ungraciousness, from harsh judgment and the food of invective, **God Deliver me** From inattention and monotony, from the delusion of drink and obscurity of fatigue, **God Deliver me**

Grant me, O Lord, a divine courtesy to all. Awake in me abiding care for the slowness of age and the rashness of youth. Let our vehicles become instruments of thy purpose bringing happiness to all who travel with us and leaving no one weeping at our passing. This we beg in Christ's name Amen.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF DRIVING:

- 1. You shall not kill.
- 2. The road shall be for you a means of communion between people and not of mortal harm.
- 3. Courtesy, uprightness and prudence will help you deal with unforeseen events.
- 4. Be charitable and help your neighbor in need, especially victims of accidents.
- 5. Cars shall not be for you an expression of power and domination, and an occasion of sin.
- 6. Charitably convince the young and not so young not to drive when they are not in a fitting condition to do so.
- 7. Support the families of accident victims.
- 8. Bring guilty motorists and their victims together so that they can experience forgiveness.
- 9. On the road, protect the more vulnerable party.
- 10. Feel responsible towards others.



Faith Formation Options for Public School Children

PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Grades 1 and 2

Faith Formation Class – held on Saturday mornings from 9–10:30 a.m. usually twice a month

Sacramental Preparation

Children preparing for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion participate in family centered preparation in addition to their classroom sessions. This preparation includes a family meeting as well as 4 workshops throughout the year. Sacraments are received in 2nd grade.

Also just grades 3, 4 and 5 meet Monday nights at this point, 6th grade has been swept into Middle School, which is the Matthias Project

The Matthias Project is our Confirmation Preparation program. Starting in 6th grade, the young men and women learn about following the call to the "The 12th Apostle" and boldly follow Christ the way that St Matthias did when he replaced Judas. The Sacrament of Confirmation is received in the 8th grade year.

Grades 3-6

Faith Formation Class – held on Monday nights from 6–7:30 p.m. usually twice a month.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a faith formation option for young children offered at Immaculate Conception. It is based on the philosophy that even the youngest child is in a relationship with God.

412 Youth is the combined youth ministry program for the three area parishes of Immaculate Conception, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and St. Agnes for all students in grades 9-12.


