
BAPTISM

Thoughts from the Pastor

Pro-life Focus: "Changing Hearts and Saving Souls"

In the wake of the over-turning of Roe vs. Wade focus now must shift more to "Changing Hearts and Saving Souls."



When I was young I thought that it would be difficult for any soul to end up in Hell. For then, as I do today. Know and believe that God's Mercy is greater than any sin.... I mean any sin no matter how atrocious and evil it may be in its action and execution. Abortion is a great evil in our society and the promoting of it as a women's right of their body is the same approach Satan used in the Garden of Eden when half-truths were told to Adam and Eve making them also believe that they were just as capable of deciding right and wrong, good and evil for themselves. Their sin was devastating causing the loss of the gift of paradise and in return receiving death. Every grave sin is a choice to set ourselves up as a God and believe that we have the right to choose what **IS** right and wrong for

the glory of our own earthly lives. Notice I said to choose what IS right and wrong. This is not the same as using free will to choose an Absolute right over a absolute wrong which is Divine truth revealed by God. One is always free choose evil over good but we must not misconstrue this principal with the modern day and theory of moral relativism. Which states:

> Ethical relativism is the theory that holds that morality is relative to the norms of one's culture. That is, whether an action is right or wrong depends on the moral norms of the society in which it is practiced not upon the absolute of Divine Truth.

This view leads one into two grave and moral dilemmas':

- 1. That there is no Divine Truth
- 2. That there is no need for a moral code or a responsibility for our actions in relationship with God.

Moral relativism is the slippery slope on which a society shuts out God and creates a world that seeks to act freely without any consequences for those actions because their behavior is relative

only to the Truth that "they" have conjured up in their own mind and

uninformed conscience.

When I witnessed the absolute hate towards the over turning of Roe vs. Wade on the faces of many worldly officials and pro-choice people I felt the evil one's presence and he was laughing at the sacredness of life. Oh yes, Satan is living a dream with those who believe that their sexual behaviors have no moral consequences and the offspring of the beautiful gift of procreation can be terminated and be labeled a women's choice. Satan finds his winning groove



again as he once had in the garden turning the beauty and sanctity of man, women and family into the selfless act of Pride and self-glory. Yes, it is true and firmly believed and taught that Jesus' Mercy endures and can conquer the actions of grave and deadly sin.... Changing Hearts: This is the key we need to awaken in the hearts of all who believe that an abortion is a "right" and not a direct act of hatred against another human person. We must focus more on the unborn child and its complete dependence of its' MOTHER! We must learn to allow the unborn, who has no voice, to use its beating heart (five weeks after conception) to sound loud as a cry for love and life!

PRO LIFE GENERATION

Our teenagers must be able to identify themselves with the idea that they are Pro-life! This means we must impress upon them the sanctity of life, the dignity of virginity and the wholesomeness of relationships that lead to family life of Faith. We need to help them to overcome the world's view of "if it feels good do it" and show them that a child's life, in every situation (because of its vulnerability) must be protected first above all other desires and concerns.

Putting the Child First – What mother, father, family member would not have sacrificed their own life for the sake and safety of their child in Uvalde Texas at the moment of the shooting and murders of the innocent. This is what we need to return to for the unborn as well for they too are defenseless to the procedure of abortion that takes their life.

Saving Souls – I believe and know that the Holy Innocent of abortion are in heaven suffering a martyr's death. But the souls that are being lost are those who believe abortion is a right and the pregnancy is not a child and choose to end its life. The souls of doctors that perform abortions and see the death first hand. The souls of those who encourage abortions for the sake of the easier path. Souls are in jeopardy and we must act in a loving and merciful way to reach them. Prayers to our Lady and the recitation of the Divine Mercy should be our focus.

Sacrament of Recompilation – We must encourage those that we know who have had abortions to seek reconciliation and healing through the Church. To become then advocates for others who need advice and comfort as they live the reality and pain of the choice to choose themselves over their unborn child.



Heart Speaks to Heart – We desire in our prayer that our heart may speak directly to the heart of Christ. Remembering: "Jesus took on flesh to become like us so that we may become like Him." How beautiful this would be for a woman to realize that the very life with in them beats with a heart that is "shared" with theirs! How beautiful it would be if they could only imagine that their pregnancy was not a problem but a new life that would and could become like them. An image of themselves to nurture and to love into the love of God. This is our goal and we must work towards it with fervent love.








CREED





YOUTH FORMATION

Faith Formation Options for Public School Children

PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Grades 1 and 2

Faith Formation Class – held on Saturday mornings from 9–10:30 a.m. usually twice a month

Sacramental Preparation

Children preparing for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion participate in family centered preparation in addition to their classroom sessions. This preparation includes a family meeting as well as 4 workshops throughout the year. Sacraments are received in 2nd grade.

Also just grades 3, 4 and 5 meet Monday nights at this point, 6th grade has been swept into Middle School, which is the Matthias Project

The Matthias Project is our Confirmation Preparation program. Starting in 6^{th} grade, the young men and women learn about following the call to the "The 12^{th} Apostle" and boldly follow Christ the way that St Matthias did when he replaced Judas. The Sacrament of Confirmation is received in the 8^{th} grade year.

Grades 3-6

Faith Formation Class – held on Monday nights from 6–7:30 p.m. usually twice a month.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a faith formation option for young children offered at Immaculate Conception. It is based on the philosophy that even the youngest child is in a relationship with God.

412 Youth is the combined youth ministry program for the three area parishes of Immaculate Conception, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and St. Agnes for all students in grades 9-12.
