MATRIMONY



Thoughts from the Pastor



THE SAINTS: COMPANIONS OF THE JOURNEY TO HEAVEN

By definition a companion is: A wayfarer that travels with you. They are possibly the most important part of the journey. The sojourner may encounter others like them, known as companions, while exploring the life of faith in the journey. These companions may help the sojourner but cannot hinder them along the path.

Jesus reminds us that it is a narrow path that leads to eternal life. We know that the journey is hard and long and it must not be traveled alone but shared with true guides of Faith and example. In the book by John Bunyan "The Pilgrims Progress" this path is laced with many temptations, fears and choices that is hard to navigate without a companion. We know that Jesus shows us the way (the cross) and our earthly friends and families and priest guide us to keep our eyes on Christ. However, our greatest companions and guides are the ones who have completed the journey and have entered through the narrow gate. **These are the Saints**! They have run the good race and won the crown of the true victors and they desire, for all eternity, to help us accomplish the very same goal!

As long as I can remember, starting with the Blessed Virgin Mary, the saints have been my friends. They have been true companions on the way to loving Christ and His Church while desiring to stay on that narrow path to heaven. I was always aware of the great example they showed through courage and virtue. I always hoped that I could be as brave as the martyrs, as smart as the doctors and as holy as the virgins. It was the Saints who shared common life circumstances, struggles and personalities that I always favored to imitate and invite to walk with me.

Many think of Saints as idols that we worship because we are afraid to trust in Jesus' way and promise. Others seem to think they respond to us like a prize-winning genie in a bottle found on the ocean beach front; Someone that is at our beck and call to make the way easier with special gifts granted according to our "will" and not that of God's will. The power of the Saints and their desire to be intercessors are to keep our feet from stumbling and aiding us with the disposition that leads us to a life of grace and peace.

THE ROLE OF THE INTERCESSOR



Saint Therese of Liesuex is famous for saying: "I will spend all my heaven doing good on earth." This is truly the desire of all Saints. The Saints want to be that companion on the road to heaven. The Saints desire to go before the throne of our beloved Lord and beg mercy for us and to shower us with gifts of Faith Hope and Love! The Saints know how much they depended on these gifts to become holy. Becoming "holy" is the goal and that is done through God's will and not our weak and worldly desire to have a comfortable pass through the valley of Darkness. Saints know that certain attributes of their lives have been highlighted for us to desire for ourselves. These gifts may vary from cures to illnesses, bravery in the battles against addictions and habitual sins as well as the finding our way to carry the cross. They plead on our behalf so that all glory can be given to God and that our poor souls can be illuminated in the spirit to shine too as one marked as a "disciple of Christ!

MY BELOVED INTERCESSORS THROUGH CANCER

Under the careful protection of the Mother of God.

Of course, Mary is our number one Saint and Intercessor! It is truly a maternal instinct to run to her as our spiritual mother for she feeds (nurtures) us with the love of her Son that encourages us to seek comfort in His desire to make us his special and beloved friends like the Apostles of old. She quiets our fears, our anxiousness and selfish desires by

placing us next to her heart so we can feel/hear the love of a pure soul. Mary's many titles show and teach us of the many ways she desires to be an example and help as a companion on the way! Choose one or more of her titles that allows you to have her intercede in the particular need you have to overcome at any specific moment. No greater companion "on the way" than the Mother of God.

It seemed so natural to me as a child to go to Mary for direction, comfort and companionship since my own mother was always my greatest source of strength. It started simply with learning to pray the rosary and meditate on the Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries of her life with Jesus. Seeing her as a "real" person being so dedicated through the best and worst of times gave me comfort in knowing what it meant to be a follower of Jesus. I also learned, as I matured in age and faith, that there were things I needed or was worried about that my mom was incapable of tending to for they were more spiritual in nature than worldly. Secrets of my heart that troubled me or even sinful inclinations that tempted me were also much easier to speak to our Lady about than a parent, priest or friend. I always knew if I took my concerns to her she would give the same answer: "for the sake of my son.... Listen to Him with love." It was not her voice I heard with my ears but an audible echoing in my soul. IF I would ask in a self-serving manner or out of fear to be challenged with the presence of the cross (i.e. Changing events in life's path) she would fill me with a new friend on the way or a new attitude of perspective.

I was constantly asking for her guidance with the promise of always honoring her and therefore honoring her son Jesus.

One instance for sure that changed the path of my life was when I was

preparing to enter the seminary before my assignment I begged our lady to have the Bishop send me to Mount Saint Mary's Seminary so that I could also visit the sacred grotto and be comforted by her presence and love. I even went as far as to say (bargain) that if so granted that I would always honor her in my ministry. I was assigned to her holy mountain as a seminarian and filled with Joy to be under her watchful eye. Little did I know, at that time, she was not only allowing me to draw nearer to her but she was introducing me to a wonderful new companion on this path that was so narrow who I now cherish with my whole heart. This friend would become so instrumental in my later years as a priest and a necessary companion in the time of my participation in cancer. She would become a second "spiritual" mother and a great intercessor! This story I will share further later in this article.

OUR LADY OF LOURDES

The grotto of our Lady of Lourdes was the sanctuary on the mountain that stood over the seminary in Emmitsburg, MD. Daily visits to the grotto drew me into the life of Bernadette and the profound statement of the Doctrine of the Immaculate Conception. It seemed to me that once we began to honor her by this magnificent title she was desiring to cure us all from every doubt of faith and physical illness.

Just like the grotto in Lourdes France, where Mary appeared to Bernadette, our grotto also had a natural spring which flowed from our holy mountain to a basin for believers to "drink" in the graces of Mary's intercession. Intrigued further in the mystery of Our Lady's appearance, proclamation and miraculous gifts at Lourdes I intended to visit to pay homage in thanksgiving for the many blessings that I had already received from our Lady. I thought it only right to go and walk the ground on which such a holy proclamation of Faith was professed by our lady herself: I am the immaculate Conception!

At the end of our second year of seminary training, three of my friends and I made a pilgrimage to France to visit many of the holy places and in particular Lourdes itself. We were blessed to have been on our own and not part of a tourist group which afforded us to make it a real pilgrimage by walking several miles from our night's rest which led us through the humble streets and the places of burial for the local people. It seemed as if we came out of the quiet past and happened upon this miraculous spot where the Virgin had appeared to Bernadette.





I mean to find out." While Abraham's visitors walked on farther toward Sodom, the LORD remained standing before Abraham. Then Abraham drew nearer and said: "Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty? Suppose there were fifty innocent people in the city; would you wipe out the place, rather than spare it for the sake of the fifty innocent people within it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to make the innocent die with the guilty so that the innocent and the guilty would be treated alike! Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?" The LORD replied, "If I find fifty innocent people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake." Abraham spoke up again: "See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord, though I am but dust and ashes! What if there are five less than fifty innocent people? Will you destroy the whole city because of those five?" He answered, "I will not destroy it, if I find forty-five there." But Abraham persisted, saying "What if only forty are found there?" Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and life of the world to come. Amen.
