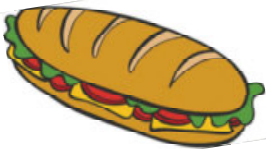

## Thoughts from the Pastor

### THE SAINTS: COMPANIONS OF THE JOURNEY TO HEAVEN PART 5

By definition a companion is:



*A wayfarer that travels with you. They are possibly the most important part of the journey. The sojourner may encounter others like them, known as companions, while exploring the life of faith in the journey. These companions may help the sojourner but cannot hinder them along the path.*

Jesus reminds us that it is a narrow path that leads to eternal life. We know that the journey is hard and long and it must not be traveled alone but shared with true guides of Faith and example. In the book by John Bunyan "The Pilgrims progress" this path is laced with many temptations, fears and choices that is hard to navigate without a companion. We know that Jesus

shows us the way (the cross) and our earthly friends and families and priest guide us to keep our eyes on Christ. But our greatest companions and guides are the ones who have completed the journey and have entered through the narrow gate. **These are the Saints!** They have run the good race and won the crown of the true victors and they desire, for all eternity, to help us accomplish the very same goal!

#### SAINT JOSEPH: THE GREAT SILENT PARTNER ON MY JOURNEY

St. Joseph has often been recognized as the silent partner in Faith. Joseph, the husband of Mary, speaks no words in the Gospels yet his actions speak louder than any word he could have ever said. He was the silent partner in the Holy Family; in redemption; the dignity of work; example of Fatherhood and doing the will of God.

As a child, I was always aware of Saint Joseph as a part of my family's devotion but it was truly a quiet and humble recognition of his presence. There was a small plastic statue that sat on the shelf in our kitchen next to the table which I looked at every time I took my seat for meals. He had a loaf of bread in one hand and a jug of water in his other hand with a carpenter's square at his feet just looking over our meals in silence. I thought of him as some kind of protector. He worked hard at his craft and provided food for the Holy Family. His image was no where else in the house except at Christmas time when he would show up under the tree in the nativity scene. So, the kitchen was his place of honor for me. Daily bread.... I used to think.... Won by hard labor. My grandfather reminded me of Saint Joseph because he worked hard but silently. He liked to fix things and make things in his basement but I think he just liked the quiet time to think, pray and sometimes just whistle. I used to think that Saint Joseph probably liked to whistle as well when he worked. That to me always signified happiness and satisfaction. Saint Joseph was an example of happiness and satisfaction in doing the little things silently.

**Saint Joseph High School** – I learned at very young age that I would attend Saint Joseph High



School and be a Spartan just like my dad. My Father loved Saint Joseph High school for it gave him great comfort to have Saint Joseph, the foster father of Jesus to become his foster father to him as well. My father lost his dad when he was sixteen and while attending Saint Joseph high school he realized that there was no greater model of a "Father" than Joseph and he could talk (pray) to him when he needed guidance and strength.



I fell in love with the idea of becoming a Spartan basketball player more than being molded in the image of the husband of Mary. Saint Joseph himself must have known that as well when I was taught how silent he could become in the awesome presence of the Blessed Mother.

It was my Junior year and we were preparing to play our first game in the playoffs against Saint Mary of the Mount. I was so excited for my team to move forward and win some games in post season play. So, the morning of the game I decided I would pray the rosary and ask the blessed Mother for her intercession in the upcoming match. I got to the fourth decade when I realize that I was asking the Blessed Mother to let us beat the school in her honor. I laughed to myself in my misdirection of intercessory prayer. I quickly finished the rosary then ask Saint Joseph to help his namesake on the hardwood battle ground. The end result was that we (Saint Joseph) lost to St. May's of the Mount by the mystical number of seven. Saint Joseph remained a true silent partner on the journey as he acquiesced to his beloved spouse.

My Senior year I began to pay closer to my schools' namesake and wrote a paper for religion class on the role of Saint Joseph as a silent partner in Faith. I found no need to do research I just looked to the stories of him in the Sacred scriptures and saw that he responded with silent love of God's messages that came to him in dreams. Always being unafraid of the crazy challenges that were put before him as spouse, father and protector. Saint Joseph would give me great resolve as I moved onto college to do the same in the difficult decisions that I would face both in sports and academics. I truly then knew I loved Saint Joseph as much as I loved being a Spartan.

## Dream Weaver – “Just Sleep on it”

When it came time to discern what to do with my life and how to avoid or answer to the call of to priesthood I still found myself going to the Blessed Mother for answers and help. But it was Saint Joseph's love for Mary and the child Jesus that I found the confidence to say “yes” to the most outlandish idea in the world: that I would become a priest. Saint Joseph taught me to just “sleep on it” and the answers would come. I did not have an Angel appear to me in a dream to give me direction but I did realize, as Joseph did, that God's will would be the less traveled road and the one that seemed most outlandish to follow.... Priesthood it would be.... Thank you, Saint Joseph!
