## Thoughts from the Pastor

### THE SAINTS: COMPANIONS OF THE JOURNEY TO HEAVEN PART 6

By definition a companion is:



*A wayfarer that travels with you. They are possibly the most important part of the journey. The sojourner may encounter others like them, known as companions, while exploring the life of faith in the journey. These companions may help the sojourner but cannot hinder them along the path.*

Jesus reminds us that it is a narrow path that leads to eternal life. We know that the journey is hard and long and it must not be traveled alone but shared with true guides of Faith and example. In the book by John Bunyan "The Pilgrims progress" this path is laced with many temptations, fears and choices that is hard to navigate without a companion. We know that Jesus shows us the way (the cross) and our earthly friends and families and priests guide us to keep our eyes on Christ. But our greatest companions and guides are the ones who have completed the journey and have entered through the narrow gate. **These are the Saints!** They have run the good race and won the crown of the true victors and they desire, for all eternity, to help us accomplish the very same goal!

### SAINT JOSEPH: THE REST OF THE STORY

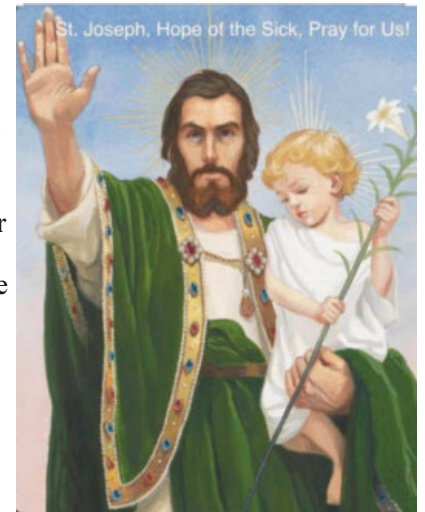
#### Saint Joseph and Covid

March 19, 2020, the Feast of Saint Joseph, was the last Sacred Mass we were allowed to celebrate when the pandemic closed down our churches. It began one of the darkest times of my priesthood with so much uncertainty and confusion. I thought how appropriate it seemed that the last Mass would be in Honor of Saint Joseph the Protector of the Family and the life of Faith. Saint Joseph then became my first OSM video that I did on "Safe-Mode" Saints that would help us through the pandemic. It seemed to be the theme in those first several months, that of Saint Joseph, when my high school had asked if I could record a "Graduation Mass" for them since they were not permitted to gather because of the pandemic. Of course, as you all know, my high school takes the patron name of Saint Joseph. We recorded the Mass and I shared how St. Joseph would guide them (the high School) through these times as he led the Holy family out of the clutches of King Herod as they fled to Egypt.

The connection with the High School continued when I was nominated to receive the "Spirit of Saint Joseph" Award in October 2020. But as the pandemic continued the event was canceled and the opportunity to be honored in Saint Joseph spirit was pushed aside for the time being. Although I wanted to show my appreciation for such an honor I made a video for OSM about the "Spirit" of Saint Joseph High School and how it effected my spiritual and maturation process during my years under his name of guide. All these things were done in the shadow of a pandemic and Saint Joseph seemed to make himself present to me with great fervor at that time.

#### The Year of Saint Joseph

2021 marked the 150th anniversary of the Church's declaration of Saint Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church. In honor of this anniversary, Pope Francis, had declared 2021 as the Year dedicated to Saint Joseph. So, as the pandemic continue to rage and keep us from full participation with each other I used the time to make the suggested consecration to Saint Joseph. Using the book written by Father Donald Calloway, each day I spent 30 minutes with Saint Joseph in prayer. Examining his many titles and roles as the head of the Holy family and the Universal Church. Each day was more fascinating and more insightful to this silent partner in Faith. I realized how little attention I gave Saint Joseph as a companion on my journey. He was a silent partner but really did not count on him through much intercessory prayer since those days in high school. I gained a newfound Fervor for his role and I encouraged everyone I came in contact to make the consecration to Saint Joseph by reading Father Calloway's book.



In April, 2021 I decided to give a four-day conference on the Life and Titles of Saint Joseph that would conclude in a consecration of both parishes at Sacred Mass on May 3, 2021. The conferences were attended both in person and on line with over 350 people participating in honor of Saint Joseph! At the Mass, Father Roniel and I, dressed in vestments to honor Saint Joseph and con-celebrated the Mass at Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton. Everyone who participated received a framed picture of dear Saint Joseph. I was ecstatic that day with true Joy in the name of Saint Joseph my companion on the journey. I also celebrated a Mass of consecration at my high school and gave a talk about St. Joseph defender of the Faith. Oh, Saint Joseph you were preparing me for what was lying ahead!

## A New Storm on the Horizon

As the storm of Covid began to dissipate another storm showed up on the horizon that would prove every more challenging for me spiritually and physically. Three months later I would be diagnosed with Stage four pancreatic cancer and start a journey with the cross of Christ suffering. St. Joseph would guide me here through this new adventure as my patron and friend. My high school sent out notification about my illness and the school students and alumni began to pray through Saint Joseph's intercession for my healing. Warriors in prayer, those Spartans, were a comfort to me as a weakened soldier in their midst. When the school year began I was invited back to celebrate Mass with the student body and share my love of Saint Joseph through suffering. I hoped I would awaken within them this great saint's companionship on their journey.

## Consecration followed by Thanksgiving

As I asked Saint Joseph to intercede for me in a miracle and a healing of my cancer I believed he would be heard and his intervention would be like that of Our Lady and Mother Seton. It was time to give thanks and make a consecration to him at a place that honored his Saintly prowess. The plan was to visit The Saint Joseph Oratory of Mount Royal in Montreal. Because of the continued Covid restrictions and a need for a passport, the trip was not possible. In turn, we chose to go to Detroit to visit the Oratory of Saint Joseph there and make a Consecration and Thanksgiving for the forthcoming of my healing. So, in October of 2021 we made the pilgrimage in honor of Saint Joseph and experienced great peace and consolation kneeling at the altar dedicated to him while offering ourselves in consecration and thanksgiving.

## The Spirit of Saint Joseph Award Revisited

In November of 2021, I was invited to receive my Spirit of Saint Joseph award along with the new class of honorees. Weakened by the cancer and the chemotherapy I went to receive the award only so that I could be a testament to Saint Joseph "Spirit" and importance in the life of the school that hallows his name. My acceptance address was focused on what I determined was the "Spirit" of Saint Joseph:

- ✚ To be a lover of the Church
- ✚ To show devotion to Mary his beloved spouse while quietly accepting the providential hand of God
- ✚ Like St. Joseph having the courage to submit oneself to His Divine plan.

To make such an address in the presence of my dearest friends, classmates and bishop was so humbling and rewarding knowing that Saint Joseph had taught me to live what I professed as his spirit.

I look back on that event and realize that it all started with that simple plastic statue in the kitchen that sat behind my dinner chair as a child. Silent Joseph; Strong Joseph; Hard working Joseph; Protector against evil and provider of miracles through his intercession!

Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."
