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# Thoughts from the Pastor

### **HE IS BACK!!**



Saint Peregrine, once I left Sutersville, fell out of my memory and he became my companion on the journey by remaining in the shadows of the other Saints that I was so much more intimately attached. But as I said he remained there on the way and would once again make his presence known in 2008 when the church in Sutersville was closed.

Before the time of the wonderful help of a priest from the Philippines small parishes were being closed because of the lack of priests. St Charles Church became one of the tragedies of the shortage and the building would be sold and no longer be a place of worship. The pastor at that time, Father Jim Bump, retired when the church was closed but rescued the Statue of Saint Peregrine and asked me if I would want the statue for my parish of Immaculate Conception! We did not have a statue of the great intercessor of cancer at our church so I graciously and excitedly accepted the gift. The statue, the very statue, that I had bought some 10 years ago was back in my possession along with the first-class relic.

It was time to celebrate once again and honor this great Saint with another Mass of enshrinement, lessons on the great Saint and a chance to reverence his relic. I remember thinking that this would become one of the most important additions to our parish life for so many suffer with cancer

within our community. Saint Peregrine, once again, stepped out of the shadows and forced me to speak about cancer and the **three pravers** that accompanied the devotion to Saint Peregrine.

When I was assigned at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, once again, someone wanted to donate a statue of Saint Peregrine to the parish. I was happy to have a statue for our parish church, so once again I planned to have a Mass in his honor. This time his shadow was covering me with so much grace and inspiration when I decided to have a two-day conference inviting all those with cancer to participate in a blessing with the relic on the first day and the Anointing of the Sick Mass the following day. Many were in attendance throughout the dioceses and I remember how unsure I was in playing the role of calling others to trust in St. Peregrine's intercessions as they were deeply troubled with the journey they were walking under the name of cancer. It turned out to be a beautiful two-day event and I promised that we would do it every year. Of course, the next two years we were in pandemic mode and it would take two years before the St. Peregrine Conference could be held again.

### No More shadows: Walking Hand in Hand

In July of 2021, I was diagnosed with stage-four pancreatic cancer and was no longer a bystander to the suffering of cancer but a full-blown participant. I thought to myself how blessed I was to have had the most recent history of Saint Peregrine "dogging" me from the shadows and now he would move to the front of the line as a companion on this new leg of my Faith journey. I thought how beautiful it was to have in my possession a first-class relic of the Saint and image enshrined at both parishes. I thought long and hard about the three prayers that were to be offered when inflicted with cancer. How I would pray, along with all of you, for a healing through his intercession, for the right team of doctors and treatments, but I alone prayed the prayers for a restful soul



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the preparation of a peaceful death. Yes, death was so near and so real that I understood if I ignored this final prayer I would lose out on the true companionship of his company.

The Novena was being prayed everyday (by hundreds of parishioners) with the Faith of a healing that would certainly come a year later. Coupled with the Divine Mercy Chaplet the true reality of Saint Peregrine's healing was apparent. He was healed through the Divine Mercy of the suffering Christ and now I knew that this is where my healing would come as well.... Under the cross of Christ! I did not ask or think of Christ reaching down from the cross to heal me until I felt I had walked those first 11 stations with him. I had to first accept the cross; count on helpers along the way and persevere the falls that sickness would bring. These first 11 steps brought me to a level of humility that prepared my heart and soul to ask for what I believed I could ask in good faith through the intercession of Saint Peregrine.

#### Saint Peregrine Conference 2022: The Moment of Special Grace

I planned with great anticipation to have the second annual Saint Peregrine Conferences on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> of July. I was so ready to share this conference knowing that I had walked in the same suffering of those I had invited to come to listen to my talk and to receive the Anointing of the Sick and the Blessing with the holy relic of Saint Peregrine. I shared my 5 steps of accepting the cross with the participants on that first night. I talked about how Jesus reached down to touch St. Peregrine's wound on the night before he was to have his leg amputated. It was the first time I thought of the Merciful act of Christ coming in that "last hour" of need and plead. St. Peregrine laid himself before the crucified Christ after walking with him the way to Calvary. St. Peregrine was healed because he was faithful to the walk of redemption!

As I blessed the people with the holy Relic of Saint Peregrine I was overwhelmed with the Holy Spirit and humbled to share the pain of each participant. I cried with some and for others as I instilled in them faith and



confidence. I was blessing them with the relic and knowing that the power of trust in intercessory prayer was going to change them and straighten the path that they were walking with the Lord. I also asked those who were family members to come forward to blessed as well for I know that they needed strength as well.

What I did not expect was the gift of being blessed myself. When my dearest friends, who had accompanied me on each step of this year long journey, came up for a blessing I was so overwhelmed with the joy of their friendship and saddened by the pain they shared in my suffering. Then the moment of true Divine healing took place when my friend Kathy took the relic from me and in turned blessed me. I now was not the presider over such a blessing but a participant in the blessing. I felt the power of St. Peregrine taking center stage in the biggest asking that I would make on my own behalf.

#### PET Scan and my prayer of Mercy.

It happened that my PET scan was scheduled the Wednesday following the Conference. I was ready as the scan approached to finally pray the prayer I felt so

unworthy to pray but a year earlier. In the very hour of my greatest fear knowing that the PET scan looming with the final results of all my treatments. I began to beg the Crucified Christ to reach down from the cross and touch my wound. I was embarrassed in being so bold but I gained the greatest confidence that this was the prayer our Savior wanted me to pray because Saint Peregrine would kneel beside me at that moment as I made my request. That night, after the conference was over, I knelt before the crucified Christ and I begged Him to touch my wound and heal me. I was, once again, washed over with the power of healing Grace and I knew what the PET scan would show that weekend. The Scan came back, at the amazement of my doctor, clean! The tumors were dead and no cancer detected in my body! A miracle my Doctor declared. An answer to a prayer for a servant humbled by such a grace that was gained only by walking with the cross.

### To Jesus through the Saints

Every story that I shared with you in these past articles about my companions on the way must be highlighted in the fact that these Saints did not cure me. They interceded on my behalf to the Divine Healer Jesus Christ. In Essence they walked me into to his love and allowed me to trust in His healing power and mercy to Jesus through each Saint is the role of the intercessor. The final intercessory that all my Saint friends will do is at the hour of my death. They will walk me, once again, into His Divine presence as I seek entrance into eternal life. The Journey of cancer, hand in hand with the Saints, taught me the power of their love and example that gave me the strength to pray the most selfless and humble prayer I ever uttered: "Jesus reach down and heal my wound!" But your will be done!

My dear friends and parishioners,

First of all, I want to say a heartfelt "Thank you!" for all of the hugs, well-wishes, and prayers as I begin this new journey in priestly formation for the Diocese of Greensburg. This parish is a home for me, and I thank you for that over the last decade (plus!) of my life, and for your continued support of our Music Ministry. I

know that Bridget will do great things, and I'll be back to visit as I'm able!

I want to keep you all "in the loop" as I go through this journey! St. Charles Borromeo Seminary is the diocesan seminary of Philadelphia so about half of the seminarians are from here, and the rest coming from other sending Dioceses. Seminary formation takes on a few different form depending on the educational background of the seminarian. I entered as "Pre-Theology 1", which means there are two years of philosophical studies before the Theologate. There are 10 seminarians in my class, myself, three from the Diocese of Arlington, one from the Ukrainian Eparchy, and five from Philadelphia.

Many had asked about where I would go after or what Order I was entering. For those who might not know, there are two "types" of priests - diocesan and religious. Diocesan are those ordained to serve in a particular diocese, and religious belong to a religious order and serve within that community and serving its charism. Examples of religious would be Benedictines, Franciscans, Jesuits, Dominicans, etc. Diocesan priests are generally what we think of when we think of "parish priests."

#### GOSPEL READING

Luke 15:1-32

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them he addressed this parable. "What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it? And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance. "Or what woman having ten coins and losing one would not light a lamp and sweep the house, searching carefully until she finds it? And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost.' In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents." Then he said, "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers."' So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, 'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns, who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.""


