





### Thoughts from the Pastor



### "COME JOIN US FOR A PRAYERFUL WITNESS

### FOR THE UNBORN AND THEIR MOTHERS"



WHERE: MEET AT IRWIN PARK



For seventeen years I have participated with the local Catholic Churches in our area as a silent witness along Pennsylvania Ave. for the unborn to be recognized members of the human race and our country. We have held signs that express the need to end abortion; to acknowledge that abortion kills the innocent life of the unborn child and that adoption is a "loving option." Mostly we were focused on the legality of abortion and holding our ground to have the law changed. Some how in the midst of our approach we have forgotten the loving relationship that needs to be renewed between child and mom.

Every woman who conceives a child becomes a mom! Even in situations of an unwanted or unplanned pregnancy they are still a mom. The Choice for abortion does not absolve one of that reality and when ignored it can easily be discarded. We need to change the hearts of women and men to see the life of the child and the precious relationship that can develop instead of seeing it as an inconvenience or an overwhelming burden.

**Changing Hearts**: This is the key we need to awaken in the hearts of all who believe that an abortion is a "right" and not a direct act of hatred against another human person. We must focus more on the unborn child and its complete dependence of its' MOTHER! We must learn to allow the unborn, who has no voice, to use its beating heart (five weeks after conception) to sound loud as a cry for love and life!



#### PRO LIFE GENERATION

Our teenagers must be able to identify themselves with the idea that they are Pro-life! This means we must impress upon them the sanctity of life, the dignity of virginity and the wholesomeness of relationships that lead to family life of Faith. We need to help them to overcome the world's view of "if it feels good do it" and show them that a child's life, in every situation (because of its vulnerability) must be protected first above all other desires and concerns.



**Putting the Child First** — What mother, father, family member would not have sacrificed their own life for the sake and safety of their child in Uvalde Texas at the moment of the shooting and murders of the innocent. This is what we need to return to for the unborn as well for they too are defenseless to the procedure of abortion that takes their life.

**Saving Souls** – I believe and know that the Holy Innocent of abortion are in heaven suffering a martyr's death. But the souls that are being lost are those who believe abortion is a right and the pregnancy is not a child and choose to end its life. The souls of doctors that perform abortions and see the death first hand. The souls of those who encourage abortions for the sake of the easier path. Souls are in jeopardy and we must

act in a loving and merciful way to reach them. Prayers to our Lady and the recitation of the Divine Mercy should be our focus.

HEALING SERVICE and the BLESSING WITH THE RELIC OF CARDINAL NEWMAN

Deacon Jack will give the Homily and share about Cardinal Newman and the other miracles contributed to him through a blessing with his relic and intercession. After the blessing with the relic Father Roniel and I will offer the Sacrament of Holy Anointing!

### Read a brief synopsis of Deacon Jack's story:

The beneficiary of a Vatican-approved miracle attributed to the intercession of Servant of God John Henry Cardinal Newman says an EWTN show inspired him to pray to the saint for the healing of his back injuries that could have paralyzed him. His use of a relic of the cardinal may also be linked to a second miracle. John "Jack" Sullivan had awoken to excruciating pain in June 2000. A CT scan revealed that all or most of the vertebrae and discs in his back had turned inward and were squeezing his spinal cord. A neurosurgeon advised him to have immediate surgery to prevent paralysis. Sullivan, in the second year of a four-year diaconate program, knew that the pain, the surgery and recovery period would mean the end of his effort to become a deacon. So, he prayed to Cardinal Newman for his intercession so that I might walk and go back to classes and be ordained. He felt tremendous heat and a tingling feeling all over that lasted for five or 10 minutes. After he experienced this, he immediately stood up straight. I was able to walk, not with a walker or cane, but on my own, without any difficulty or pain. Deacon Sullivan was ordained to the deaconate on September 14, 2001.
