




SHOE BOX SANTAS FOR ADULTS of APPALACHIA

Thoughts from the Pastor

I was blessed at end the month of September with a week's vacation away from the parish with friends. It is always great to relax (Sunset at camp on right) and put everything in the parishes on hold for a while. There are two "packing" processes that take place when I prepare for a vacation: 1) what to pack for the trip and 2) What to pack "into" my schedule for my return! I always try to make up for the week I am away by scheduling events, meetings, appointments and other commitments in the immediate weeks that follow. It sounds and feels good before I go away but it looks insurmountable upon my return.

The Month of October, albeit only 16 days old, has brought and will bring many interesting happenings in the parish and life. October is the Month of the Holy Rosary, pro-life awareness, Priestly vocation awareness, Fall Crawls and festivals. October marks the beginning of Hockey season and the end of Baseball season while football becomes the main stream awareness on every level in our community. The end of the month of October will mark the three-year anniversary of the completion of the new building at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and occupation as well as Halloween and the celebration of our beloved deceased. These events leave much to reflect and ponder. So, I wonder and reflect out loud here in my pastors notes to give you a scary tour of my mind's eye.



The Holy Rosary is one of the most cherished prayers of our Catholic Church. Introduced by the Creed, the Our Father, three Hail



Marys' and the Doxology ("Glory Be"), and concluded with the Salve Regina, the rosary involves the recitation of five decades consisting of the Our Father, 10 Hail Marys' and the Doxology. During this recitation, the individual meditates on the saving mysteries of our Lord's life and the faithful witness of our Blessed Mother. It is a long-standing practice of individual and family prayer. October calls us to this prayer to renew our relationship with Christ and His mother.

Reflection: When I go to the funeral home, to offer prayers in preparation for the funeral Mass, I pray silently over the open casket. When I see the Holy rosary, beads laid gently in the hands of the deceased I pray in thanksgiving to our Lady who promised to be with her children in the hour of death as the asked so often of her as the prayed their sacred beads. I ask and wonder to myself: In ten years how many of our deceased will honor Mary with the rosary in their hands? How many Catholics still recognize the value of this prayer? Hands look so empty in death without the rosary.

Respect for the Unborn is manifested in two outward signs displayed in the cemetery at Immaculate Conception and in the silent witness along Ponnsylvania Avanua during the life chain demonstration. The 400 white

witness along Pennsylvania Avenue during the life chain demonstration. The 400 white crosses displayed in the cemetery representing 4,000 unborn that are lost in abortion each day is startling! The simplicity of the white crosses calls to mind the dignity of the white crosses displayed for the veterans in Virginia's Arlington cemetery.

Thought: Warrior's and martyrs die for the same reason so that someone may remember the price for freedom. Do we realize that the unborn are the hero/martyrs who pay the price for the freedom of those without a voice? How many more must die before this war is over and freedom is won?



Life Chain: as we stood in prayerful silence witnessing to the abomination and horror and reality of abortion we display our desire and love. Our signs ask for prayers to end abortion, to choose adoption as well as a reminder of the fact that death occurs with each abortion and God's Mercy alone can heal the loss. Many silently drive by others embarrassed by the reality while others are incensed with anger and hatred that is directed towards those who stand in protest. Spittle reaches the faces of the prayer chain while words of great prejudice are spewed and accompanied by obscene jesters as they drive up the road.

Question: Why is it permissible for you to HATE ME just because I love unborn children and pray for its life to be protected under law?



Praying for the Priests of our Diocese is so necessary as we find many of our priests managing more than one parish as pastor or administrators. Praying for vocations is necessary and also a prayer of help for the future. How blessed we are in our diocese to have priest like Father Roniel who serve here in our country as missionaries. In the midst of trying to reorganize and reinvent our ministries illness and death have put many of our priests on the inactive list. As well as physical health problems other priests have asked for extended leaves of absence to heal from other types of health reasons. The loss of several priests in the past year have passed more stress on to the remaining men. **Prayers: Now my prayer, every time I bow and kiss the altar prior to Mass, is for my brother priests, for their recovery and health as well as a quick return to sharing their priesthood with the people of the diocese. I ask you to share in that prayer at each Mass you attend.**

Praying for an increase of vocations to the Priesthood



Praying for our young men who are discerning a priestly vocation is a good and noble thing! I am aware of at least four young men from high school to college age that our discerning the possible call to follow Christ as a priest. It is important that we pray for them to be disposed to God's Grace and to have the wisdom to hear and accept the invitation. Pray that they persevere in their desire as they navigate the counter culture of our society. Pray that they may remain constant in their own prayer as well. Pray for their families to nurture these desires and support them with love.

Pray for our first seminarian on my watch: Tyler Randolph - As we know Tyler Randolph, the organist and music director of Immaculate Conception, has just entered into the seminary as a pre-theologian and will study for two years in preparation for entrance into Major seminary. The transition from the lay state to being a student and seminarian is a difficult and challenging. Please pray daily for Tyler that he may persevere and grow ever stronger in his conviction to become a priest of Christ and the diocese of Greensburg!

What's in a Name?!!! - Choosing a name for confirmation was the topic for 70 eight graders during their first "Matthias Project Retreat. Saturday night at the Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Church. During the retreat they learned about St. Mathias and why they will be taking his name as our second confirmation name. The Students also shared in a "Saints" Fair where they could learn about different Saints and their virtues in order to understand better the person they may choose to be their confirmation name.



Praise: I have nothing but praise for Jen Wilson, all the teachers and staff that work with the Matthias project "name calling retreat! I thank they Youth group students who also helped with the presentations! The young helping the young grow in faith is an important relationship for positive peer pressure! I Praise the 70 students who acted with great respect toward each other and the staff while really entering into the evening's topics. I congratulate the parents for being such good parents and being so dedicated to the process and programming for the confirmation Class!!! Praise to God for such a great night and group!!!

ON A LIGHTER NOTE: Football is a violent game and controlling such violence for the sake of its participants is commended and



should be a part of the rules and the approach of play. While specific rules such as "targeting" the head of an opponent helps lessen injury we will still see hits to the head, such as happened to Pat Freiermuth on Sunday, where the victim will suffer serious injuries without ill intent. Accidents will happen. Question: So, if protecting the head of players is so important that other penalties such as "hands to the face" and "face masking" receive 15-yard penalties why is it still permissible for the use of a stiff arm to the face by an offensive player carrying the ball? I don't know... I am just asking?

Every year, following the spookiness of Trick or Treat the Church celebrates All Saints day. We commigrate all those who have entered into the eternal glory of Christ! Those not named on the "official" list (canon) but those who were the ordinary men and women that we meet in our daily lives who lived in a holy and virtuous way. Some of them first making the stop in purgatory for purification and others who suffered much in this life and, upon death, we gathered to Christ himself. These we have known as our pastors, parents, grandparents and other relatives and friends! They have become our role models of how to enter heaven!




Remembering our Faithful departed and all the Souls in purgatory




Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.
