



# The Church: Triumphant, Militant and Suffering

Sunday, in my homily I made a reference to eschatology (the study of end times) as it relayed to the month of November and the Sunday readings building up to the celebration of the Feast of Christ the King. To reflect on the "end times" is a healthy approach to the work we have to do here as children of God. The understanding that death came into the world because of sin helps us to desire perfect lives; sinless lives; eternal lives! This is what God intended at creation that the body and soul would live in perfect harmony with the love of God and in the love of God. To restore this gift, Christ had to conquer death through His death and restore our nature (body and soul) in the resurrection! What happens after death, for those who were faithful, are the stages of purgatory and heaven. For those who were not faithful, who rejected the Salvation offered by Christ will experience eternal damnation! Ouch! Yes, hell is real and the separation from the love of God is reversable.

#### HEAVEN HELL AND PURGATORY

# In my most recent OSM video posted as a "RE-RUN TUESDAY" I discussed the topic and hope that you will take time to watch it and pass it on to others. It will bring some clarity to what happens after death.

I also shared with you the three stages of the Church that consist simultaneously and how important it is for us to be aware of how we are connected with the things of heaven and souls who are preparing, through purgation, to enter eternal bliss. Many have asked me to reiterate these three stages: Church Triumph; Church Suffering; and Church Militant. So, I want to share with you an article worth reading on the topic.


#### The Three Stages of the Church by Msgr. Francis Mannion

What you were taught in your catechism classes is indeed still valid, although it is not commonplace today to hear the description of the various states of the Church as you describe them.

The church triumphant describes the Church in heaven. In the kingdom of God — the realm in which the holy Trinity, the angels and saints, and the abode of all those who have reached the fullness of salvation in Christ — the Church already

exists. It will have its fullest being at the end of time, when all of creation and (we hope) all human beings will be conformed to Christ and all reality will be one of divine praise and glory.

The term "church triumphant" underlines the truth that in the glory of heaven all human sin will have been transformed, death and suffering will be no more, and the glory of God will have triumphed over all the imperfections of human history. The church militant refers to the Church on earth. The term "militant" can suggest an antagonistic relationship between the Church and the world. Nevertheless, it refers to an authentic reality: that the Church on earth works to overcome the imperfect and sinful dimensions of human existence.

The Church's mission is not to oppose the world and society, but to work for their transformation by the convincing preaching of the Gospel and by the edifying power of the good works and example of those who are baptized into Christ. The Church's best asset is the saintly activity and example of those who have chosen the Christian way of life.

The church suffering refers to the church in purgatory. Purgatory is not a kind of temporary hell. It is rather the threshold, the antechamber of heaven. In purgatory, all those — whether Christian or not — who have reached the gates of death without reaching the full perfection of life represented in Christ are cleansed in a kind of ongoing baptism and are purified by the enlightening fire of the Holy Spirit. The suffering of purgatory is not one of destruction, but the suffering that comes from leaving the old self behind and taking on the new.

#### Liturgy focus: "The General Intercession at Sacred Mass"

Every Sunday, following the Creed, we share in an intercessory prayer for the people of the Church and the World. These prayers are known as the General Intercession or the Prayers of the Faithful.

According to the General instructions of the Roman Missal:

In the Universal Prayer or Prayer of the Faithful, the people respond in some sense to the Word of God which they have received in faith and, exercising the office of their baptismal Priesthood, offer prayers to God for the salvation of all. It is desirable that there usually be such a form of prayer in Masses celebrated with the people, so that petitions may be offered for holy Church, for those who govern with authority over us, for those weighed down by various needs, for all humanity, and for the salvation of the whole world.

#### The order of the prayer usually follows this format:

- Prayer for the Pope and leaders of the church
- Prayer for the people of God and the mission of being faithful
- Prayer for those who are struggling in their faith journey
- ✤ Prayer for the sick
- ✤ Prayer the departed Souls
- Prayers for particular holiday, or worldly need.

The consistency of these prayers helps us to focus on them and to make this prayer apart of our daily prayers while we serve the Lord throughout the week as the children of God.

So let us be attentive to these prayers as Mass and enter into them with love and Mercy!






