Our diocese will take up the National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services (AMS).

Established by Saint John Paul II in 1985, the AMS is responsible for providing the full range of pastoral ministries available in all other U.S. dioceses to people serving in the United States Armed Services, enrolled in U.S. military academies, undergoing treatment at any of the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and for the families of these men and women. The AMS is responsible for the pastoral care of men, women and children from all U.S. dioceses, who hail from all 50 states and U.S. territories.

Unlike a conventional diocese, the AMS has no parishes and no weekly collections. The salaries and retirement of military chaplains are paid for by the government, but the AMS receives no funding from the military or the government. It relies solely on the generosity of private donations to fund an annual operating budget of more than \$9.3 million, which supports its mission and ministries, including vocations, evangelization and catechesis, sacramental records, tribunal and veterans affairs.

Support of this collection for the AMS will bring the Gospel, the sacraments and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from parishes in the Diocese of Greensburg. Please encourage your parishioners to prayerfully consider supporting the AMS, whose mission is, "Serving Those Who Serve."

Thoughts from the Pastor



THE MISSION TO SERVE THE POOR "FOR OUR PARISH ST. VINCENT DEPAUL FUND": A THANKSGIVING BLESSING!

de Paul "Who will excuse us before God for the loss of such a great number of people, who could be saved by the slight assistance we could give them?" St. Vincent DePaul

I have been blessed these past 15 years years to have been appointed spiritual director to the Society of Saint Vincent DePaul in the Norwin area. I am truly humbled by the amazing zeal and love for the poor on behalf of the members who tirelessly dedicate themselves to those who are in most need of God's loving Mercy. The challenge to meet the needs of the poor in our area seems insurmountable at times but by the grace of God coupled with tireless servants of our society and many individual benefactors, hundreds of individuals and families are helped to make their way in this world.

The Society offers tangible assistance to those in need on a person-to-person basis. It is this personalized involvement that makes the work of the Society unique. This aid may take the form of intervention, consultation, or often through direct dollars or in-kind service. An essential precept of the Society's work is to help while conscientiously maintaining the confidentiality and dignity of those served. The kindness that is extended is always done in the spirit of the Gospel and the love of the Catholic Church. Bringing the face of Christ to the poor is the mission and seeing Christ in the poor is our gift.

The typical services that are rendered are as follows: *Food and household supplies; heating fuel; utilities; rent assistance; auto fuel and repairs; prescriptions; Scrip-food cards; clothing; transportation and educational supplies and needs.*

I would like to extend a sincere thanks to the members of our society for their love and dedication. For those who presently hold office, work the local food pantry, organize the winter coat drive, aid families with services and repairs, organize and distribute Christmas gifts, clothes and school supplies and especially tend to the needs of those who call our hot line daily. They may remain nameless here in this article but their work does not go unnoticed.

Your Help and Assistance is Appreciated and Needed

Last year we distributed <u>over \$70,000</u> to the poor of our area! *These funds come strictly from the parishioners of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, Saint Agnes and Immaculate Conception parishes.* We receive these funds via the parish poor box and the annual Thanksgiving collection. All funds that we receive are distributed to aid the poor. As the cost of living continues to rise the more necessary it is for us to depend on your generosity.

The COVID Challenge – Through the pandemic both our Society and the Poor were challenged in the reception of service and our ability to serve. We had "open air" distributions as well as additional foods/monies available while many were uncertain of what would come next.

Government help during the Pandemic: While the government was helping the poor with increased monies they also had their utilities payments postponed during the pandemic. The unfortunate thing, however, was that there was a great misunderstanding among the poor that this "postponement" meant that they were exempt from paying these bills. So, when it came time for past due bills they did not save funds for these payments. This year we have seen astronomical bills for gas and electric accompanied by shut off notices as well. This has caused even a greater need for the poor than during the pandemic and other years.


