The tradition of the <u>Oplatki</u> originated in Poland during Early Christian times. This Christmas Custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity.

#### HOW TO CELEBRATE THE OPLATKI TRADITION

The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatki. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year — whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express ones unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.

#### THE SYMBOLISM

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another. This symbolism is deepened by the fact that the name of the town where Jesus Christ was born, Bethlehem, means "House of Bread," which makes the Oplatki tradition an especially beautiful way to celebrate the charity and unity so characteristic of the Christmas season.

#### A SYMBOL OF FAMILY UNITY

The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy, fun, and deeply meaningful to introduce to the family anytime during the long Christmas season. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season

#### Thoughts from the Pastor

#### IT'S CALLED CHRISTMAS WITH A CAPITAL "C"

As a kid, and now even as an adult, I like Santa! I think Santa brings us to our child-like desire to be amazed and surprised and even excited for the unknown and the mystery of love. Santa of course has always reflected Saint Nick and the elves like angels watching whether you are naughty or nice. I think I was able to keep the myth alive in my heart as a child because mystery, love and excitement for the unknown, was what my Faith was about and certainly the birth of Christ. Could Santa fly with his reindeer? Could he really fit down a chimney? Did he eat the cookies? Did he read all the letters that we sent him? Oh it did not matter much... He always came and made us happy. But the mystery of Christmas was even more spectacular for me and held in that manner in our house. The Novena Prayer we said in preparation for the birth of Christ brought me to the mystery of Bethlehem and the miraculous love of Mary and Joseph. So ever before us was the truth of what we anticipated accompanied by putting our shoes out for the feast of St. Nicholas and reading the story of the kneeling Santa's visit to the Christ Child the secular was certainly in check and subservient to Christmas and the birth of Christ.... The Birth of our Salvation.

#### Secularism has led to Paganism

The sadness of the holy season of Advent is that the joyous anticipation has been changed into anxiety and stress over the gifts. It's funny... a kiss from "Kay" has even become more important than mommy's kiss from Santa... Santa is getting the big heave ho (not HO HO) for even this offends some of the nation's subjects! So Happy Holidays is more than just a way to cover all the bases. It is the very desire to distract from it. I think **BLACK FRIDAY** says it best... Black day of Calamity are ahead...spend money that you do not have and often enough for things no one needs. This has become the season of the almighty dollar and the boost of the economy. What to do? Sing a Song!

Christmas music is played in the stores but carefully without the lyrics of course... But we can still sing to ourselves and with each other. But a group of musicians decided to write a song that speaks the Truth of the Season and even challenges us to not be so accepting of the nonsense around us. The group is Go Fish. They write children's songs and bible songs with catchy tunes for kids to sing and learn of God's love. Recently they wrote a catchy tune called It's Called Christmas with a Capital "C" The words are as follows:

Well I went to the coffee shop To get a Mocha The lady at the counter said "Happy Holidays" I said thanks lady I am pretty happy But there's only one Holiday, that makes me feel that way

#### **ADVENT: FOR CHRIST'S SAKE!!**

Last week as we celebrated the Feast of Christ the King I used, in my homily, a popular phrase I heard often from the Sisters of Saint Joseph when they wanted to challenge me to act accordingly they would say: "For Christ's sake, if not for mine, please listen... share.... Sit still... behave... fill in the blank. So often people may say this in a non-reverent way but it never was meant that way as the sisters challenged me. For Christ, the redeemer, the one who offered himself up for me, should be the focus of my behavior not simply to please the sisters or parents .... But for Christ's Sake. It took me awhile to come to the realization that it was pleasing to God when I acted out of respect of His son... To focus on his love became the best reason to behave. So it is more true now than ever for Christ the true king is disappearing from the scene in the secular world. That is never more apparent than during the season of preparation for his birth. He is "X'd" out as often as possible.

#### HOW DID WE GET THE ABBREVIATION XMAS?

It is insane to think that anyone would truly "X" out Christ out from His own birthday. Well that was not originally the case. The abbreviation developed somewhat along the same lines as the dollar sign. The "\$" originally was the initials U. S. overlapped, and out of carelessness and impatience, it evolved into the symbol used by everyone to denote American currency. The "XP" (Chi and Rho) is a monogram of Christ, being the first two Greek letters of the word. They too were commonly seen overlapped.... I guess being careless and impatient during Advent can "x" Christ right out of the picture....

#### **OTHER SUGGESTIONS**

Family prayer around the Advent wreath. The Christmas Novena is simple for everyone to learn and pray together as well.

Also get the Kneeling Santa book and Statue. Display it in your house ... read the story to your children. And if you do not have children give these items as a gift to a young family... it really helps to keep alive the true meaning.

Try to attend Tuesday evening or Saturday morning Mass as an extra opportunity of Grace... it makes the season come alive!!

#### "ADVENT NOVENA": "A Family Prayer"



There is no doubt that the newspapers and the Malls are reminding you that Christmas is just around the corner. Most towns have already strung their lights and wreaths at each corner. You must know that there are only 28 shopping days left! What will you get for your family this Christmas?

If I could suggest: Get them a "Novena". A Novena is a prayer of petition that we offer for a series of days, showing our true desire for an answer from God. If we could only give what we would truly like to give ourselves, our loved one on our Lord's birthday, it would be an answer to a prayer!! Health, strength, grace, direction, or insight on what He wants for us in our lives. An answer to a prayer brings solace and peace, comfort and even joy! We are burdened in life with many difficulties, decisions, choices, and heavy crosses. To have understanding, wisdom and courage to confront life and its challenges would be the ultimate gift. So this Christmas give yourself in prayer.

I want to share with you the most beautiful Novena prayer that I know. It is a prayer that my family and I have said during Advent for as long as I can remember. We call it the "Hail and Blessed" Novena, or the "Advent prayer". The prayer is recited 15 times each day, starting on the feast of Saint Andrew (November 30<sup>th</sup>), until Christmas day. The prayer puts you in the setting of the incarnation, the very moment that our Lord enters into this world. It is at that moment that we petition the Child Jesus to hear, and answer us! The prayer is as follows:

"Hail and blessed be the hour, and the moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God, hear my prayer, grant my desire, in the merits of our Savior Jesus Christ, and His Blessed Mother, Amen"

To make a commitment in prayer the 24 days prior to Christmas, putting our needs before Jesus, we are certain that they will be heard and answered. Choose to pray this prayer as a family during Advent. Pray it by yourself. It will set the proper *tone* for this Christmas, and the gift you most desire this year will not be under the tree, but in your heart. A gift that will change your life!

# JESUS... THE PRESENT OF PRESENCE" A PARISH TRADITON!

Developing the proper disposition in the Advent season is aided by a true focus of what this season of waiting is all about.... And that is that Jesus is the present of presence. The most important present, and the first that we should open as a family, is Christ himself. The tradition of putting a manger scene under the tree along with other gifts was to recognize that God gave the first gift that should be shared... His only begotten Son. And it is in the spirit of this gift that we share presents with each other.

#### THE FIRST GIFT WRAPPED ..... THE FIRST GIFT GIVEN.

Mary's time of preparation and waiting for the birth of her son, our Savior, was interrupted by the demands of the world around her. She was subjected, along with Joseph, to travel to Bethlehem for the census demanded by the emperor Cesar Augustus. So it was on this journey that they focused, with anticipation, on the gift of God's presence instead of the anxiety and fear of the demands of travel. This gift of "presence" is all too often hidden from us in the season of advent. Perhaps if it was wrapped beautifully and placed on the mantle and then under the tree in the place of the manager we would see the beauty of the paper and be relieved that Christ is the only gift that matters.

WRAPPING UP THE BABY JESUS AS A GIFT - I am asking each family to take the baby Jesus from the nativity set that will be displayed in your house, place it in an appropriate size box and wrap it in the most glorious fashion! On the tag simply write to: Your family Name from: God our Father. Then display your nativity set, if not yet under the tree, in a prominent place within your home and while placing the wrapped present of the Christ Child within the center.

#### THE BLESSING OF THE STATUES OF BABY JESUS AT MASS

On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 18th I am asking all families to bring their wrapped statues to church to place at the altar for a blessing during Mass. Then each family, from the family community of the corner, will take home their present and place it under the tree. This way we will share in this gift together!!





#### THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

#### FIRST READING

Isaiah 2:1-5

This is what Isaiah, son of Amoz, saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come, the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it; many peoples shall come and say: "Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths." For from Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and impose terms on many peoples. They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. 




