The tradition of the <u>Oplatki</u> originated in Poland during Early Christian times. This Christmas custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity.

HOW TO CELEBRATE THE OPLATKI TRADITION

The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatki. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year — whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express ones unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.

THE SYMBOLISM

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another. This symbolism is deepened by the fact that the name of the town where Jesus Christ was born, Bethlehem, means "House of Bread," which makes the Oplatki tradition an especially beautiful way to celebrate the charity and unity so characteristic of the Christmas season.

A SYMBOL OF FAMILY UNITY

The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy, fun, and deeply meaningful to introduce to the family anytime during the long Christmas season. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season

Thoughts from the Pastor



Heart/Soul Healthy Advent: Three Things to Strengthen Your Disposition

Last Sunday, in my homily I suggested as our mission to "Become Heart/Soul Healthy" as a way to prepare for the coming of our Salvation. We all know that a healthy heart provides us with a healthy life. Jesus and Saint Paul remind us that we must not lose heart and to be strengthen by the love of God in order to be found blameless in His sight. So, this stands as a reminder of the Three things we can do during this Advent Season to be Heart/Soul Healthy.


- 1. Exercise 20 minutes a day. We all know that prayer is the exercise of our Spiritual lives... So, let's pump it up over the next 20 days! Suggestion:
 - **BLUE ADVENT BOOK** that we handed out last week. This day to day exercise (15 minutes) will set your heart and soul on a focus for the day. These little meditations are best as morning prayer.
 - ♣ ADVENT NOVENA PRAYER a part of your family prayer at night. (There are copies/cards in the narthex and in last week's bulletin). This prayer sets our hearts and souls in Bethlehem at the very moment of the birth our Lord. 'Ask and you shall Receive!"
- 2. **Eat Properly** and be nourished with substantial Foods. I suggested that is why we attend Sunday Liturgy so that we can:
 - *FEED** ON THE BREAD OF LIFE... Christ our Lord. We first eat of the Word of God in the Liturgy of the Eucharist and then feast on His Divine Presence in Holy Communion. I would challenge you to eat more of this Food during Advent: Consider attending Saturday morning Mass or Tuesday evening Mass.
 - **EAT OF THE HOLY WORD** of the Scriptures: Read the beginning of Saint Luke's Gospel... the Infancy Narratives... wonderful reading as a family as well.
- 3. **Rest** We all need a "rest" from the hustle and bustle of the "xmas" season.... Award yourself this rest by
 - PRAYING YOUR CHRISTMAS CARDS Once a day sit in the quiet and open your Christmas Cards and pray them... most of them have a spiritual verse.... Let it resonate in your heart/soul. Then pray for the sender and their families. Make it a true spiritual gift rather than a decoration on the back of the door or to adorn your stair case.... You deserve to know that you are loved by the Faith shared in Christ by the sender.
 - RECITE THE JOYFUL MYSTERIES After praying your Christmas cards holding the love of those who send wishes recite the First Three joyful mysteries entering into the Faith restored in the Annunciation; The Hope of the Visitation and the love of the Nativity. Stay in those holy moments. You can add the last two mysteries after Christmas!

Holy Day of Obligation: December 8th!! Feast of the Immaculate Conception Benedict XVI Homily in honor of the feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Dear Brothers and Sisters!

The great feast of Mary Immaculate invites us every year to gather here, in one of Rome's most beautiful piazzas, to offer homage to her, to the Mother of Christ and our Mother. With affection I greet all of you who are present here and those who are joining us via radio and television. And I thank you for your choral participation in my act of prayer.

At the top of the column that we crown Mary is represented by a statue that in part recalls the passage from the Book of Revelation that was just proclaimed: "A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed in the sun, with the moon under her feet and, upon her head, a crown of twelve stars" (Revelation 12:1). What is the meaning of this image? It represents both Our Lady and the Church.



SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT



First of all the "woman" of the Book of Revelation is Mary herself. She appears "clothed in the sun," that is, clothed in God: the Virgin Mary is in fact surrounded by the light of God and lives in God. This symbol of the luminous garments expresses a condition that regards the whole of Mary's being: she is the one who is "full of grace," filled with the love of God. And "God is light" as St. John says (1 John 1:5). This is why she who is "full of grace," the "Immaculate" reflects with her whole person the light of the "sun" that is God.

This woman has the moon beneath her feet, the symbol of death and mortality. Mary, in

fact, is wholly associated with the victory of Jesus Christ, her Son, over sin and death; she is free from

every shadow of death and is completely filled with life. As death no longer has any power over the risen Jesus (cf. Romans 6:9), thus, by a grace and a singular privilege of almighty God, Mary has left death behind, she has overcome it. And this is manifested in the two great mysteries of her life: at the beginning, being conceived without original sin, which is the mystery that we celebrate today; and, at the end, being assumed in soul and body into heaven, into God's glory. But also her whole life on earth was a victory over death, because it was spent entirely in the service of God, in the complete offering of herself to God and neighbor. Because of this Mary is in herself a source of life: she is the creature in whom the word of Christ is already realized: "I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it in abundance" (John 10:10).

In the vision of the Book of Revelation there is another detail: upon the head of the woman clothed in the sun there is "a crown of twelve stars." This sign represents the 12 tribes of Israel and means that the Virgin Mary is at the center of the People of God, of the whole communion of saints. And thus this image of the crown of twelve stars introduces us to the second great interpretation of the celestial sign of the "woman clothed in the sun": besides representing our Lady, this sign personifies the Church, the



Christian community of all times. She is pregnant, in the sense that she carries Christ in her womb and must bear him for the world: this is the suffering of the pilgrim Church on earth, who in the midst of God's consolations and the world's persecution must bring Jesus to men.

It is precisely for this, because she brings Jesus, that the Church meets the opposition of a ferocious adversary, represented in the Book of Revelation by the "great red dragon" (Revelation 12:3). This dragon sought in vain to devour Jesus – the "male child destined to govern all the nations" (12:5). The dragon tries in vain because Jesus, through his death and resurrection, has ascended to God and he has taken his seat upon his throne. This is why the dragon, defeated once and for all in heaven, turns his attacks toward to the woman – the Church – in the wilderness of the world. But in every age the Church is sustained by the light and by the power of God, which nourishes her in the wilderness with the bread of his Word and the Holy Eucharist. And so in every tribulation, through all of the trials that she meets in the course time and in different parts of the world, the Church suffers persecution but is always victorious in the end. And precisely in this way the Christian community is the presence, the guarantee of God's love against every ideology of hatred and egoism.

The only threat the Church can and must fear is the sin of her members. While, in fact, Mary is the Immaculate, free from every stain of sin, the Church is holy, but at the same time she is stained by our sins. This is why the People of God, in pilgrimage through time, turns to its heavenly Mother and implores her help; it asks this so that she might accompany us on the journey of faith, that she might encourage the undertaking of a Christian life and support our hope. We need her above all in this very difficult moment for Italy, for Europe, for various parts of the world. Mary helps us to see that there is a light beyond the dark clouds that seems to envelop reality. For this reason we too, especially on this occasion, do not cease ask for her help with filial confidence: "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." Ora pro nobis, intercede pro nobis ad Dominum Iesum Christum!



GOSPEL READING

Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the desert of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" It was of him that the prophet Isaiah had spoken when he said: A voice of one crying out in the desert, Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. John wore clothing made of camel's hair and had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. When he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones. Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees. Therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. CREED




