No Parish Fish Fry this Lent



After meeting with our social and fundraising committees, we have decided not to resume a Lenten Fish Fry in the parish. Although we had great success in the past the effectiveness of this event in the future poses more challenges than solutions. The inflated cost of the product and supplies has made it obvious that it

would be very difficult to make a profit that would reflect the hard work and planning of the event. Fish used to be a low-cost commodity but in our economic climate today that is no longer true. After researching prices and availability of product we have decided to move away from this Lenten fund-raiser and concentrate on other fund raisers to support the parish mission. We have found that the shared fundraisers of the Cash Bash and monthly (raffle) tickets create a bigger profit than we have imagined with the fish fry in recent years. Our parish night at the races and burger bash events continue to be successful and allows for opportunities to gather and have "Fun" as well as raise funds. Finally, I believe that making Lent a more solemn focus, undistracted by the hard work of the fish fry, leads us better in the spirit of the season. I want to thank everyone who supports our annual fish fry, the leadership and the workers of the past.

Thoughts from the Pastor



CATHOLIC TRADITION: DEVOTIONAL AND LITURGICAL CANDLES "Jesus is the Light of the World"

The practice of lighting candles is an important tradition in Catholic churches, communities and families. Its origins may be traced back in the Old Testament times where an oil lamp is lit to "keep a flame burning perpetually" (Exodus 27:19-20) and as a "lamp stand in the Tent of Meeting...from generation to

generation" (Exodus 30:7-8) "set up before the Lord as He has commanded Moses" (Exodus 40:24-25).

The New Testament further highlights the sanctity of this light in Paul's Letter to the Hebrews. "A first tent was prepared with the lamp stand, the table and the bread of the presence; this is called the Holy Place" (Hebrews 9:2). In today's Catholic tradition, this light has a very special place because it symbolizes Christ who said, "I am the Light of the world; the one who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have light and life" (John 8:12).

In most every part of Catholic celebrations and rituals, lighting of candles plays a very significant role. Candles are lit during the celebration of the Mass, on liturgical and funeral processions and evening prayer ceremonies. Candles are lit before the Tabernacle to signify the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament and to call for reverence on the part of the faithful.

In the Sacrament of Baptism, as a person is initiated into the Church, a candle is lit from the Paschal Candle, the symbol, His passion, His death and His resurrection. The person receives the Light of Christ that he— of Christ's Paschal Mystery may live and walk the path of God's children and keep the flame of faith burning alive in his heart. And as he receives this indelible baptismal mark, he shall meet the Lord and be one with all the saints in Heaven when the right time comes.

Candles are lit before an image of our Lord and before the saints. Catholics practice this not to honor the image itself but the one it truly represents. The lit candle symbolizes a prayer offering where we present our petitions to the Lord and ask the saints to pray with us and to pray for us during our most dire need. This light, as it is kept burning, also shows our desire to remain in God's presence as we go through our daily duties at home and in the workplace.

Candles lit before Christ's image also shows our reverence to Him who deserves our adoration and thanksgiving and who alone can forgive our sins and bring us back into deeper relationship with Him.

Let us then bear in mind that as we celebrate our sacred liturgies, our sacraments and our special prayers, Christ, the Source of all Light, shall come to us to be ever present to strengthen us, instruct us, inspire us hope that His Light will never burn out as long as we live in faith without a shadow of doubt that darkness will ever defeat us.

PASS ON THE TRADITION TO YOUR CHILDREN

Catholic Traditions of Sacraments are so important to pass on to our children and participating in them as a family. Lighting candles at church...saying a prayer together and leaving knowing that it continues to be offered on your behalf was a great comfort to me as a child. Take advantage of lighting a candle at the Blessed Mother, Saint Joseph, Sacred Heart and other statues throughout the church. Devotional lights remind us that we are

in constant communication with our Lord and those who served Him Faithfully.

SPECIAL CANDLES THAT CAN BE OFFERED

Many times we seek to have a Mass offered for our intentions especially for deceased relatives and those who our suffering. The Mass schedule is so full and hard to get a Mass immediately. Some have found comfort in have a 14 day votive candle lit in their name as an opportunity to keep their prayers before the heavens.



Here are the opportunities to have such candles lit in our Church:

Sanctuary Lamp – This candle is above the priest chair signifying the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle.

- **Divine Mercy Lamp** In the chapel of Mercy below the Divine Mercy painting there is a 14 day candle
- **Perpetual Light Lamp** This candle is lit with the new fire at the Easter Vigil and is keep burning before the Blessed mother statue throughout the year.
- St. Peregrine Lamp This 14 day candle is at the foot of the statue of Saint Peregrine and burns for those who have cancer
- Saint Joseph's Lamp at the Statue of Saint Joseph there is a candle that burns for those who have died in the parish.

NOTE: Each of these special lamps can be scheduled for your loved ones through the parish office. The cost of the candles are \$25. All other devoted candles are \$3.00 dollars and the monies can be dropped in the box by the kneelers.

NOTE: Both of these Lenten opportunities is intended for the parishioners of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton and Immaculate Conception. To optimize these Lenten experiences, I would encourage you to attend first Tuesday evening Mass before the Tuesday reflections and the Stations of the Cross before my presentation on Saint Veronica. It is a great way to be spiritually prepared to enter into the passion of Christ crucified and our call to share in His cross. It is a privilege to be the pastor of parishioners of two parishes who understand the constraints of time and their willingness to share in these opportunities. Although we are two separated parishes we are served by the same priests in the name of one Lord!! United in Faith and in community makes us stronger in Christ!!





CREED




