Notes from the Pastor

"Prepare the Way of the Lord"



All my life, during the Lenten Season, the Passion of our Lord was the center of my prayer. We would read, as a family the different Passion narrative as our evening prayer, pray the sorrowful mysteries and attend the Stations of the Cross. My sister loved to listen to the musical Jesus Christ Super Star instead of her Bobby Sherman albums and the movies The Shroud and Jesus of Nazareth were viewed as Holy Week drew near. Too often Lent can be a time of concentrating on our personal sacrifices of "what we gave up" and the Churches mandate of not eating meat that we fail to consider seriously the meditation on Jesus' passion and death. Take the opportunity to read this sermon by Saint Leo the Great... it will be a great way to prepare for Holy Week which will begin next weekend with Palm Sunday.

Contemplating the Lord's passion

From a sermon by Saint Leo the Great, pope

True reverence for the Lord's passion means fixing the eyes of our heart on Jesus crucified and recognizing in him our own humanity.

The earth – our earthly nature – should tremble at the suffering of its Redeemer. The rocks – the hearts of unbelievers – should burst asunder. The dead, imprisoned in the tombs of their mortality, should come forth, the massive stones now ripped apart. Foreshadowing of the future resurrection should appear in the holy city, the Church of God: what is to happen to our bodies should now take place in our hearts.

No one, however weak, is denied a share in the victory of the cross. No one is beyond the help of the prayer of Christ. His prayer brought benefit to the multitude that raged against him. How much more does it bring to those who turn to him in repentance.

Ignorance has been destroyed, obstinacy has been overcome. The sacred blood of Christ has quenched the flaming sword that barred access to the tree of life. The age-old night of sin has given place to the true light.

The Christian people are invited to share the riches of paradise. All who have been reborn have the way open before them to return to their native land, from which they had been exiled. Unless indeed they close off for themselves the path that could be opened before the faith of a thief.

The business of this life should not preoccupy us with its anxiety and pride, so that we no longer strive with all the love of our heart to be like our Redeemer, and to follow his example. Everything that he did or suffered was for our salvation: he wanted his body to share the goodness of its head.

First of all, in taking our human nature while remaining God, so that *the Word became man*, he left no member of the human race, the unbeliever excepted, without a share in his mercy. Who does not share a common nature with Christ if he has welcomed Christ, who took our nature, and is reborn in the Spirit through whom Christ was conceived?



Again, who cannot recognize in Christ his own infirmities? Who would not recognize that Christ's eating and sleeping, his sadness and his shedding of tears of love are marks of the nature of a slave?

It was this nature of a slave that had to be healed of its ancient wounds and cleansed of the defilement of sin. For that reason, the only-begotten Son of God became also the son of man. He was to have both the reality of a human nature and the fullness of the godhead.

The body that lay lifeless in the tomb is ours. The body that rose again on the third day is ours. The body that ascended above all the heights of heaven to the right hand of the Father's glory is ours. If then we walk in the way of his commandments, and are not ashamed to acknowledge the price he paid for our salvation in a lowly body, we too are to rise to share his glory. The promise he made will be fulfilled in the sight of all: Whoever acknowledges me before men, I too will acknowledge him before my Father who is in heaven.

Discernment

Through prayer we open ourselves up to communication with God. Let's now assume that God has called... what's next? You have to answer and respond!

Answering and responding to a question or command always involves something... choice. The process through which a choice is made is discernment. Discernment, at its best, is the choice between two good alternatives. It also takes into account the fact that we have our God-given gift of free will.

We all make choices each and every day, with varying levels of discernment needed. "Do I want to go to Bob Evan's or Eat'n'Park for dinner?" – two good alternatives and a choice must be made. The same is true for our discernment of calls from God. God asks. We have to respond one way or the other and prayerfully consider "How do I feel God calling me to this state of life?" In the end, with any of the vocations, the decision rests with us. God will not "strong arm" us into responding in a way that is coerced or against our will. Choices must be carefully, and most importantly, prayerfully, considered!

I hope that you've enjoyed this series on vocations – know that we've only just begun to scratch the surface!

I challenge you to pray...

- Pray for those who are living out their vocations that they may do so with zeal and love.
- Pray for those who are considering their vocations, that they might conform their will to God's.
- Pray for those who are struggling in living out or discerning their vocations, that they might more clearly see God's guidance.
- Pray that God may continue to call all people towards living their lives in accord with his divine will; and
- Pray that we might all persevere on our journey of faith towards our goal of everlasting happiness with God!

Lastly, I ask that you pray for me, for the seminarians in the Diocese of Greensburg, and for all of my fellow seminarians at St. Charles, that we might persevere in love, to serve Our Lord and His Church.




Student Spotlight Award, recognition of



Martha said, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." He became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said.

"Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?" So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." 


Creed
