





NOTES FROM THE PASTOR



I want to express how blessed I was to have experienced Lent, the Holy Triduum and Easter Sunday with my parish families. How wonderful it was to see so many participate in the conference "Veronica's Veil" both in person and via our "You Tube channel". Many others took time to participate in the discussion groups for "No Greater Love" and the Lenten Bible Studies. Others faithfully attending daily Mass and the Devotion of the Stations of the Cross, I smile to myself thinking that if we are in pursuit of "the best version of ourselves," we have found the "start here" sign during Lent. I hope that continuing through the Easter Season; we will walk the road with the Risen Christ, leading us to understand that He is the Way, the Truth and Life itself. Easter is so powerful and so overwhelming that it cannot be grasped in one Liturgy! So, again... Can we keep it alive in our hearts through the whole season of Easter? Can we look at familiar things that we celebrate as a community and see how it is truly all about the Resurrection? I hope that we could and I thought that I would share a few thoughts to probe us onward...

The Easter Challenge

Lent is over now and with Easter joy it is hard not to immediately cease our particular Lenten discipline: attending an extra Mass each week, the special hour of prayer or spiritual reading we promised to try to do, being more

patient, eating less and giving more of ourselves to others with greater awareness of Christ suffering on the Cross. That is Lent... but what about Easter? What should we do out of Easter Joy? In readings we hear during the Easter season, it is clear that for the infant Church, Easter was a beginning. Of course, all beginnings are also endings. For the disciples it was the end of a magical time. They didn't all know it but they had been walking, eating and talking with...God! Yet, as magical as that must have been, they hadn't yet consumed God. They hadn't begun the process of taken God in and becoming divine themselves. They didn't yet have "resurrection eyes"... that ability to see things as they really are...to see as God sees...that was later.

On Easter, the disciples stood at the empty tomb and were darned confused. Slowly out of that confusion, fear and sadness grew a little ragtag band of folks from a little ragtag part of the world who just happened to change the course of history. Easter marked the beginning of the Christian community. Easter Joy gave even a greater appreciation in discipline as well as acts of love and charity. Imagine the promise of eternal joy that cannot be interfered by the worries of pain, money, loneliness or SIN!!! Wow!!!! The Christian community is the 'forum" to this new way of selfless living.



The Self-help book that has worked for over 2,000 years!!!

The scriptures, of the New Testament, have been provided to us by the Faith and Tradition of the early Christian Community. All other such "self-help" books are cheap "knock-offs" of this original source and they have lost the effectiveness that Christ gives to the original. Read more carefully the Readings for the upcoming Sunday Liturgies and the ones provided in the "little white book" and see how this forum will reinforce your pursuit for happiness!!!

A Proper Easter Diet that leads to a slimmer You!

The Easter Diet is more than just eggs, chocolate, kielbasa and ham... it is a steady diet of the Sacraments of Eucharist and reconciliation as well! Remember, our Easter Duty is to participate in both these sacraments before Pentecost. I suggest participating in the Eucharist as often as you can... at least twice a week and Reconciliation monthly. This regiment will slim you down around the sin list and firm up your intentions to spread the Good News! Clogged arteries may stop the heart but a clean soul and a giving heart pushes you to the Eternal.

Easter Exercise Regimen that guarantees a loving community of Faith!

Exercising the "Hope", of sharing in the "Eternal Kingdom", will lead to more **trust** and less suspicion; more **companionship** and less loneliness; more **appreciation** for each other and less taking for granted; more **forgiveness** and less accusation; more **true communication** and less posturing; more **truth-telling** and less strategizing; more **love** and less apathy; more **long**, **leisurely hours** with those we love and less hurried hugs thrown at each other as we run out the door.

Three things are needed in the pursuit of Happiness and well purposed life...

Being Loved... Jesus provides this with His death and Resurrection

Something to Believe in... The Truth, the Way and the "Eternal Life"

Hope... It only will get better each day and will last forever when we perform the above

Hope... It only will get better each day and will last forever when we perform the above regiment within our Christian community...

Forever...is a long time...and I want to share it with you!!!

Easter Message from Father Roniel



"They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him (John 20:2)."

The very first impression by the very first person who saw the empty tomb was probably confusion, crushing pain, and unimaginable disbelief. In the gospel of John, the story was presented in a manner that Mary Magdalene must have been upset over the idea that people must have hated Jesus so much so that they had to take his body out of the tomb and put it somewhere instead of just being kept there to be pay respect at a later time when they were allowed. In her mind, it was absolutely an insult to injury.

However, the disciples never had the slightest idea what was coming. Never did it occur to any of them in their minds that Jesus would reveal to them what would become the source of joy and hope for all ages. Yes, the Lord would like to take them out of the crushing pain—His resurrection would shine to

the darkest corners of our lives. And now for his disciples, when confusion had finally found answers, the empty tomb became a source of great consolation.

Here we will know the difference: For those who do not know Christ, the empty tomb would mean the absence of God, His nonexistence and total disability. But for those who are close to Him, the empty tomb was a message of hope—because when the tomb was found empty, the dead is no longer there! He is alive! And now they finally understood what Jesus meant when He said that on the third day He will rise. But, let us remember: there was an empty tomb because someone was raised from the dead! Not the other way around.

The resurrection event was unprecedented! It was NOVEL, a totally new reality. Jesus was making a once-and-for-all history! But this historical event is something that we all look forward to on the last day because we know that resurrection is a gift from God to be shared among those who faithfully follow and love Him to the end. It's the most incredible of all gifts, because it answers the deepest longing of every human soul—to live in the presence of God, to be reunited with our loved ones, and to experience the fullness of peace and freedom.

Death, diseases, plague, darkness, slavery all things such as these, no matter how NOVEL you call them, like the NOVEL corona virus, are a thing of the past, already conquered by the power of light, healing, and life. Of course, Satan will always make new tactics. He can create an impression that may deceive us into believing that he is invincible. But we already know the ending! Know that since the event of resurrection, Satan has never done something new. Death has always been on the losing end in an endless fight.

The Holy Father Pope Francis in one of his Easter addresses beautifully tells us this message of hope:

The Church throughout the world echoes the angel's message to the women. [And I was wondering why to the women? The woman was Mary, who was in deep sorrow and pain for losing a dear Son. The woman was also Mary Magdalene who was crushed for losing someone who truly loves, cares, and saves. They were also the women of Jerusalem who wept for losing someone who fought for their dignity and worth. The 'women' is humanity herself who is vulnerable to illness, old-age, and all forms of atrocities; 'She' is humanity preyed to sin and death.] And so, to the women, the angel proclaimed these words of consolation: "Do not be afraid! I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised... Come, see the place where he lay (Mt 28:5-6)."

This is the culmination of the Gospel, it is the Good News par excellence: Jesus, who was crucified, is risen! And this event is the basis of our faith and our hope. If Christ were not raised, Christianity would lose its very meaning; the whole mission of the Church would lose its impulse, for this is the point from which it first set out and continues to set out ever anew.

That is why we tell everyone: "Come and see!" In every human situation, marked by frailty, sin and death, the Good News is no mere matter of words, but a testimony to unconditional and faithful love: it is about leaving ourselves behind and encountering others, being close to those crushed by life's troubles, sharing with the needy, standing at the side of the sick, elderly and the outcast... "Come and see!": Love is more powerful, love gives life, love makes hope blossom in the wilderness.

The story of Jesus's resurrection is the greatest inspirational and love story of all time. The best part is: this story has a happy ending. And it teaches us two things; good things never end and true love never dies.
