



Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus. Do not quench the Spirit. Test everything; retain what is good. Refrain from every kind of evil. May the God of peace himself make you perfectly holy and may you entirely, spirit, soul, and body, be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will also accomplish it.

1Thessolians 5:16-24

Prayer is such an important aspect of our lives in Christ Jesus.

- Paul reminds us that the first prayer should always be a prayer of Rejoicing! Even in the midst of trials, tribulations and suffering the first prayer should be one of praise since we know all ends well in the promise of the Resurrection!
- The second prayer is that for perseverance! To pray without ceasing is a reflection on remaining in the power of the Holy Spirit guiding every step of our day! The words (of unceasing prayer) may change with each breath as we encounter the challenges of the day but their purpose will always remain to persevere in the hope of the risen Christ! So, do not quench the spirit but drink of it with every step so you may test everything and retain what is good!!
- The third prayer should reflect the intention found in the "Lord's Prayer" when we ask to be delivered from evil and this is accomplished by recognizing those occasions of sin and responding to the Grace to rebuke them for they only lead to despair.
- The fourth prayer is to be made perfectly holy, through Grace and Mercy, so we remain blameless as we await His coming.

The caveat here is that the one who calls you to this life of prayer... if Faithful... He will accomplish it in you!

PRAYERS FOR FATHER RONIEL AS WE CELEBRATE HIS FINAL DAYS OF HIS' TIME WITH US!!



Every time I enter our church and see the many burning votive candles at the various statues I am overwhelmed with the joy to know how many prayers are being offered on behalf of souls and the need of help with the burden of daily life.



Every candle reminds me of the importance of sharing prayers with the community even though the intention remains hidden. Your candle burns alongside another and the brightness of such a display calls to mind the necessity of communal prayer and intentions of our heart.

Expense of Candles and the Increase of Price – Since I have been here at Immaculate Conception the cost of a 7-day votive candle has been set at \$3 based on the price of the individual candle. The cost has increased annually but even more so after the pandemic when everything became much more expensive. So in order for us to supply the candles we need to raise the cost to \$5 per candle. Please make note of this price change and continual assurance of my prayers along with yours as our candles burn the constant prayer of our hearts.



GOSPEL READING

Luke 24:13-35

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.


The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.


