

LIFE AFTER FATHER RONIEL

The first question that most of us have in our hearts and in our minds with the departure of Father Roniel last week is: "Who will the bishop send us?" and "When will he arrive?" These are legitimate questions to be asked due to the fact that for the past five years, both parishes have been blessed with a "dynamic duo" a real "Batman and Robin" one two punch to ministry. My priestly ministry was definitely enhanced by the young, vibrant and holy presence of Father Roniel. The over-all comment, when I explain that I do not know who and when we will have a new priest assigned, is "Well whoever it is will have big shoes to fill!" and that is very true! The new priest will be, at least at first, held up to a high standard that Father Roniel set in his ministry.

New Draft Class is Thin

We are so blessed to have had Father Andrew Hamilton ordained for the Diocese of Greensburg this weekend and looking forward to his life as a priest serving the people of the Diocese. He is the only newly ordained that we have this year and many (including myself) are praying that we win the lottery of his assignment to us here in our communities!

We also know that Three new missionaries from the Philippines have just arrived and three more priests are on their way very soon. The possibility of one of the "new arrivals coming our way" have been added to the draft board. Also, with a possible retirement from the ranks may add to the need of replacements adding more moving parts.

> This reality takes away the comfort of the simple "plug and play" assignments that make life for the personal board and the bishop to consider is mostly off the board. If movement of priest from one parish to another begins to happen then the reality of who are parochial vicar will be is near endless. Being that the assignments are done through prayer and the trust in the Holy Spirit to give right judgement to the discernment process makes it impossible for us to know until the Bishop announces the appointments! Let us pray for the Bishop for Wisdom and right judgement in this very difficult process of assignments

Breaking in a New Parochial Vicar is a Mission of Patience

It is easy to say a priest is a priest and one is blessed to have them assigned to a parish to nurture the spiritual lives of the people. But we also know that priests are human person who bring a certain skill set to the table where experience truly matters in the ability to jump right in with both feet. A newly ordained priest brings the excitement and energy of finally getting started in serving as a priest but yet is limited in experience and patience is needed to allow him to get to know us and grow in the role of parochial vicar. The new arrivals from the Philippines bring with them years of pastoral ministry skills but a culture barrier will take time to overcome until a comfort level can be obtained. I think we may forget that

it took Father Roniel some time to figure us American Catholics out at first!! So much more patience will be needed if a new missionary is assigned to us. If a native priest or international priest already working in the Greensburg Diocese vineyard come to us there also will be the challenge of them getting used to us and our charism and mission. So once again patience will be needed!

Substitute Priest: Let the Merry go Round Begin: No one really knows how soon we will be granted a new parochial vicar as mentioned above the Bishop has his hands full with the assignments that need to be considered. It could be a month or longer so get ready for the substitute priest Merry go round to begin. I will let you know where I will be and where our visiting priest will celebrate Mass! Thank God for the wonderful retired priest and the monks from the Arch Abbey who will fill in and share the Sacred Mass with us!! More of a reminder to pray for more vocations!!

We, in the time of extreme shortage of priests for the bishop to be assigned, we must remember that a Priest is a



Priest and if blessed with one to assist us in our sacramental and spiritual lives we should show great gratitude! To desire the top pick in the draft is a worthy prayer to offer but the most important prayer to offer is that for which reflects the will of God for the people of our communities. We are very welcoming, nurturing, accepting and loving which makes whomever is assigned a very blessed man! If we extend the same kind of love we did for Father Roniel then we will, once again, benefit from their ministry.

It is important that we pray daily for the gift of our next parochial vicar as the decision is being made to send him into our lives. Let us pray that he will rejoice in hearing of his assignment to us and that we receive him with open and loving arms; with patience and gratitude!




