# PASTOR'S NOTES SINS AGAINST THE HOLY SPIRIT

#### (Part 5 0f 7)

In the first article of the series about Blasphemes against the Holy Spirit we reflected on how Jesus warns that a house that is divided against itself it cannot stand. Standing guard of our treasures, as to put them under Lock and Key, is not the way to be strong enough to protect them. Rather one must participate in the gifts of the Holy Spirit to recognize that their value is worth more than the sleep of worldly lure. Being "tied up" begins with each and every little thread of sin that slowly binds us to the ground... to the earthly desire..... and takes away our freedom. This leads us to forget the value of the Spiritual gifts and denounce them (blaspheme) which leads to certain death. The last three weeks we discussed the first three blasphemes against the Holy Spirit: Despair, Presumption and Impunging the known truth. This week we will discuss Envy of another's spiritual gifts.

"There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; There are different forms of service but the same Lord; There are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another mighty deeds; to another prophecy; to another discernment of spirits; to another varieties of tongues; to another interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes"

(1Cor 12:4-11)

(4) Envy the Spirit, the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians states, "All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually as the Spirit chooses." To envy the spiritual good of another is to question the Divine judgment of the Holy Spirit in His distribution of spiritual gifts. It is to be jealous of another person who has a gift different than one's own gift. Through envy, one rejects the gift that they have received from the Holy Spirit, determining in their own minds that the gift they have received is not good enough for them and they want someone else's gift.

<u>Christianity is a Team Sport</u> – As a small child I watched every St. Joseph High School basketball game dreaming of someday being ....not only a player but a star for that team. It may have been a small dream to desire to play for such a small high school in some unknown small Catholic league but it was my dream. At night I would dream of being the point guard, having dribbling skills that would match that of the globe trotters, or in this case (#10) KC Ladish or (#22) Wayne Spencer. I dreamt to shoot like the rock (#42) Russell Watt or power my way to the hoop like (#50) Tommy Gustason. Yeah.... No name high school kids..... Who were my hero's that played the game I loved! So I worked on my skills and prayed that I would have the chance to be a star on the team that honored the Husband of Mary.

Yes I had my chance and I did realize my dreams of playing on a pretty fantastic team in our day. But being a star was not what I achieved.... Being a role player, working alongside some really skilled b-ball players, gave me the greatest experience of "team work" and success. No individual glory outweighs the success of the whole! Sure do I wish I was the best shooter, dribbler or even best defender.... ABSOLUTELY... But my gift was my height and I used it to rebound and block shots. If I would have been focused on the score book or the accolades that come with other skills I would have been unable to contribute.

### The One Body Mentality:

Saint Paul goes on to speak about the "Body of Christ" and how each member is just as important as the others.... So the gifts of the Holy Spirit are given to each to use for the whole and one is not more important than another... So why do we become jealous of other's "Spiritual Gifts?" Why is it that we desire to play a different role within the promulgation of the Faith? I think the reasons are three-fold:

**Vainglory-** Satan always wants us to seek God's Glory through the recognition of our skills and gifts. Yes, I do it for the greater glory of God... but look how important I am in the process of proclaiming the good News!! So when someone else is recognized for their courage; wisdom; knowledge or piety we covet to be them... not so much the gift but we covet what the gift brings to us.

**Holiness-** In our desire to become "Holy" we look for the tools that would make the road much more pleasant. I'd rather have wisdom and knowledge instead of perseverance and courage. It would be easier if I actually "understood" what was going on along the way to holiness. I'd rather have the gift of right judgment/council instead of the one who needs to seek direction from another. The road to holiness is not about what our "role" is but how we perform our own in conjunction with others.... So if you have to seek the wisdom of another or direction along the narrow path then so be it. Just do what you can to move down the path.

**Divided Spirit-** If when I played basketball I became more aware of my teammates prowess on the court and desired their success instead of the team's then I would have shot more... dribbled more and passed less. I would have forgot to fight for rebounds that started the fast break or failed to block a shot that was a sure score for the opponent. If I took this attitude I would have worked against the spirit of the team and success. The same is true with the Holy Spirit. God portions out the gifts so that the Church will be successful in spreading the Gospel and bringing souls to heaven. Envy kills the Spirit within us and impedes the His work within others. A house divided against itself will truly fall.

#### **Combating the sin of Spiritual Envy**

Pray to recognize your own gifts and why they were given to you specifically Pray for a greater understanding of your role and gifts Keep the bigger picture in mind: The Kingdom of God Encourage others in their works of the Spirit... Strategize how you can use your gifts to compliment the works of others Be humble in your approach of worship and action Do nothing to dampen the Spirit within you... use the Sacrament of Reconciliation often Strive for holiness through submission to God's will and not your version of it



#### GOSPEL READING Mat

Matthew 14:22-33

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." 


