





#### PASTOR'S NOTES



Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. Matthew 16:13

On Sunday, August 27th in my homily, I shared a reflection on this particular Gospel passage that came from the retreat that was given to my senior class, before graduation, by Father Henne our religion teacher. The retreat was one that I had all but forgotten about until I came across the notebook from the retreat among some effects that were stored away in my high school memorabilia. The notebook brought back a flood of memories from that day as I paged through the handouts and the notes that I scribbled down in the book. It was a reminder to me that the mind stores memories until the heart and the soul are ready to use them again. Some of the things that I wrote down have been my mantras over the years that I shared in homilies but only recently recalled where they originated!! Finding this notebook was like finding the source of the personal relationship that I have developed over the years as I grew in Faith and ministry. These reflections are based on answering the question that Jesus posed to Simon Peter: "Who do you say that I am?" Last week we looked at the first slide from Father Henne's presentation: The Nativity. This week we will look at the following slides and share a meditation: Baptism of Jesus by John and the women caught in adultery.

#### Slide 3: The Baptism of Jesus by John



Who do you say that I am? Next to this picture I wrote curiously: "My Cousin". Now this must have been the first thought that came to mind since I was very much aware of the role of John the Baptist in the life of Jesus. As you know John the Baptist is my name sake and I chose that name again in confirmation. So with much study of John I always thought of the intimacy (closeness) that John and Jesus must have had growing up. To be the cousin of Jesus but yet to come to realize that he was the Messiah was such a cool thought for me. I remember often wondering how I would have carried out the mission as the precursor of Jesus if I was REALLY John the Baptist? Would I have been so excited to share him with others and prepare them well for the message that he would bring?

Being a cousin would have afforded me to tease him perhaps, and at the same time be in awe of Him, as well. Would I have asked Him all kinds of questions? Like: What's heaven like? What is it like to be God but still be like me? Stupid kid stuff I guess, but interesting thoughts.

The next thing that I had written next to this caption was more focused on the situation and the question that Father Henne was asking. The answer seemed too obvious with the dove in the sky and the voice of the Father that

Jesus was the son of God and came to redeem us. So I must have realized that Jesus was one that I was to listen to and trust in all his words/teachings that he shared. So I wrote "One that I must listen to and obey!" I know as I reflect back, that it was always how I saw Jesus... one that I should listen to, and allow him to guide me through the many decisions I needed to make everyday. I think that is why having a moral code to follow is different than having rules and good advice shared by a parent, teacher or coach. See, moral code denotes a relationship with God that is centered in love. To listen to Jesus meant to love myself as he loved me! Not to do right and wrong because it was expected but to do it to "become" like him and to be like cousins, brothers in the love of the Father in heaven. Personal relationship was what drew me to try and do what was right. The image of the Sacred heart as a young man in college seemed to beckon me to place my head on His chest and to listen to His heart of love.

But now when I look at the slide (Jesus' baptism), I realize the power of the gift of baptism that I impose on so many over the years, over 2,000 baptisms! Father Henne would be proud of me, I often muse, to see that I came to understand the importance of answering that question of who Jesus is for me. But I think in a special way, it comes to my own approach of baptism. When I baptize and take the child from the mother's arms to present him to all that are present, I kiss the child on the head and whisper, "Please always listen to Him!" I then ask the Holy spirit to always hover over the child as a sign of God's Divine presence within! Who is Jesus in this meditation? He is the one to listen to and to become like the Father in heaven, as intended, from the beginning of time. Yes the baptism of Jesus revealed His divinity but it also gave us a teacher, redeemer and a friend. So when you imagine the baptism of Jesus by John, do you see yourself as one of those on the bank of the Jor-



dan watching intently to the scene that unfolds? To imagine seeing the sky tom open with the Holy spirit hovering and the Father Saying, "this is my Beloved son listen to him?" Do you see Jesus in that Divine Light and also see him as one to follow with a desire to become a friend and companion? Are you ready to listen to him as Mary, Lazarus' sister, did at the feet of Jesus and find nothing better than His words?

When you see this picture of the baptism of Jesus by John, how do you respond to the questions. Who do you say that I am? Jesus asks...Right then and there who is He to you? Can your answer change your life? Does it make you desire a deeper love of truth as it comes to as a lesson of morality and love? Take time to answer such questions and give him your answer!!

#### Slide 4: Women Caught in Adultery

"Who do you say that I am"? Scratched in my notebook I had



written: Lover of Sinners! I also wrote Healer of Souls! As I remember correctly, these were part of a Sacred Heart litany that my grandmother used to offer as part of her morning prayers. She had this old prayer book that had so many different holy (funeral) cards along with well worn novena prayers and litanies. These all held together with a "gum band" and sat by her wheel chair where she would pray as she lived with us during my Senior year. The Sacred Heart pamphlet was always on the outside of the book not tucked away with the others. On the front it had the Sacred Heart and the words: Healer of Souls and Lover of Sinners. For the quid pro quo (something for something) exercise that Father Henne had us doing it must have been the first thing that came to my mind. I always wanted to be believe that Jesus loved me in my sinfulness but I was always embarrassed to be a sinner. But since a child and growing up with going to confessions once a month. I did know for sure that he was a lover of

sinners. I always felt fresh and with a new start when I walked out the confessional box. To think of Jesus as a lover of sinners made me realize that we would never be abandoned from His love. In college I often thought of the difference between Simon Peter and Judas. Simon was embarrassed by his sins but Jesus reassured him of His love. This allowed Peter to become strong and Holy. Judas could not have believed that Jesus was a lover of sinners, for he would have never taken his own life. Jesus loving us as we are, speaks to His complete understanding of the poison of sin and the effect that it has on our trust in Him. Jesus had to love sinners or He would not have taken the cross and died for our sins. His desire to heal souls is caught up in His love of sinners!

#### PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED



Hate the sin and love the sinner! As a priest this becomes an important mantra to live by in the image of Jesus.

Hate the sin of every person and every circumstance. This means do not dismiss it or excuse it away. This kind of approach leads to relativism and just accepts people as they are and not as sinners. This is a great way to understand what it means that Jesus loves the sinner. A sinner is someone who understands that they have made a moral choice not to live in His love and by that choice, they are experiencing (guilt) the pain of a broken relationship. That person can come to forgiveness...they will receive it and be reminded to "go and sin no more!" This was the message that he gave the women caught in her horrible sin...choose the new life I give you and trust in my love! If people don't account anything as a "sin" then they cannot claim a love with Christ, they cannot even claim a need for him as redeemer. This is how Satan twists the hearts and lives of the people of the world today. Take away the reality of our sinful nature, then the relationship with the Healer of Souls is diminished. As a confessor, I relish the image of the Divine Mercy that hangs outside of my confessional. I love that it is the image that the penitents meditate upon as they wait for that gift of mercy to be related from the heart of Christ through the gift of my priesthood. I receive every penitent with the love of sinners that Jesus does and

as I exist myself. The Divine Mercy of the Healer of Souls pours forth like that which the Adulterous women received that changed her life! The Women caught in Adultery. "Who do you say that Jesus is? I often ask: think of your worst sin...and now think of being caught in the very act of that sin! Yes that is the feeling that this women had and now is brought forth for judgment. That sin, your worst sin is where Jesus befriends you and allows you to experience Him as the Healer of Souls! Who do you say that He is? Can you trust in His Divine Mercy to be what you need Him to be to change your life and be the redeemer?

#### CREED

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and life of the world to come. Amen.
