

Every year I have invited you to join me and 50 others to stand along Pennsylvania Avenue to quietly stand in prayer to witness to the truth and belief of the sacredness of life from the moment of Conception. Unborn children are discarded in our country as collateral damage to the careless use of the gift of procreation. More than ever we should all evaluate the seven reasons why we should participate. Please read carefully and consider joining me this afternoon! The Steelers will win or lose without us but the unborn need our love. Prayers and Support!


### Seven Reasons Why

### Catholic Christians Should Attend the Local Life Chain

1) To both receive ministry and to minister to the public, aided by the Holy Spirit. If we the church accept the ministry God has for His sons and daughters, He will empower us to minister truth to motorists and pedestrians and do so with humility, compassion, and conviction.

2) To provide God a witness to anoint and use to save lives and change hearts in each local area.

Life Chain is only a first step into pro-life activism, but it's an important step that tests our hearts and helps prepare us to defend the defenseless among us. Such is the story of the Good Samaritan and the story of Christ's Bride, the humble sheep who meet urgent needs in Matthew 25. Let us the church love the preborn and embrace *mercy* and *justice*. In so doing we defend our homeland more ably than can our military arsenal.





themselves and pray... [2 Chron. 7:14]." Consider the moral decay today in church, government, academia, and commerce. Consider the attack on traditional marriage. Consider the epidemics of pornography, sexual disease, cohabitation, illegitimacy, divorce. All are linked to abortion and innocent blood. If God used a catastrophic civil war to end institutional slavery in America, what might He use to end the legal mutilation of our preborn citizens? Under Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton, America has become one of the world's most



violent nations. Also, in June of 2013, the U.S. Supreme Court struck down America's Defense of Marriage Act and opened the door for same-sex marriage in contested areas. Legal abortion and its grievous impact will cease when the church unites against it.

4) To better understand the impact abortion is having on our country and why the church must end the killing. The church can defeat legal abortion and its allies if we move beyond the "abortion issue" and value preborn humanity and their progeny as we should. Our lukewarm

attitude grieves God, who assures us He does not forget "the cry of the afflicted [Psalm 9:12]. Satan's goal is to steal our compassion and urgency and limit us to "good works" that do not confront deadly evils like abortion.

5) To move the church from the sanctuary to the "city gates" and "marketplace."

SIMPLY: "The pew cannot do what the pulpit is supposed to do." Of urgent need are shepherds who will lead, who will equip themselves for battle and inspire their sheep to do likewise. Then endangered lambs will have protection.

6) To honor our youngest citizens who perish needlessly, usually within blocks of multiple church altars. Let us acknowledge our replication of the German church under Nazism and cultivate heart for probably well over 100 million U.S. preborn and millions more in Canada who have died from surgical abortions and chemical birth controls. Like unto European Jews, the children had only the church to rely on.

7) To help build a resolute army of Christians who are prolife in both word and deed. Let us engage the enemy, boldly and strategically, until the curse of legal abortion is lifted and



and strategically, until the curse of legal abortion is lifted and America and Canada again provide security and freedom for every citizen, born and preborn. That we can do. We have the means. Let us attain the will.

### DEVOTIONAL STATUES IN THE CHURCH

As a child I think I learned more about my Faith through sacramentals, devotions and statues. Walking into a particular room and of course into the body of the church there was always a Holy Water font (stoup) and "blessing" myself was an act of such power as I felt the love of God and the protection from evil. Having a rosary, holy cards and medals to wear around my neck kept me close to the beloved traditions of my grandma. But the statues in the church, always nearly life size and so magnificent made the church feel like heaven and a sanctuary of grace that it was for Catholics. Statues in church are also a wonderful teaching tool for the life of the Saints and to learn the devotional prayers for their intercession. So, it is by no surprise that many in the parishes still seek them out to bring the closeness of God's love through His most prized friends.

### Saint Michael: On His Way to Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton



So many parishioners have been asking for a Statue of Saint Michael like the one that is displayed in Immaculate Conception Church. A Saint Michael relief that will be mounted above the choir area is on its way. A very generous parish family has purchased the statue for the parish and I am so excited for its arrival. Saint Michael is our defender of Faith. We pray for his intercession at every mass and it reminds us how much evil is in the world and how Satan tries to devour good holy souls with evil temptations and allurement. So, when the statue is placed we will bless it and remember to always invoke his intercession.
