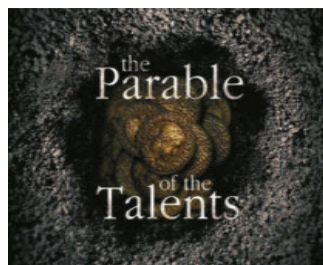

PASTOR'S NOTES

Diocesan "Increase Offertory Program"



This year the "thanks GIVING" program was developed by the diocese to help priests reach the people of the parish both in the pew and beyond. The mailings that will follow the post card that you have received from me will give a snap shot of the parish life and how your Stewardship of Time, Talent, and Treasure has furthered the spiritual and corporal works within our parishes through ministries and charity. Of course, recognizing the good works that have been done also denotes the need of continual financial support to maintain buildings, programs and staffing for parish life. Stewardship should encompass all parts of our lives and give us a broader understanding

of the "Garden of our lives." I will be sharing with you the following "Theology of Stewardship" with you during this "thanks-GIVING campaign this fall."

TENDING TO THE GARDENS OF OUR LIFE

For the Christian steward, today's world is a garden to cultivate for the glory of God and the service of humankind. Last week we meditated upon the Bodily Garden. This week we will look at the Social Garden of our lives.

SOCIAL GARDEN

There are many social events that we attend, some of them we await with great excitement and others we simply tolerate. The best of them, in my opinion, are those that include food and especially a "table experience." We can socialize at a burger bash, standing around at an ethnic food fair or chow down on some dogs with 50,000 others at a ball game but, sitting and eating with a small group makes food a feast and eating a dining experience. During the Parish Mission of 2009 I shared with you (Martha, Mary and the Jesus Creed) the importance of the "Jesus Creed" and those who sat at table with Christ throughout His ministry. Jesus was a very social character and yet a private man. Jesus loved the intimate dinners with Martha, Mary and Lazarus; He tolerated, yet attended, the feasts of the Scribes and the Pharisees; He ate at the table of the Tax collector Matthew and sinners alike and He had cook-outs on the long journeys between cities, as well as, meals with five thousand at a time. At all these meals, observations were made and lessons taught. The greatest lesson taught was whether they were his intimates, advisories, pupils or sinners they all experienced Jesus the Christ and the love of His Father. Scot McKnight, in his book The Jesus Creed, challenges us to imagine every relationship we encounter as a meal and to evaluate our representation of Christ at the table.



Nurturing Good Strong Relationships - Being stewards of our Social Garden requires great attention to detail. One cannot simply throw seeds about and hope for the best. This approach in the parable of the sower and the seed proved to be erratic and not very profitable. Every relationship, at every level of commitment requires nurturing. The important factor is that we must recognize the table climate of which we dine and our role as nurturer or student.

PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

Furthermore, we must be aware that the people we dine with represent the many soils of the garden, while we must represent the presence of Christ as the "seed." Strong relationships are built on skills of communication, openness and the ability to share the image of Christ within. The more of oneself in Christ is accepted the more fruitful the relationships. The work begins by identifying the soil and working with it so that it will bear a good harvest.

The Family Table - The treatment of our own family as our primary social community should come as the greatest priority. We do not need to look past the bowl of spaghetti to see the different soils of the lives of our own parents, brothers, sisters and children. We should be aware that all our sinners and some within the family feel to be outcast. We do not need to go further than the evening dinner table or holiday feast to be challenged to feed a hungry soul spiritually. To nurture the garden of our family is to remove the blinders of the accepted roles of a family member and treat them like a garden to plant the seed of Christ's Love.

The Burger Bash Table - While participating in the cooking of onions and burgers for thousands to eat I cannot help to think of the multiplication of the loaves story. Being that the "Corner Burger" is not much more a meal than the bread and fish sandwiches that Jesus provided begins the analogy. But the difference of each individual is what makes the comparison so surreal. As they come, I think in song to myself that they are as different as the kids who love Armor Hotdogs!!! And they all eat a burger one bite at a time! This social garden reminds me of who I am to who they are! If "they" are Catholic parishioners or from neighboring parishes I can easily identify them as "family." If they are members of the community at large then my role as Priest/Chef must reach them with love, respect, and with no discrimination of color or creed. I must also be aware of the many soils of Faith in which they may approach the counter as well. All of these people are potential soils to sow the Gospel seed... So all are welcome in this place!



Lunchroom Table - Most of us feel vulnerable at the cafeteria table. It is one that we may try to control by surrounding ourselves with "like" people so we can be comfortable with sharing in a discussion and making lunch an uneventful experience in the midst of our school/work day. But, it is not so controllable....one may walk over and sit down uninvited or some will seek a place to sit and we are challenged...indiscriminately to invite them to "eat with us." It is in this climate that we exemplify Christ by welcoming the "outcast" to our table. What we encounter may prove to be the best act of social stewardship we could imagine! They may teach us...we may teach them. They too may desire to engage us again and bring others to share the table where they encountered Christ.



The Eucharistic Table - The first day of the week when we gather to be nurtured by Christ at the most profound meal He ever shared, then and now, allows us to evaluate how we have seen our obligation as stewards of the social garden. Just take a peek around you as members filter into the pews. Do you see them? They need us as much as we need them. We offer them peace and then share with them a meal of a covenant won by the ultimate sacrifice of the host! All are welcome in this Place!!! And also the Place He has prepared for us eternally!
