



#### "GIVE TO CAESAR TO WHAT IS CAESARS...GIVE TO GOD WHAT IS GOD'S"

#### Tending to the Political Garden of our Lives



Two weekends ago the Gospel (Matthew 22:15-21), we find Jesus' answer to whether a Jew should pay the Roman Tax. This text is often used to defend the necessity to keep separate Church and State affairs. Jesus would agree as long as being a loyal member of society in which we live does not compromise our loyalties to building His kingdom in its midst. Our constitution protects the right of religious bodies to teach, profess and practice a living faith in Christ. It allows us, in public forum also to desire those beliefs to be reflected

in the laws that govern our land as well. Tending to the Political Garden of our life is aided by the works of our own Bishop and those of this country. Let us follow their lead.

#### USCCB Pastoral Letter: A Call to Faithful Citizenship



The Bishops state: "One of our greatest blessings in the United States is our right and responsibility to participate in civic life. It is increasingly apparent that major public issues have clear moral dimensions and that religious values have significant public consequences. Our nation is enriched and our tradition of pluralism enhanced when religious groups contribute to the debate over the policies that guide the nation."

"As members of the Catholic community, we enter the public forum to act on our moral convictions, share our experience in serving the poor and vulnerable, and add our values to the dialogue over our nation's future. Catholics are called to be a community of conscience within the larger society and to test public life by the moral

wisdom anchored in Scripture and consistent with the best of our nation's founding ideals. Our moral framework does not easily fit the categories of right or left, Democrat or Republican. Our responsibility is to measure every party and platform by how its agenda touches human life and dignity. Saint John Paul II also encourages us to do the same: "For the Christian people of America conversion to the Gospel means to revise "all the different areas and aspects of life, especially those related to the social order and the pursuit of the common good." It will be especially necessary "to nurture the growing awareness in society of the dignity of every person and, therefore, to promote in the community a sense of the duty to participate in political life in harmony with the Gospel." These words were echoed by Pope Benedict VI upon his visit to our country in 2014.

As Catholics, we should embrace our citizenship not *merely* as a duty and privilege, but as an opportunity to participate in *building* the culture of life in the image of the eternal kingdom. Every voice matters in the public forum. Every vote counts. Every act of responsible citizenship is an exercise of significant individual power.

#### A Consistent Moral Framework

The Word of God and the teaching of the Church give us a particular way of viewing the world. Scripture calls us to "choose life," to serve "the least of our brothers". It is with this in mind that we should approach the upcoming elections. As Catholics we need to share our values, raise our voices, and use our votes to shape a society that protects human life, promotes family life, pursues social justice, and practices solidarity. These efforts will strengthen our nation and renew our Church.

#### Life and Dignity of the Human Person




Every human person is created in the image and likeness of God. The conviction that human life is sacred and that each person has inherent dignity that must be respected in society lies at the heart of Catholic social teaching. Calls to advance human rights are illusions if the right to life itself is subject to attack. We believe that every human life is sacred from conception to natural death; that people are more important than things; and

that the measure of every institution is whether or not it enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

#### Voting with a Moral Consciousness

The Bishops urge Catholics to support those who are willing to promote laws and social policies that protect human life and promote human dignity to the maximum degree possible. Laws that legitimize abortion, assist suicide, and euthanasia are profoundly unjust and wrong. We support constitutional protection for unborn human life, as well as, legislative efforts to oppose abortion and euthanasia.

#### The Greatest Catch 22 Saying of Jesus



By definition a "Catch 22" is a paradoxical situation from which an individual cannot escape because of contradictory rules or limitations. The term was coined by Joseph Heller, who used it in his 1961 novel Catch 22. Simple example of such a quandary is that a father tells a child that they cannot have a bike until they learn how to ride. How can the child learn if she does not have a bike to learn how to ride? These types of Catch 22 experiences can go around and round as a vicious cycle with no way to overcome.

Last Sunday's Gospel is a type of a Catch 22 paradox but in a good sense of the experience. Instead of the inability to escape contradictory rules and limitation one is forced into a situation that two rules complement each other so well that the one cannot be adhering to without also accepting the second rule.

When Jesus is asked which is the greatest commandment He states two equals but distinctly different commandments.

"This is the greatest commandment: Love God with your whole heart, soul, mind and strength. Okay love God above all things... got it!! Then He immediately says: "The second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself!" these two commandments are distinctly different but yet impossible to live separate from each other once you understand the first and its effect on the second command.

Before I explain, I like to call this command a vicious circle of infinite love! It begs the very nature of who we are and how we were created in the image and likeness of God. So, let us first set some ground rules here for our reflection. Let us first define some

necessary terms and relationships that make these commands truly what Jesus says they are: "The basis of all the commandments'. First, the word "commandment" always carries with it a negative connotation based on I am sure, our experience of commands as a



child. Commands are usually set up to restrict freedom and confine ones will. Perhaps that is a case in a dictator relationship but not in a loving Fatherly relationship for which God intends and desires. Remember always that a command that God gives is of Love and Truth!! He first commanded all of creation into existence. It was out of love and the Divine Truth of His omnipotent nature that it HAPPENED! One cannot look upon creation and not be awe stricken by love and the truth of God's Divine plan! Jesus commanded the evil spirits to come out of the demoniac and demanded that seas calm and quiet and that bread and wine become His body and blood! All these commands were spoken as love and Truth. Out of love a greater truth is revealed for those who follow His way! It is not surprising that when Jesus was asked to "set limits" on

man by invoking the greatest commandment Jesus chose not to limit but challenge to greater heights of love. His command was not a negative restriction but an empowerment of becoming like Him the source of love itself.

These commands also beg the reality of Jesus as the second person of the Divine Trinity!! Remember Jesus became like us so that we could become like Him. Like Him, how? Well first as witness to the love of the Father. The word became flesh so we could hear the voice of the Father calling us into His love. To do the Will of the Father is to incorporate His plan of love and eternity. We can know this and share in this only because Jesus took on Flesh. We know ultimately Jesus will prove His love for the Father by accepting the cross. But Jesus will also show us His love for us when he offers Himself upon the Cross. See how the two commandments already begin to be the same. The consequences of loving the Father is a desire to love our neighbor.

#### The lesson of infinite love: "The First Great Commandment"

If we take the commandment love God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength as it is written, it is plenty challenging. This first takes a submission of ones will. To choose to love God with our whole life, with every thought and seek Him above all fulfillment and submit to trust in His strength and not our abilities would be daunting! That kind of selfless desire would certainly humble us and build an intimate relationship with God. But the problem is that our ability to love with a human heart, human intellect, the human soul (tainted by concupiscence) and human strength would make us super pleasing to God perhaps but not like Him in His Divine nature. If this is a lesson of infinite love then the limitations must be removed and an infinite ability must be cast upon us! So what does that look like and what do these words of the first and greatest commandment really mean? The words mean that we must trade in our human desires and abilities and be transformed into the real thing: God himself!



Trading up for the Better Part - The deeper meaning to these words is a plea to trade in our human abilities for Divine abilities! Yes, now we can talk about being transformed into His likeness. Our prayer and intention TRADINGUP would be to discard our hearts and take His most Sacred Heart that burns for His Father's love. It would also be to take our intellect and its finite way to reason, think, and experience and

change it in for the one directed by the wisdom, knowledge, and understanding of the Holy Spirit! And again to take our soul which has been tainted by sin and free choice of appetite and trade it in for one that resonates with eternal bliss! And also, to take the courage of the Holy Spirit, the infinite power of the Father's creative vastness and the persevering strength of the Crucified Christ and give away our human strength so we could have the formula of loving God with our whole being! Remember loving God is not simply a response or the perfect consequence to His love of us but the desire to imitate Him as we were created to do!

This love of God transforms us from the weak sinful self-absorbing person that we are in our fallen nature, to the original Holiness that we are called to through grace, virtue, and desire! Now we are on our way of understanding what the command to love God will do for those who desire to be pleasing to the Lord!



The Vicious Cycle Now Begins! - Once we understand that the meaning of loving God is a desire to be like Him then we begin to believe the value of our own life and the image for which we were created! Many people spend most of their lives looking at their deficiencies and fail to realize the blessedness of self and holiness that exist within. Satan wants us to reflect on the broken nature of our being and distract us from the beauty of who we are in the eyes of God as our creator! But when we strive to be "like" Him then there is no shame to love ourselves as God loves us!! This is where we gain the confidence of considering loving our neighbor as we love our self. For we are "lovable" when sharply tuned in to His image! So, loving your neighbor is a call to love them into the image and likeness of God which they have been created. To love

them is to see God in their heart, soul, mind, and weakness. We love them until they are transformed with the same love that transformed us!

When we are so overwhelmed and empowered by love we in turn love! The act of loving another equates with an act of creation for it lifts one up from the broken state of the human condition and restores it to the image for which God created that person! When we love our neighbor, we bring about the disposition that allows another to know what it means to be loved. The first experience of God's love for us comes through an act of love of another human person. Think about how many people came to know the love of the Father because they experienced the love of Jesus in the incarnate word!! So Jesus gives us the commandment that loving God with our whole being transformed by Him becomes the vehicle of others learning of His love and gift of Salvation. That is the mission of these two commandments.
