

PASTOR'S NOTES



"YOU'RE WELCOME" THE PROPER RESPONSE TO "THANK YOU"

Thanksgiving comes with a great "folklore" history of the Pilgrims and the Indians sharing a meal which is only equaled by the family tradition of Turkey and Football. For some it is a day of sharing with a parish family giving Thanks for the comucopia of God's spiritual blessings, as well as, blessings of health and wealth. But it is all the same, if we remember to give thanks for all that we are blessed to have, as a faith community, family, and nation. Some get very sentimental about their blessings while others take them for granted. Many feel that they have plenty to be thankful for while others, in their loneliness, poor health and brokenness, only wish that the day would be removed from the calendar. Is the day overrated? Is it just another

Hallmark moment of Snoopy cooking a dinner for his beloved master Charlie Brown? I am not sure. Really, I believe that giving thanks is easy to do once a year in a general way. Let's face it, this act of blessing, food and outspoken gratitude is still a general kind of non-committal "Thank You" that most of the time does not ask for anything in return.

Giving Thanks is the Easy Part!! When giving thanks, is the expected response to a blessing, a financial bouquet, a helping hand or a simple kind gesture, we the giver can forget why and what we are offering in the true act of charity. Since the time I made my first arts-n-craft turkey out of tissue paper in grade school I realized that thank you came easier than the response to my own gesture of kindness. Why is there only one expected response for the recipient and an array of answers in return? Most of us are embarrassed by the humble acknowledgement that comes in return to our generosity. We want to keep it non-committal. We want it to be more an act of the "expected" thing to do in the given situation. So, we answer somewhat flippant: "Ah it was nothing"; "Don't mention it"; "you would have done the same" or any other way that lessens the gift so to lessen the need to do it again. The proper response to "Thank you" is "You are Welcome." The word welcome is more meaningful and life changing than the gift itself! It is more gracious than the thank you offered by the



recipient. Welcome means you are invited to this gift as if it is already yours!! It means that whatever I have is yours and not only my charity but, you are invited to share my life, share my faith, hope, and love of God who is the source of my kindness and generosity. Your welcome is your way to say to someone this gift I give is just a token of my desire to walk with you, pray with you, and share with you the path of life.

God's invitation is more than His Blessings - I wonder how inviting the first "thanksgiving" was between the Pilgrims and Indians at Plymouth Rock? I am sure that they were thankful that they could share food that autumn day and maybe even enjoy each other's company. Perhaps they had high hopes to learn from each other a way to survive difficult times. I wonder if the response of the giver was "You're Welcome." I am sure it was much less committal than a "You're Welcome" on either party. I mean, let's face it, tolerance is different than peace and a token gift is less than a desire to share sacred and precious land. I mean... the Indians were not welcoming the Pilgrims to live side by side with them or the Pilgrims were not willing to do the same.

Taking the Next Step!

Last week you received a letter from me asking for you to join me in the increase offertory program that is sponsored by the Diocese. The letter shared with you our needs and the great gift you can give as "thanksGIVING" this year. Below is a further meditation on the reason to make a "true" sacrificial gift."

"OFFER TO GOD A SACRIFICE OF THANKSGIVING AND PRAISE"

In Saint Matthew's Gospel (chapter 21) we hear of Jesus becoming discontent of heart as He enters into His Father's House (the temple) to find the buying and selling of animals for sacrifice. The people had lost **their focus** on what sacrifice meant. It was to be an offering of love to God for His Goodness and a desire to be forgiven of their sinfulness. But now it was a market place of convenience, one stop shopping if you will, making it impersonal and for many a chance to earn a

profit. Jesus proclaims this practice as one of making the temple a "market place" and a "Den of Thieves". Jesus' anger is justified for His Father's house was to be a place of Worship and Praise not meaningless bargaining.

These efforts of burnt offerings and acts of sacrifice were **not redemptive**. They could not please God for the animals themselves could not save one from sin. Jesus knows that he will become the **sacrifice**; the **temple**; and the **priest** who will offer the **only** sacrifice that matters...himself on the cross.

We today realize a redemptive sacrifice has been offered on our behalf...we participate in that very sacrifice at the Holy Mass. So, it is not in "winning favor" with God that we make our offering each week that accompanies the bread and wine in the procession. No, our sacrifice is one of **Thanksgiving and Praise** for what we have already received (redemption) and what we continue to receive (grace and mercy) through the Sacraments and the teachings of the Church.

"Pay your sacrifice of thanksgiving to God and render him your votive offerings Call on me in the day of distress. I will free you and you shall honor me." (Psalm 50)

Traditionally the practice of tithing (giving of 10% of one's wealth to God) was the offering of "first fruits" of God's goodness given to man and not the surplus which one could do without. The spiritual act of tithing is to give as a sign of thanksgiving and devotion to God who has given all that we need now and eternally in heaven. No bargaining chip... no down payment... no winning favor...just an act of love!!!

This year's increased offertory discernment should take into consideration the disposition of the above quote from Psalm 50. Those who show true thanksgiving and devotion in a sacrificial way will, by God's Grace, also know how to receive from Him what is needed in the day of distress (hour of death) and be freed from selfishness that binds one to the worldly kingdom and come to share in the heavenly one!

TAKING THE NEXT STEP

Over the past several years we have been trying to gently move ourselves to the spirit of tithing and making a spiritual commitment of supporting the parish (via weekly offering) by offering 5% of our "first fruits" to the parish and the other 5% to our desirable charities and works of the Church. Taking the next step allows us **to evaluate** where we are in the giving process and to discern what step we can make this coming year to come even closer to our personal commitment of tithing.



DIOCESAN ASSESSMENTS

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION PARISH - FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2022 - JUNE 30, 2023

The diocesan assessments for the fiscal year 2022-2023 totaled **\$416,752.04**. Following is a description of these assessments and the cost of each.

<u>CATHOLIC ACCENT</u>: The Catholic Accent, our diocesan newspaper, is published biweekly at a cost of \$12.75 per annual subscription. This publication contains a variety of world, national and local news designed to educate, entertain and inform. The parishes are assessed on a calculated total of the number of subscribers or 80% of parish households, whichever is greater. **Our total cost for fiscal 2022-2023 was \$27,203.04**. **Your use of the Catholic Accent envelope in your offertory packet helped to defray that cost by \$4,742.30**. Thank you for your ongoing support of this publication.

HOSPITAL MINISTRY: The Hospital Ministry is a chaplain program at the hospitals located within the Diocese of Greensburg. These chaplains visit with and bring the sacraments to parishioners confined to the area hospitals. This program is of great assistance to parish priests who, due to their many parish obligations, cannot always visit their hospitalized parishioners. The total cost of this program is allocated to all diocesan parishes based on the number of individuals in each parish. For fiscal 2022-2023 our total cost was \$30,681.24.

<u>EDUCATION ASSESSMENT</u>: The Education Assessment is designed to assist the Catholic elementary and high schools within the Diocese of Greensburg. The assessment is based upon a percentage of parish assessable income at 13.8%, 11.5% or 3%, depending on the parish's geographic location relative to the schools. Assessable income consists of all of the prior year ordinary and extraordinary income of the parish. Immaculate Conception Parish falls into the 13.8% geographic category. **The parish assessment for fiscal 2022-2023 was \$195.041.28.**

<u>IODG (Insurance of the Diocese of Greensburg)</u>: This assessment is similar in design to one's homeowners and vehicle insurance. The diocese investigates and chooses the best insurance plan to cover all diocesan and parish buildings, contents, vehicles, other property, and workers compensation. For Immaculate Conception Parish this would include not only the parish but Immaculate Conception Cemetery as well. For fiscal 2022-2023 our IODG costs were \$50,758.68.

<u>CATHEDRATICUM</u> (<u>Diocesan Assessment (tax</u>): This assessment is designed to assist the diocese with all of the diocesan workings such as staffing and operational costs. The parish cost is 8% of all prior year ordinary and extraordinary income. **The parish assessment for fiscal 2022-2023 was \$113,067.44**

July 2022 to June 2023—Diocesan Collections

The Catholic University and Catholic Schools: \$586.00

To support Catholic education, both locally and nationally.

Seminarian and Clergy Formation: \$865.00

To support our Seminarian and Clergy formation taken the last Sunday in September.

Retired Religious & Diocesan Retired Priests: \$1,542.00

Diocesan collection taken the first Sunday in November for retired religious and retired diocesan Priests.

World Mission Sunday: \$1,297.50

Funds are used to support the work of foreign missions throughout the world with training of priests and catechists.

Diocesan Poverty Relief Fund & Catholic Relief Services: \$1,740.00

Contributions to the collection are divided equally. The Diocesan Poverty Relief Fund helps those in need here in Southwestern Pennsylvania. Catholic Relief Services helps those in need on an international basis.

Children/Family Services Appeal: \$2,173.30

This collection supports the work of Catholic Charities throughout the four counties of the Diocese of Greensburg.

Communication Media: \$612.00

Supports our local communication efforts and the collective communication work of the bishops as well as other national projects in the United States and around the world.

Mission Cooperative: \$2,488.15.

Catholic organizations from around the world are assigned to parishes within the United States to present the nature of their mission and to seek funds to continue their humanitarian work. In November 2022 our Mission Cooperative was the Diocese of Gallup.

Home Missions of the Americas: \$1,356.00

This collection funds the many mission dioceses in the United States & its territories by providing care for the sick, religious education and by training people with skills to help themselves.

Peter's Pence/Holy See: \$851.00

Donations to Peter's Pence are used to fund emergency relief assistance to people around the world suffering from war, oppression & natural disasters. Holy See donations help to support operational expenses.

Eastern Europe: \$915.00

Funds from this collection supports the work of the church in Central & Eastern Europe by aiding seminaries, social services, youth ministry, pastoral centers, church construction and renovation.
