

Father Alvin Cabungcal 1969 - 2024

Father Alvin E. Cabungcal, a former international priest that served as a parochial vicar at Immaculate Conception, died at the age of 54 in Lucban, Quezon, Philippines.

Born on November 3, 1969, Father Alvin attended seminary at St. Alphonse School of Theology in Isabang, Lucena City, Philippines. He was ordained to the priesthood on September 3, 1996 by Bishop Ruben T. Profugo.

Father Alvin came to us as a parochial vicar as one of the first Filipino priests to serve in the diocese. It was such a privilege to serve and share our wonderful parish with him. His jovial spirit was infectious and inviting. Many of you became close with him in the short time he was stationed here on the corner. I chose the picture above to depict how

I saw his priestly ministry. He was a servant to me and to all of us! He served the sick and the dying as well as our children teaching both in the parish and at Queen of Angels. He always was present at all the parish events: Burger Bash, Fish Fries, Christian Mothers and the Men and Womens groups! I was blessed and grateful to have served and shared my priestly ministry with him!

Rest in Peace my friend for you were a good and faithful servant to Christ our High Priest!



Communion Under Both Species!


Bishop Kulick: "I write to inform you that, upon consultation with the Diocesan Priest Council, Bishop Kulick has decided that the option for the faithful to receive Holy Communion under both species will be restored in the Diocese of Greensburg. Beginning February 17/18, 2024, the First Sunday of Lent, it will be permissible for the faithful to be provided the option of also receiving the Precious Blood when partaking of Holy Communion. I share this news with you now, in order that you may consider any actions that are necessary to restore this practice in your parish."





FIRST READING 1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you, "Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am, "he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

GOSPEL READING

John 1:35-42

He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" - which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" – which is translated Peter.


