FIRST SATURDAY ANOINTING MASS AT SAINT ELIZABETH ANN SETON DRAWS OVER 100 SEEKING THE GREAT SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK!



Father Louiegene and I were blessed to have administered the Sacrament of Anointing of the sick to over 100 people from the Norwin Catholic Community at the most recent "Anointing Mass"! The numbers attending the Mass has been growing and the understanding of the value of being anointed for a variety of illness is becoming a true blessing to the sick. Yes, the Church preserves this sacrament for "grave illness" and one who is not sick should not receive the sacrament. BUT the definition of grave illness (see below) is a relative term. "Grave" is not the same as a "Death Pending" situation but conflicts the mind, body and soul in a way that one cannot function fully without the serious temptations of despair that Satan loves to inflict. This includes suffering from anxiety and fear as well as chronic health and physical amenities.

NOTE: This Mass should not be viewed as a "HEALING MASS" but an "Anointing Mass."

Many priests have "Healing Masses" where they lay hands on the sick and invoke the "slaying power" of the Holy Spirit to heal. These special Masses with these gifted

Holy Priest are not offering the Sacrament which impowers every priest through his ordination. With the Sacrament there is no greater calling of the Holy Spirit nor greater affect that the sick can receive.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

<u>Illness and suffering</u> have always been among the gravest problems confronted in human life. In illness, man experiences his powerlessness, his limitations, and his finitude. Every illness can make us glimpse death. Illness can lead to **anguish**, **self-absorption**, sometimes even **despair** and revolt against God. It can also make a person more mature, helping him discern in his life what is not essential so that he can turn toward that which is. Very often illness provokes a search for God and a return to him. <u>Jesus' actions in His ministry</u> - Because Christ's compassion toward the sick and his many healings of every kind of infirmity are a resplendent sign that "God has visited his people" and that the Kingdom of God is close at hand is the reason for this Sacrament to be used often for the people of God! Jesus has the power not only to heal, but also to forgive sins; he has come to heal the whole man, soul and body; he is the physician the sick has need of. His compassion toward all who suffer goes so far that he identifies himself with them: "I was sick and you visited me "His preferential love for the sick has not ceased through the centuries to draw the very special attention of Christians toward all those who suffer in body and soul. It is the source of tireless efforts to comfort them.

According to Sacred Scripture:

The apostolic Church has its own rite for the sick, attested to by St. James: "Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders [presbyters] of the Church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven." 123 Tradition has recognized in this rite one of the seven sacraments.

The Anointing of the Sick "is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived." This is true for emotional stress and fear as well.
