PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

Here is a personal reflection by Robert Berry II that you may find a welcoming challenging:

For many of us, the idea of making Daily Mass is a luxurious thought. We so quickly dismiss the idea without truly contemplating the real benefits of 'sacrificing' a portion of our day. I was one of those people... until I started going to Daily Mass.



30 Minutes of Peace

Whether you're a stay-athome parent or a 9-to-5er, a college student or a retired veteran, no matter your stage in life, you could probably use an extra half hour each day to recharge. Many of us accomplish this with a mid-day nap or a lunch break at work, but what better way to spend our (limited) free time than to pay a visit to the nearby parish? Our lives are noisy and not because they always have to be, but because we have been conditioned to need constant stimulation. Our phones, iPads, and televisions usually win the battle for our eyes at the dinner table and just about everywhere else. Even when we 'get a break' we hardly ever take a moment to just unplug. Go to Mass and leave your phone in the car, you won't regret it.

Note: The next Five weeks I will share with you one of the five reasons to attend daily Mass, this way you can challenge yourself to make it part oi your Lent!

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

"The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath"

There are certain passages in Sacred Scripture, and even in our devotional prayers that sometimes I am not really sure what is being said and how to interpret them. Saint John's Gospel for instance can be very challenging when he shares the rhetoric of his relationship with the Father in heaven. I am sure you recall the conclusion of this passage is "No one can come to the father except through me." We will discuss this at a later date...

But today what does it mean that the Sabbath was made for Man?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church #2173 states: The gospel reports many incidents when Jesus was accused of violating the sabbath law. But Jesus never fails to respect the holiness of this day. He gives this law its authentic and authoritative interpretation:

"The sabbath was made for man, not man for the sabbath." With compassion, Christ declares the Sabbath for DOING GOOD rather than harm, for saving life rather than killing. The Sabbath is the day of the Lord of mercies and a day to honor God.

In essence, the Sabbath, the day of reflection on all that is "good" in God's creation, was made for man to praise God by "recreating it with the same love and goodness of God".

So, when Jesus "heals" and "forgives sins" on the Sabbath He was honoring man for which the day that was made for him gives "man" rest/peace. Imagine the man with the shriveled hand and the paralyzed man who comes to temple that day to honor God, even in their brokenness, receives the gift of Sabbath to be made whole and new just like the first man Adam in creation!

The Jews got caught up in trying to honor the Sabbath by not doing any such "work" and failed instead to do any good at all. Jesus challenges us to see that the new first day of the week (Sunday) is the beginning of the new creation in the resurrection!

For you and me we look at Sundays not as a day of rest to honor God, but to act in His name of recreating the face of the earth with acts of charity and mercy! So, make Sunday a day for yourself:

Rest! Do not do the things of the world that stress you out!

- No laborious work
- No running to the store
- No running kids to sporting events

Raise up your heart, mind and Soul to God at Sacred Mass!

- Take time to read the Scriptures that will be used at Mass
- Receive Communion with full intent to be transformed
- Take seriously the mission of the homily

Family or quiet time

- Share in a meal with your family
- End your day in quiet Thanksgiving




"Stay Close to God and His Church" Robert J. Moineau (1926-2018)

Note: It has been 6 years this month since my Father was granted His eternal reward. Time goes fast and thank God for eternity for time will never end when we are reunited with our loved ones in heaven. I think of my father more than ever as I go through chemotherapy and the side effect of losing my hair. When I look in the mirror I don't see me any more but I see a reflection of my father! The baldness and blue eyes smile back at me. I stare into the mirror and say "Hello Dad... I miss you and please help me today to accept this cross." The only comfort I have in my new appearance is that it reminds me of him and how he never faltered in faith and devotion. What follows is a reflection that I posted six years ago in the Pastor's Notes at the time of his death. I share them again

today to answer the questions that I get so often about my most recent battle with Cancer: "How are you managing?" And the answer is simple: "I stay close to God and His Church." There with Him and the Mass there is no cancer... just the fullness of life lived and to come. Thanks Dad!

I have many fond memories of my father and I am blessed to have shared them over the period of my lifetime. As I grew in age, the relationship changed and so did my needs from a loving father. The one thing that never changed was the simplicity of spiritual advice and counsel: "Stay close to God and His Church." This counsel did not come so much in words or a mantra that was spoken to me before bed nor as I went off to school. When going out for the night with friends, it was more implicit and known in the loving way he lived his life grounded in prayer and action. The only thing my father loved more than his family was God and the Church He founded on earth. His love of family was predicated on the belief of eternal life and the goal and purpose of succeeding to share (eternally) with us in heaven. There was only one set of rules governing his life. Focused and determined that a life dedicated to prayerful intercession, faithful reception of the sacraments and attendance of Sacred Mass would provide the strength to tackle the challenges of "earthly" life.



Those challenges began early (age 16) when his father died and left him and his mother to fend for themselves. I cannot imagine how different my life would have been if I was dealt the same fate. But he stayed close to God and his Church traveling by train from Ford City to Natrona to attend Catholic High School. Then WWII became a reality for the United States after Pearl Harbor and my father left high school early and joined the Navy. Giving four of the best years of his life, he completed his assigned duties while stationed at Pearl Harbor. Scared and unsure of what would come of his participation in the war he stayed close to God and His Church. While on the base, he served (knowing his Latin) daily Mass for the Chaplin and played the organ at the Sunday Mass. He began a daily novena to Saint

Anthony of Padua with the request to keep him safe during his time of service. He also promised that he would continue that novena (daily) for the rest of his life. I remember seeing the tattered booklet among his prayers as a boy...and after many a copy and publication I saw it at his bedside in the hour of his death. Returning from the war, like the other men of the greatest generation, he finished his high school degree, went to night school and obtained a job. He married and raised four children in a home one mile from the church and at every turn, over the course of his life, he was faithful to God and His Church.

Saint Anthony would be joined with three new Saints of favoritism in early 1970's. Going through a series of illnesses and health challenges he turned to the American saints while they were on the way to canonization: John Neumann, Elizabeth Ann Seton and Junipero Serra. Health issues resolved through the intercession of Saint John and Saint Elizabeth was responded to with gratitude and pilgrimages to their shrines over the years. My dad's Serra club prayed for priestly vocations every meeting via the intercession of Junipero Serra. Just recently Junipero Serra was canonized a Saint by Pope Francis. I am sure that my father felt that my becoming a priest could have been used as one of the two necessary miracles for his canonization! My father's faithfulness to his daily rosary, First Saturday devotions and the Christmas novena was sure signs that the BVM always held top spot as an intercessor for him and his family.

So staying close to God and His Church was good advice and a great way to live as a Catholic. This lesson taken to heart led to all four of his children remaining faithful practicing Catholics. I treasure the advice and know that it is the root of my faith/practice and priesthood to this day. I thank God for such a strong and focused faith-filled father! May his soul and all the souls of the faithful departed through the purgative love of Jesus Christ be made perfect in heaven as they await the resurrection of the body.
