

### 2. Moves the Focus AWAY from Ourselves

Our busy schedules, our bills, our lives are always overrun with our problems. Going to Mass, and making it a daily habit, causes us to focus on something else for one half hour and it's not something that needs fixing or something we need to work for, it's just the greatest act of worship man could experience this side of heaven. Christ invites us to receive Him in this sacrifice as often as we are able: it is precisely why Christ makes himself continually available in the sacrifice of the Mass. # What Does That Mean?? WHEN MARRIAGE IS VALID IN THE "EYES" OF THE CHURCH

**Note:** Questions arise when one is asked to be a sponsor to a child at Baptism or Confirmation and are not permitted based on and invalid

marriage. So what is considered a "valid" marriage according to the Church? It is obviously an important issue since all Catholics, by their Baptism, are bound to Church Law. I hope that the following will be helpful.

CAUTION TO PARENTS OF THOSE TO BE BAPTISED AND CONFIRMNED: Make sure that the person and persons you choose to be a god parent or sponsor at Confirmation CAN, by Church Law fulfill the requirements. They must be a practicing Catholic and if married, it must be Valid based on the above stipulations.... It can be embarrassing if you ask someone who will not be permitted to stand for your child.

<u>VALIDITY OF SACRAMENT DEPENDS ON PROPER FORM AND MATTER</u> - In order for a sacrament to be valid, and have an efficacious effect, the proper form and matter must exist. To have valid Eucharist, the proper form is the words of consecration over the proper matter (unleavened bread and wine) by an ordained priest within the context of the Mass. If all or one is lacking it is not a valid Eucharist. For instance, if an non-ordained Catholic priest utters the words of consecration over the proper matter, it is invalid. Again, if a priest substitutes cracker for bread and grape drink for wine... it is not a valid Eucharist. Since Marriage is a sacrament, it is only valid if the proper *Form* and *Matter* is present.

<u>PROPER FORM</u>—The proper *Form* for marriage is for the consent and marriage vows to be received in the presence of the proper pastor within the confines of a consecrated Church building. Special dispensations can be obtained from proper *Form* with permission from the Bishop. Example: One can receive permission for a wedding to take place in a Christian Church by a Christian minister, if permission is granted by the Bishop.

<u>PROPER MATTER</u> - The proper *Matter* in marriage is based on intention and disposition of those who are to be bound by the proper *Form*.

There are three *intentions* that are necessary to be pledged by those desiring marriage:


- That "both" are entering the marriage freely, without reservation, to give themselves to each other in marriage.
- 2) That they will be faithful to each other as man and wife for the rest of their lives.
- 3) that they will accept children lovingly from God and bring them up according to the Law of Christ and His Church.

One must also be properly *disposed*, (free) to enter into the sacrament of marriage as well as professing the above intentions. They must first fulfill all the prerequisites required in preparation prior to the marriage as dictated by the Diocese in which they seek to receive marriage. They must be a practicing baptized Catholic, who has never been married, nor have made vows to a religious order, nor ordained a priest. They must also prove to be of sound mind, capable mentally and emotionally, to make such a commitment.

<u>NECESSITY OF CONTACTING LOCAL PASTOR/PRIEST</u> - In planning a wedding the Church must be contacted at least six months in advance so the priest can determine if you are prepared and can freely enter into the Sacrament. The Church does not refuse marriage to anyone who is properly disposed and desires the Sacrament with the proper intentions under the proper form. The Church is however responsible to make sure that the couple is free of impediments.





## ANGEL'S CORNER QUEEN OF ANGELS CATHOLIC SCHOOL






