

## The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

On the First Sunday of Lent, the people of the Diocese of Greensburg gather with Bishop Kulick and those seeking either Baptism or full Communion with the Church to celebrate another step on the journey. Today we send Laci Kingerski, seeking Baptism and to be counted as a member of "The Elect" and Tyler Laughery, John Scholl, and Kristie Shaffer seeking full Communion with the Catholic Church to participate in the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion with Bishop Kulick. In these Rites, "the Church makes its 'election,' that is, the choice and admission of those catechumens who have the dispositions that make them fit to take part...in the sacraments of initiation" (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults [RCIA], 119). In addition, those baptized Christians who seek to "complete their Christian formation and become fully integrated into the community..." (RCIA, 410) come before the bishop who, on behalf of the Church, officially recognizes their "desire to have a place at Christ's Eucharistic table" (RCIA, 454).

All will then enter into a period of "Purification and Enlightenment" during Lent as they continue their journey to the Easter Vigil.

#### PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

#### Here is a personal reflection by Robert Berry II that you may find welcoming and challenging:

For many of us, the idea of making Daily Mass is a luxurious thought. We so quickly dismiss the idea without truly contemplating the real benefits of 'sacrificing' a portion of our day. I was one of those people...until I started going to Daily Mass.



Dedicated Time for Prayer
Pray daily. Sounds simple
enough but give it a try. In
an ideal world I would say
that we all aspire to pray
regularly, but how often do
we remember? The
number one cause of
neglected

prayer isn't the busyness of life (that's the 2nd cause), it's actually the 'lack of response' most of us feel as though we suffer from. More people actually avoid prayer altogether because they don't believe it actually works. Daily Mass gives us ample opportunity to restructure our prayer life.

So, Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. –

John 6:53-56

### What Does That Mean??

#### "Lead us Not into Temptation"

When Pope Francis decided that the words of the "Our Father" should be changed from "lead us not into temptation" to "Do not let us fall into temptation" he not only caused a stir but he was misrepresenting the love of God our Father in heaven!

Many COULD say, as the Pope suggests, that God would not lead His children into temptation but that is something that SATAN would do to steal souls. But, according to sacred scripture and tradition, the Pope is wrong on this translation and intention of God as Jesus taught us to pray! Let me explain it in this way:

"TO BE LEAD INTO TEMPTATION MEANS TO BE LEAD INTO A SITUATION OF WHERE GRACE IS SUFFICIENT FOR ALL THOSE WHO CHOOSE IT OVER THE WEAKNESS OF THE FLESH!

#### Example #1 Old testament - Yahweh delivers King Saul into David's hands

While King Saul was pursuing (King) David with three thousand men in order to kill him, Yahweh lead David to find him indisposed and the proper opportunity to kill him! The Kings men waited outside the cave while Saul relieved himself and David and his guard snuck past to find Saul alone and vulnerable. David's men said to him "TODAY YAHWEH HAS DELIVERED SAUL INTO YOUR HANDS TO DO WHATEVER IT IS YOU WISH TO DO WITH HIM." This is a situation that God certainly led someone into temptation! David could have killed Saul at that moment and became King of the people of Israel. No greater temptation for a man who saw only good in taking the life of the evil king! David chose, through the grace that was given by God, to do what was RIGHTEOUS and spared him his life!

#### Example #2 - Jesus was lead into the desert to be tempted

"Then Jesus was led, by the Spirit into the desert to be TEMPTED by Satan." (Matthew 4:1) The scriptures are not inaccurate! The Spirit (Holy) certainly compromised the human Nature of Jesus, weakened by fasting for 40 days, to fall to the cunning of Satan! But of course, the situation was one of Grace that was sufficient for Jesus to choose righteousness over the lure of the worldly powers! Jesus felt the same presence of evil and was compromised again in the Agony of the Garden when he cried out "let this hour pass me!" The key that the Holy Father Pope Francis is missing is what we pray: "lead us not into temptation BUT deliver us from evil!" IT IS A CHOICE THAT WE ARE ASKING FOR THE GRACE IN A SITUATION TO NOT FALTER BY RESPONDING TO HIS GRACE!

If the situation causes us to sin, then we fell to the temptation that God put us in to choose correctly. If we do not sin, then the temptation gave us an opportunity to be righteous before Him THROUGH HIS GRACE!!!

MY MOM, not the pope universal, but in our house, always said: Every situation is both an occasion of sin (temptation) or an occasion of Love (Grace). It is your choice! And she well knowingly lead me into those situations when I asked, to take the car to attend a party and to return before my curfew time. Moment of sin or Grace? Choosing was the temptation to be selfish, or loving to God and parents!

David was lead to temptation and he chose the Lord! Jesus was led into temptation to teach us that God the Father's Grace is sufficient and free to choose! I know that my journey of cancer has been a temptation in the wilderness at times. A chance to curse God and die, as it was suggested to Job! But thank you Father in heaven for this temptation, for it has given me the freedom to choose your Grace which has been sufficient, and has let my soul to be the "gold that is tested in fire" to be sanctified in Grace! Thank you Father for loving us enough to have a chance to be made perfect!

#### PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

#### FAST + PRAYER = ALMSGIVING

The disciplines of Lent are to be observed as supererogation. They are not meant to be simply three sacrifices we do for 40 days and put them away again until next Lent. This practice enhances our awareness of the need for God's goodness to penetrate the downtrodden and those in most need around us...those in need of God's mercy. Giving alms to the poor, offering a generous donation to DLA or supporting the weekly collection can be an act of obligation and duty. However, when these gifts are prepared with fasting and prayer, it changes these acts into redemptive Grace.





Let's meditate on the words of Saint Gregory:

Recognize to whom you owe the fact that you exist, that you breathe, that you understand, that you are wise, and, above all, that you know God and hope for the kingdom of heaven and the vision of glory, not darkly as in a mirror, but then with greater fullness and purity, you have been made a son of God, co-heir with Christ. Where did you get all this, and from whom?

Let me turn to what is of less importance: the visible world around us. What benefactor has enabled you to look out upon the beauty of the sky, the sun in its course, the circle of the moon, the countless number of stars, with the harmony and order that are theirs, like the music of a harp? Who has blessed you with rain, with the art of spousal love, with different kinds of food, with the arts, with houses, with laws, with states, with a life of humanity and culture, with friendship and the easy familiarity of kinship?

Who has given you dominion over animals, those that are tame and those that provide you with food? Who has made you lord and master of everything on earth? In short, who has endowed you with all that makes man superior to all other living creatures? Is it not God who asks you now in your turn to show yourself generous about all other creatures and for the sake of all other creatures? Because we have received from him this one thing only, our generosity? Though he is God and Lord he is not afraid to be known as our Father. Shall we for our part repudiate those who are our friends and family?




My dear friends let us never allow ourselves to misuse what has been given us by God's gift. If we do, we shall hear Saint Peter say: Be ashamed of yourselves for holding on to what belongs to someone else. Resolve to imitate God's justice, and not one will be poor. Let us not labor to heap up and hoard riches while others remain in need.

Let us put into practice the supreme and primary law of God. He sends down rain on just and sinful alike, and causes the sun to rise on all with distinction. To all earth's creatures he has given the broad earth, the springs, the rivers and the forest. He has given the air to the birds, and the waters to those who live in the waters. He has given abundantly to all the basic needs of life not as a private possession, not restricted by law, not divided by boundaries, but as common to all, ample and in rich measure. His gifts are not deficient in any way, because he wanted to give equality of blessing to equality of worth, and to show the abundance of his generosity.

#### In Conclusion

In fasting we deprive ourselves of what is readily available so we are made aware of others hunger for food, companionship and love. When we take this feeling to prayer, we can personalize the needs of others as we share in this sense of emptiness. The result of our fasting and prayer then becomes the desire to give alms not as a sacrifice but as sharing in the bountiful gifts God bestows upon us in our lives.

We see more clearly the call to love our enemies, do good, share freely, and ask for nothing in return so that we may be true sons of our Father, who, through our generosity makes His sun shine on the good and the



bad, and sends His rain upon honest and dishonest men alike. This reality burns a desire into our hearts to be compassionate as the Father is compassionate.
