

Anything left in the cemetery past March 3, as a courtesy to you, will be discarded by cemetery staff.





PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

Here is a personal reflection by Robert Berry II that you may find welcoming and challenging:

For many of us, the idea of making Daily Mass is a luxurious thought. We so quickly dismiss the idea without truly contemplating the real benefits of 'sacrificing' a portion of our day. I was one of those people...until I started going to Daily Mass.



Jesus

I feel like I don't have to write a great deal here. This one is obvious. In fact, this reason is infinitely more important than the previous four. If you, for no other reason, choose to go to Daily Mass, let it be for the genuine encounter with Christ, And I don't mean genuine as some sort of euphemism, you will LITERALLY encounter Christ in the Mass. Your flesh and His will unite in a way unachievable anywhere else in our existence.



What Does That Mean??

Proper Burial of the Cremains of a Loved One

Since Cremation has become more popular in recent years there is some concern on how a family member might view cremains. Some feel that it is okay to display them on the fireplace mantle or even split up the cremains and make pendants out of them. While others desire to hold onto the cremains

until their own passing and have them buried with them sometime in the future. The confusion starts with the fact that the cremains are "given" to the family without suggestion of burial. No fault of many, they are making decisions based on their own understanding of the cremated remains of a baptized person. So the answer that follows is posted here usually 4 times a year to clarify and guide families when they chose cremation over the traditional practice of a bodily burial.

CREMATION PERMITTED WITH PROPER INTERMENT

"In sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to Almighty God our brother John and we commit his body to the ground: earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust. The Lord Bless him and keep him and be gracious to him, the Lord lift up his countenance upon him and give him peace". (Funeral Rite: 219-B)

This prayer of committal brings about the closure that is necessary for those who grieve the physical death of their beloved! The prayer represents the reality that from which we were created we return. The proper interment assures us of God's watching eye and blessing until He raises us up again in the Resurrection. Whether we inter the body or cremains it is our sure and certain hope that the baptized belong to Christ and sacredness of the tomb and grave must be emphasized.

The proper interment of the body has never been an issue but since cremation has become a more common practice questions and concerns have arisen. In order that all may understand the Church's position I found it necessary to share the following with you.

Principles Regarding Cremation:

Reverence for the Sacredness of the Human Body:

Because the human body is integral to the human person, it is difficult to think of a person apart from their body. "Thus, the Roman Catholic Church's reverence and care for the body grows out of a reverence and concern for the person whom the Church now commends to the care of God." The long standing practice of burying the body of the deceased in a grave or tomb *continues to be encouraged as a sign of Christian faith*. However, the Church does not forbid cremation as a means of disposition of the body, unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Church teaching.

PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

The Transfiguration of Jesus

The Second Sunday of Lent of the Church's Liturgy take us to the mountain with Jesus to see the glory of His

resurrection to give us hope of persevering in our Lenten journey to Easter Joy. Here is a brief look at the meaning of the incredible event!

The transfiguration is a highly symbolic story. Jesus took his inner circle of

apostles—Peter, James, and John—up a mountain, which in the Bible is a place of revelation, so it was clear something

important was about to happen.

These three apostles then saw Jesus as part of another important trio, completed with Moses and Elijah, symbols of Israelite tradition. As if that weren't spectacular enough, the voice of God itself made an appearance, uttering two thundering phrases: "This is my Son" and "Listen to him." Unfortunately, none of the apostles' reactions showed that they understood what had just happened. First of all, they were half asleep when the whole thing started—not the last time that would

happen at a key moment. They were also terrified to the point of talking nonsense about building shelters for the holy

figures. Then on the way down they started an off topic debate about the resurrection and Eliiah.

What the apostles didn't grasp right away was the significance of the fact that Moses and Elijah were "talking with" Jesus. This sacred conversation identified Jesus with the law and the prophets. It showed how Jesus had the same authority as these two pillars of Israel's tradition and how that authority came from the same God. To leave no doubt, God's voice drove home the point with words heard at an earlier affirmation of Jesus' status, his baptism: "This is my son, the beloved" (Matt. 3:17).

What the apostles also didn't get at first was that they couldn't stay on the

mountain. One can sympathize with their desire for such a wondrous break from the difficult path of discipleship. Down the mountain and back to that task, however, they had to go.

The Gospel of Luke adds a delicious detail: Moses and Elijah had been speaking with Jesus "of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem." His exodus? That loaded word points back to the sometimes arduous journey of following Jesus, and that's what the transfiguration is about. It's wonderful to find inspiration in a shining vision of Jesus, but the message to the church then and now is that witnessing glory is one thing, following is another. After the vision is over, you look up and see, as the apostles did, "Jesus only," and you realize that, to get to the further glory of eternal life, you have to follow him to the cross.

Preference for the Presence of the Body:



The body of a deceased loved one forcefully brings to mind the mystery of life and death. As Christians, the body of the deceased speaks also to our belief that we are destined for future glory at the resurrection of the dead. Therefore "the Church *clearly prefers and urges* that the body of the deceased be present for its funeral rites, since the presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in its rites."

Funeral Rites:

When cremation is chosen, the Church prefers that the body be cremated after the funeral, thus allowing for the presence of the body at the Funeral Mass. When circumstances require it, however, cremation and committal may take place even before the Funeral liturgy. All the usual rites which are celebrated in the presence of the body of the deceased may also be celebrated in the presence of the cremated remains.

The primary symbols of the Roman Catholic funeral liturgy are retained even when the funeral liturgy is celebrated in the presence of the cremated remains. The *cremains must be treated with the same dignity and respect as the body*. They may be carried in procession and/or placed on a table where the coffin normally would be. The Paschal Candle and sprinkling with holy water are primary symbols of baptism and should be used during the Funeral Mass. However, the pall is not used.

Photographs and other mementos may be used at the vigil, but are not appropriate for the Mass.

Final Disposition and Memorialization of the Cremated Remains:

"Cremated remains may be buried in a grave, entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium or even buried at sea." The practice of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground is not permitted. Likewise, "keeping cremated remains in the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are not the reverent disposition that the Church requires." The principle of respect for the cremated remains of a deceased Christian mirrors the respect afforded their body. The body is always laid to rest with solemnity and dignity.

NOTE: Immaculate Conception Cemetery provides two ways that cremains can be properly interred with the same care as those who choose the burial of the body.

We have a beautiful cremation Garden with vaults to protect the cremains and we have our new Columbarium that can also be used as a place of interment.
