





What Does That Mean??

Sundays Don't Count During Lent

The period of prayer and fasting in preparation for Easter is 40 days long, but there are 46 days between Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent in the Roman Catholic Liturgical calendar, and Easter. So how are the 40 days of Lent calculated?

The answer takes us back to the earliest days of the Church. Christ's original disciples, who were Jewish, grew up with the idea that the Sabbath – the day of worship and rest – was Saturday, the seventh day of the week, since the account of creation in Genesis says that God rested on the seventh day.

Since all Sundays – and not simply Easter Sunday – were days to celebrate Christ's Resurrection, Christians were forbidden to fast and do other forms of penance on those days. Therefore, when the Church expanded the period of fasting and prayer in preparation for Easter from a few days to 40 days (to mirror Christ's fasting in the desert, before He began his public ministry), Sundays could not be included in the count.

Thus, in order for Lent to include 40 days on which fasting could occur, it had to be expanded to six full weeks (with six days of fasting in each week) plus four extra days – Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday that follow it. Six times six is thirty-six, plus four equals forty. Counting beginning with Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday is how we arrive at the 40 days of Lent!



SO, CAN I EAT CHOCOLATE ON SUNDAYS DURING LENT?

An age-old battle and question that has always haunted us Catholics who willingly make the sacrifice of "giving something up" for Lent. Sundays have come into questions because it is well known that if you count the days of Lent (including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday it adds to 46 days. The reason, also well known, is that Sundays are not a day of fast nor abstinence because we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ every Sunday. (As Stated above).


But Lent is Lent and it is not really a sacrifice to give up chocolate only to indulge upon it every Sunday afternoon. It seems to most that this is cheating...my mom would always say, yes, it is true that you can do or eat (as long as it is not sinful) what you "gave up" for Lent on Sunday but....Oh, the but...IT WOULD NOT KILL YOU TO DO SO, AS WELL, ON SUNDAY!!!

So how is one to reason theologically, as well as, practically, to not feel guilty to go ahead and enjoy a break from Lent on Sunday? I think that the answer is easily answered through the comparison to the three-fold ministry of our baptism for which we share with Jesus, the three temptations, and the three disciplines of Lent. In case you cannot remember them off by heart from past homilies and Lenten reflections I will state them here:

Jesus has a threefold ministry as Priest, Prophet and King. We share in this calling through our baptism. When Jesus went into the wilderness to be tempted in His human nature the Devil tempted Him to deny this call. Temptation is simply an invitation for a temporal solution to a Spiritual Challenge! Each temptation was a direct onslaught on one of these ministries. As Jesus overcomes these temptations, the Church in turn gives us the three disciplines of Lent: Prayer, fasting and almsgiving as the means to dispose ourselves better to receiving the invitations to fulfill them in our lives, as well.

PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

Here are the correlations:



Jesus as Prophet. The Devil tempts: "Turn these stones into Bread" Jesus responds: "Man does not live on bread alone but every word of God." Good answer Jesus! So in the call to a prophetic ministry we amp up the discipline of prayer so that through listening to the scriptures and God's voice in our hearts we have the food to feed others!

Jesus as King. The Devil tempts; "Bow down to me and I will give you all these kingdoms." Jesus says: "You shall have no God but God our Father in Heaven." Jesus now as king of the greatest kingdom cannot be replaced with an earthly one...sold nor bought is the

kingdom of God but is to be given away...even at the cost of one's life! This is the reason that we give alms to the poor and to the Church...to give the kingdom of God to those who are in most need of mercy.

Jesus as Priest. The Devil tempts: "Jump from the parapet and the angels will save you." Jesus responds: "They shall not tempt the Lord God." Jesus knows that his priestly ministry is a call to self-sacrifice and physical death... not a miraculous saving of his earthly life...this is His Father's will. So, to tempt the will of God for an easier way out is the true ministry of offering oneself to God. So, for us to fulfill our priestly ministry we must learn to sacrifice our temporal concerns and desire to be disposed to the will of the Father and the work of the Church. We fast and abstain from worldly pleasure in order to strengthen our resolve to do God's will above our own.

THIS IS THE REASON THAT WE CAN EAT CHOCOLATE - The sacrificial Jesus' priesthood is personified in his self-offering upon the cross. It is here that the completion and intention of the "Mass" is



fulfilled. The Last Supper priestly act is not "Finished" until Jesus breathes His Last upon the cross. We commemorate this every Friday and every day during lent through a "giving up of something" to share the gift.

ON SUNDAY, WE CELEBRATE THE RISEN LORD AND NOT THE CRUCIFIED LORD....so, we cannot fast or abstain. We must celebrate! Thus, we can eat our goodies...on Sundays during Lent.

NOTE: IT IS ONLY WHAT WE "FAST" FROM THAT IS PERMITTED A REPRIEVE BUT NEVER ALMSGIVING NOR PRAYER.

2024 Diocesan Lenten Appeal update as of March 1, 2024

- Our active participation in the 2024 DLA is 13.9%
- Total pledged is \$99,498.00, which is 64.4% of our Diocesan Target of \$154,568.00 and 38.3% of our combined Diocesan & Parish Target of \$260,000.00

For 2024 our parish goal is to raise \$260,000.00. This goal would help us in two ways: First to meet our Diocesan Target of \$154,568.00 which would be used on the diocesan level to support the international priests, seminarian's education, faith formation programs, Catholic Charities, and other diocesan ministries. Secondly, the remaining \$105,432.00 will be used here in our parish to aid the needy of our region with a \$10,000.00 donation to the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING 2 Chronicles 36:14-16,19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.



Creed




