What Does That Mean??

Preparing for your Confession: Venial and Mortal Sins

As our penance services approach many people ask what is the difference between a venial and mortal sin. What sins should or need to be confessed in the Sacrament of reconciliation.

In the <u>Catholic Church</u>, sins come in two basic types: mortal sins that imperil your soul and venial sins, which are less serious breaches of God's law. The Church believes that if you commit a mortal sin, you forfeit heaven and opt for hell by your own free will and actions.



Three conditions are necessary for mortal sin to exist:

- Grave Matter: The act itself is intrinsically evil and immoral.
 For example, murder, rape, incest, perjury, adultery, and so on are grave matter.
- Full Knowledge: The person

must know that what they're doing or planning to do is evil and immoral. For example, someone steals a postage stamp, thinking that it's only worth 64 cents. She knows that it's sinful, but if she's unaware that the stamp is rare and actually worth \$1,000, she's not guilty of mortal sin but of venial sin.

Deliberate Consent: The person must freely choose to commit the act or plan to do it. Someone forced
against her will doesn't commit a mortal sin. For example, a woman told she's giving a minor shock to
another person when in fact she is administering tortuous electrical jolts is not guilty of a mortal sin
(although she may feel guilty if she finds out the truth).



A mortal sin is the complete turning away from God and embracing something else in place. It's deadly to the life of grace, because it insults the honor of God and injures the soul of the sinner. Mortal sin is like a malignant tumor or a

critical injury the soul of the sinner. Mortal sin is like a malignant tumor or a critical injury that's lethal to the spiritual life.

Venial sins are any sins that meet one or two of the conditions needed for a mortal sin but do not fulfill all three at the same time, or they're minor violations of the moral law, such as giving an obscene gesture to another driver while in traffic.

Venial sin only weakens the soul with sickness but doesn't kill the grace within. Venial sins aren't deadly to the life of grace but, like minor infections in the body, if casually ignored and left untended, may deteriorate into a more serious condition. For example, someone who tells so-called *white lies* commits venial sin, but if he does it long enough, it's much easier for him to be tempted to tell a big lie later on that would in fact be a mortal sin, such as cheating on a test or falsifying resume's or financial income.

Mortal sins must be confessed in order to return to the state of Grace and community of the Church. One in essence is separated from God and therefore the privileges of participating in Holy Eucharist. Venial, to the best of our ability are also to be confessed in the Sacrament of Reconciliation so the Grace of the Sacrament can aid us in avoiding these near occasions of sin.

PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

CONFESSION PUTS YOU ON THE STRAIGHT AND NARROW

Penance, aka confession, is the sacrament of the forgiveness of sin. You can't beat it for convenience. It's available practically whenever. Tell a priest you want to go to confession and you'll get his attention. One bishop I know was cornered on an airplane. Another passenger figured out what was going on and asked if he could confess too. It must have been an interesting game of musical seats. An interesting



question for priests might be: Where was the strangest place you ever administered the sacrament of penance? The answers I've gathered include "in a sports bar, at a graduation party and on the golf course, walking up the fairway." Confession has benefits. Here are ten:

- 1. Confidentiality guaranteed. There's nothing like confessing your sins to someone guaranteed not to tell anyone else. Sometimes you need to talk in absolute confidence. Even under subpoena, a priest can't tell anyone what's said to him in confession. He can't even hint at it. Now that's confidentiality.
- 2. Housekeeping for the soul. It feels good to be able to start a clean life all over again. Like going into a sparkling living room in your home, it's nice when clutter is removed even if it's your own.
- 3. A balm for the desire for revenge. When you have been forgiven you can forgive others. If the perfect Jesus forgives me, who am I to want to avenge the slights in my life. Think: "Why did they promote him over me?" or "Mom played favorites!"
- 4. Low cost therapy. It's free, which makes it cheaper than a psychiatrist for dealing with guilt.
- 5. **Forced time to think.** Socrates said that the unexamined life is not worth living. To examine our lives and acknowledge failings marks the first step of making things right with God, others and ourselves. Life can be more worth living when you ponder the meaning of your own life.
- 6. **Contribution toward world peace**. "Gaudium et Spes", the Second Vatican Council's Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, said that the imbalances in the world that lead to war and tensions "are linked with that more basic imbalance which is rooted in the heart of man." Peace of soul leads to peace of heart leads to peace beyond oneself.
- 7. A better neighborhood. Confession leaves you feeling good about yourself, thereby cutting back the inclination to road rage and aggressive shopping cart driving. With the grace of the sacrament you're energized to, as Jesus said to the woman caught in adultery, "go and sin no more."
- 8. **Realistic self-perception**. Confession helps overcome arrogance when you have to admit you're as much of a sinner as anyone else. It helps build tolerance for others' perceived shortcomings.
- 9. One more benefit of being Catholic. There are lots of benefits, including a sense of community, liturgical rites to help us encounter God in prayer, and the wonderful sense of humanity exemplified in the saints, from Mary, the loving Mother of God, to Augustine, the exasperating son of Monica. The sacrament that leads us to inner peace is among the greatest benefits.



10. **Closeness to God**. Confession helps you realize that you have a close connection to God and receive his grace through the sacraments. What can be better than knowing God's on your team, or, to be less arrogant about it, that you are on God's.

Have I been sensitive to another's needs?

Can I be forgiving, Lord as you forgive?

Am I nursing a grudge?

Do I criticize and find fault?

Do I show positive acts of kindness?

Do I despise any group of people?

Do I discriminate against any group of people? Do I consider groups or individuals inferior to me?

Have I refused to help someone in need?








2024 Diocesan Lenten Appeal update as of March 9, 2024

- Our active participation in the 2024 DLA is **18.9**%
- Total pledged is \$142,746..00, which is 92.4% of our Diocesan Target of \$154,568.00 and 54.9% of our combined Diocesan & Parish Target of \$260,000.00

For 2024 our parish goal is to raise \$260,000.00. This goal would help us in two ways: First to meet our Diocesan Target of \$154,568.00 which would be used on the diocesan level to support the international priests, seminarian's education, faith formation programs, Catholic Charities, and other diocesan ministries. Secondly, the remaining \$105,432.00 will be used here in our parish to aid the needy of our region with a \$10,000.00 donation to the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. Our intention is remaining monies will be used towards new signage, terrazzo flooring in the church, church front doors, church outside masonry work, and upgrade information technology in the administration building. CREED


