

PASTOR'S NOTES

AMBASSODORS OF CHRIST Cleanse the Leper

Three weeks ago I began to discuss the call to Discipleship as Ambassadors of Christ based on MT 9:36-10:8 in my notes from the pastor. In this particular passage Jesus called His disciples to go to the **lost sheep of Israel**. Jesus gives us the "tools of the trade" to administer to the many needs of His flock. The last two weeks I shared with you our call to "cure the sick" and "raise the dead", this week we pause to consider our call to "Cleanse the Leper." (This is the fourth (4th) article from my 2007 five (5) part series).

THOSE DIRTY LEPERS

The leper was regarded as polluted. Leviticus says of him, "He shall remain unclean as long as he has the disease; he is unclean; he shall dwell alone in a habitation **outside** the camp" (Lev.13:46). 2Kgs.7:3-4 shows us the lepers who only in the day of deadly famine dared to enter into the city. 2Kgs.15:5 tells us how Azariah the king was smitten with leprosy, and to the day of his death he had to live in a lazar house, separated from all men. Not only were the "outcasts" from the community, they obviously were not welcomed to worship at the synagogue or the temple. The leper himself felt also the guilt of his plight in life and believed many times that it was his own fault or the fault of his parents that he had contracted the disease.

JESUS CLEANSES THE TEN LEPERS

The cleansing of the Ten lepers (Lk 17:12) was a sign of Jesus' ability to restore the <u>lost sheep of Israel</u> to health rewarding them with a clean start in their relationship with God. It is important that Jesus instructed "those made clean" to go to the temple and show themselves to the priest" so that they could gain permission to worship in the temple.

UNCLEAN AND FEELING UNCLEAN

Under the guidance of the Church, through the Authority given to the Apostles, we are aware of what deems us "unclean" in our relationship with Christ and His Church. We can easily pollute ourselves with venial sins and occasions of those sins that can lead to actions that destroys our relationship with Christ which alienates us from the Eucharistic Table. With true resolve and through the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation we can be "made clean" like the Ten that sought Jesus' mercy. There are, as well, many who just feel like lepers – unworthy and unwanted— because of their own personal situation in life. As an Ambassadors of Christ we must address these circumstances as well.



THE JOB AT HAND

The mission of "cleansing the leper" is two-fold.

- 1) Those who are unclean Those who are in an invalid marriage, cohabitating, failing to fulfill the weekly obligation of Sunday Liturgy or participating in any other "mortal sin" must be made clean. As Ambassadors of Christ we must reach out to them...Help them to rectify these "healable" wounds that pollute and separate them and force them to "dwell alone in a habitation outside the camp" of the faithful. This is the true work of cleansing the leper..once again, an Ambassador does not condemn the man but joins with them to conquer the sin. Do you know these lepers? Perhaps a member of your family...neighborhood.....work place? To pretend that all is well between them and God is to ignore the early detectable signs of a leprosy which with your intervention will not lead to spiritual death.
- 2) Those who have been made to "feel" unclean Divorce, hypocrisy, an uncharitable priest or fellow member of the parish may make one feel unwanted and unworthy of sharing at the table of the Lord. A divorced person who is not remarried, dating or moving toward a commitment against their marriage is in full communion with the faithful. They may not realize this or they may feel, because of their divorce, they will be looked down upon if they join us at Mass. We need to provide the cleansing of their "leprosy" by informing their conscience. One may feel that they are a hypocrite because they come to Church yet fail miserably in living the Gospel message... these "lepers" need to be reassured that they are not alone in admitting to personal weakness and struggles of living the faith. Don't let them miss the greater opportunities of Grace that comes through community worship of Eucharist. Many times people walk away feeling unwanted because of a priest's misguided zeal for preaching the Truth (condemnation from the pulpit) or self righteous judgmental pious members wishing that all Catholics would shape up or ship out. If we are the cause of such actions then we must begin the cleansing process with ourselves, as well as, to those whom we may have hurt. These experiences of "leprosy" may seem superficial but infection can set in the smallest abrasion.

HEALING TO TAKE PLACE FROM THE "PEW" NOT OUTSIDE THE CAMP

We must remember that those who have separated themselves from the Eucharistic table because of their sin or a life circumstance should be encouraged to join us during the healing process. Other than formal heresy and public excommunication all are still welcomed. Many people who sit among us in the church are gaining the strength to change or a waiting for the change to be complete but need to be with us to receive the word and at least a "spiritual communion" with the Lord. As Ambassadors let us take down the camps and open the doors with an invitation to sit next to us as we all become clean.

PASTOR'S NOTES CONTINUED

THE MONTH OF MAY: Saint Joseph; Blessed Mother; Priestly Anniversaries and First Communions

The Month of May has its origins in the Greek Mythology. The month was named after the Greek goddess Maia comes from the root Greek word that means mother. Maia was the goddess of fertility and spring. Of course, when the Emperor Constantine began his rule under his new-found belief in Christianity the focus naturally moved from the pagan goddess of fertility to the true mother of all new life Mary, our mother and the

mother of the Christ. So just as May flowers bloom with new life so does the church! New life in the journey of Faith through the Church under the guidance of our Lady.

<u>SAINT JOSEPH</u> – This great month begins with the Feast of Saint Joseph the worker. As all is made new, so is man when he participates in labor and the creation of things with his hands and toil. Joseph, as a carpenter, creates of wood, the necessary things to serve family life: Tables, chairs beds, bowls and cookware. Saint Joseph shows the dignity of work as a labor of love for family life. Joseph, winner of bread for the Holy family, reminds us that the head of the family provides, with his labor, a safe environment for Faith to grow and prosper.

It is appropriate that the month begins with Saint Joseph for his duty, role and responsibility is to honor Mary through his work and provide as a "father" to Jesus. How beautiful it is to know that Saint Joseph leads us to the love of Mary at the beginning of her month of honor!

BLESSED MOTHER — I only have fond memories of honoring Mary in the month of May as a child. The clothes hamper that served as a deposit of dirty clothes throughout the year became the pedestal and altar for Mary's honor every May. My mom would pick fresh flowers from the yard and the house was filled with the perfume of spring reminding us that all new life comes forth from Mary's "yes" to the Angel as she conceives the author of new life Christ the Lord! Every night we would gather to pray the joyful mysteries at the May altar and remember those blessed moments of Mary's role in Salvation history! "Hail Mary" you who are full of grace! Blessed are you among women! The wellspring of new life and promise!



It was appropriate, as it is today, to allow Mary the honor of this month as our intercessory and heavenly mother. It is through our love of Mary that we show greatest tribute to Jesus her son and the new life He brings eternally in Heaven. So through Joseph to Mary and through Mary to Jesus is the path that leads to true honor and praise of the Holy Family.

<u>First Communions</u> – Once again, our parishes celebrate the First Eucharist for our second graders. These celebrations usually take place in the month of May as well in order to ask Mary the mother of the innocence to guide and watch over our children as they grow in Faith. This year nearly 100 children, between the two



parishes will receive Jesus as the Bread of Life for the first time! May they always find themselves at His altar to be nurtured by Jesus throughout their lives!

CREED


