

PASTOR'S NOTES

Dying as a part of living

Our Liturgy presents us with the question that has plagued all people since the beginning of time; it focuses around the ultimate death that awaits all living things. Death is never an easy topic to discuss. It is always clouded with pain, sorrow and loss. These emotions are not looked at in a very favorable light; in fact, we shy away from them as much as we are able. Nobody likes to talk about death or dying, especially our own. Today's readings show us that Jesus has power not only over life, but also death.

Aside from the fact that there are two healings in the gospel, the main idea we are to carry with us was the faith of those asking for help. It is their certain faith that Jesus would help them that is most important. It is that same faith we must find to help us through life. Jesus represents a power over death with a promise of healing and life. As we reflect on the power of death and the affects it has on us, we must remember that death does not always mean cessation of life. This becomes the case most often when we think of the power Jesus has over us and our call to become his followers. We are all called to those everyday "dying's to self" that call us to surrender our wills to God's will.

Jesus shows us that death is ultimately a doorway to life. Just as Jairus and the woman forgot their own stations in life and overcame their fears in order to receive life from Jesus, so must we surrender our own wills in order to encounter Jesus and receive life. God's reign of life is not established by avoiding death, but by embracing it. Living the paschal mystery is none other than our daily dying to self. Overcoming our fears and reaching out to Jesus in humility, in all the little practical ways that fill our daily routines. Paschal mystery dying is as simple as smiling at the children even when we're bone tired or taking an hour out of our day to visit the sick. When we surrender in humility to his goodness and power, Jesus offers us life and in this we encounter the Lord of life.

No matter what season of the church year we find ourselves in, we are constantly reminded of what it means to be a follower of Jesus. It is always in the dying that we will find new life. St. Paul in the second reading speaks about our generosity. We are to look at our lives and ask ourselves just how much are we willing to give and how far are we willing to go to be of help to others. The basic message that we get this week is that we are not to be afraid; we are to have faith and trust in the power that Jesus brings to life. Jesus represents a power over death with a promise of healing and life. We need to be aware of just where in life we need to be healed and then ask for it. Once we are touched by the healing presence of Jesus we are better equipped to face the dying that our daily lives call us to do. As a part of our living, we must all be prepared to die.

Note from Fr. Mike ...

Well, I have been here for two weeks already and I am finally getting settled in. It is amazing how our "age" does have an effect on the changes in our lives. However, sometimes that effect is good because age also helps us to determine what is worth our time and what is not worth our time! I just want you all to know that I am happy to be here and that I am looking forward to working together. God is good in the sense that he does give us many opportunities to just "start over." Not that we can ever forget or abandon our past, but we use those things to help us with whatever we face in life. I do believe that collectively we certainly have enough experience behind us all to do many great things!

In the past two weeks, many people have contacted me wanting to talk. I just want to say that once I am settled in (whenever that happens!) I will be in contact with you. I ask for your patience and understanding during this transition. Again, I simply want to say how nice it is to return to where I had my beginnings!


During the month of May we provided over \$5,300 in assistance for requests received through the Help Line or during the food bank



He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.


