

PASTOR'S NOTES

Changing Water into Wine

As we embark into the season of Ordinary Time, we once again get to revisit the life and ministry of Jesus. We get to hear the stories of His ministry all over again as we try to apply their meaning to our lives. This church year we hear the readings from the gospel of St. Luke. Today however, we revisit the beginning of Jesus' ministry as we hear from John's gospel.

The liturgy of the Word for this week starts out reminding us of the joy the people of Israel felt as they returned to their homeland. For a long time the chosen people had been humiliated and persecuted but now the God of their Fathers was leading them back home. They refer to their relationship to God as a bride groom welcomes his bride. God refers to his people as "My Delight and Espoused." Isaiah gives us a reading that is filled with hope and promise for the people.

It is interesting that the people of Israel felt that God punished them for their sins. It was because they were not faithful to the covenant that they had to suffer. I believe that we can relate to that notion for there always seems to be that idea weaving its way through religious beliefs that God punishes people for their sins, either individually or collectively. During the hurricanes that devastated Florida, the Eastern Shore and New Orleans, and the 9/11 attacks on the World Trade Center, there were powerful voices from the religious right who claimed God was punishing the victims of these natural disasters because they had sinned. This idea certainly does not do justice to a loving God like the one we hear about in the first reading. We would all do well to emphasize the joy and rejoicing that comes into all of our lives when we experience God's saving power and love rather than blaming God for the wrongs in life.

It is because of this hope and promise that we are able to relate to God through one another. Our second reading reminds us that we are all given gifts in various degrees to work for the betterment of society. It becomes our responsibility to work together sharing our gifts to help one another. We could never emphasize enough the importance of building up the community through the shared gifts of individual members. Even though there is an ever present notion of "individualism" permeating our society, we must always trust that there will be people of good heart and will to come forward whenever needed.

The Gospel blends the joy of the first reading with the responsibilities of the second reading to a conclusion with the miracle at Cana. The miracle of changing water into wine is probably one of the more popular miracles of Jesus, at least most people (even non Christians) are aware of it. But, what we don't realize is how this miracles pertains to us. Wine in Jewish religious rituals meant life, blood, spirit and divinity. It was the sign of the Kingdom of God. The water symbolized life. The water jars that are part of the story represent the Old Law because jugs were used at Jewish ceremonial rites. In changing the water and making it wine Jesus is telling us that He is the new law which will give spirit and life. We are all transformed into abundance with Jesus and we are to become that wine to others. Jesus shows us how social He is and that He cares about the simple things of life. We are called to use that miracle in our own lives to share our gifts beyond measure to touch the lives of others. We are called to be social in the same way by being the presence of Jesus to others and helping to work this miracle every day. ~Father Mike

What is it?

It's not a religion class – or religious education. It's not Bible study. It's not babysitting. It's PRAYER. Children experience ritual – silence and song, hearing and proclaiming, processions and reverence for the Word of God.



Who should attend?

Children attending Kindergarten – Grade 5 Younger children are able to attend if accompanied by their parents and if they are able to sit for that time without being a distraction.

Where do they go?

The children are led to the Gathering Room in the church. The worship space should feel like a place where people worship. When children arrive there, they should have a sense that they have come to pray. It is not a "Cry Room."



Why do we dismiss the children for a separate Liturgy of the Word?

The primary purpose of dismissing children for a separate Liturgy of the Word is to provide them with a focused environment where they are more likely to become conscious, active listeners and responders to God's Word. The intention of the Liturgy of the Word with children is not to babysit or provide entertainment for the children. A Children's Lectionary is used so that the Reading and Gospel are in simpler language for children to understand.

What happens while the children are there?



A candle is lit to help the children settle in for the Liturgy of the Word. The children hear a Reading, sing a Responsorial Psalm, and hear the Gospel. This is followed by a Reflection. A simple Profession of Faith (Creed) is said, followed by Petitions. Each child receives a Handout to take home to extend the Gospel message. The children then return to their parents in the main body of the church for Liturgy of the Eucharist.





Gospel Reading

John 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from – although the servers who had drawn the water knew –, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

Creed


