

PASTOR'S NOTES

"Neither do I condemn you"

~Father Mike

In order for this week's reading to make sense for the 5th Sunday of Lent we need to look at them in reference to the Exodus event that is mentioned in the first reading. Isaiah in the first reading recalls the Exodus from Egypt. So important was this event in the memory of the Jews that they have celebrated it as Passover for over 3,000 years. Memory is an important part of religious experience. The re-telling of past events makes them present, not historically, but symbolically or sacramentally. When the Exodus event is read at Passover the past becomes present. This is similar to what happens when we celebrate the Liturgy. The Eucharistic celebration is not just an event that happened in the past but continues to happen throughout time.

Isaiah recalls the past for the people of Israel. However, he does not want the people to remain stuck in the past. He is calling them to move towards the future. He is trying to get the people to see that that event which they celebrate each year is a repeatable experience of God's saving presence. He tells the people that God continually intervenes in the same way that it happened at the Exodus event. This event becomes the primary way for the people of Israel to define God; Isaiah is offering comfort and a promise of peace.

St. Paul is doing the same thing in the second reading. Many people who have experienced a religious conversion will often see their past in a negative light rather than as an event that has continuity with graced moments of past experiences. He is making the point that nothing is important now except faith in Christ. He is telling the people not to be burdened by their past. The gospel picks up on this same notion with the story about the woman caught in adultery.

The gospel presents us with a scene where the religious authorities are attempting to trap Jesus by quoting an ancient law that required the stoning of a woman caught in adultery. They could really have cared less about the woman; rather they wanted to catch Jesus in a contradiction in dealing with law. Jesus was really in a no win situation but managed to turn the table and his love of mercy wins. They were ready to condemn the woman for her past but Jesus opens up a new future for her. By not allowing her to remain in the past with sin, she is liberated to a new life of grace. By not being stuck in the past she is able to move into a future. Those who wanted to stone her wanted her to die *in* her past. Jesus wanted her to die *to* her past.

In saving the woman from the fate that the authorities wanted to impose, he was really able to save them from themselves. The focus of this gospel is not the woman or her sin of adultery, but a personal encounter with Jesus. Encountering Jesus always exposes the truth; both the woman and the crowd learn the truth about their own sin. Everyone who encounters Jesus go through two changes: those who are willing to condemn, no longer condemn and the ones condemned are no longer condemned. Encounter with Jesus enables repentance in our lives.

Deep down inside, too many of us fear that our sin is bigger than God's mercy. Jesus however responds to profound sin with even more profound mercy. Once we encounter Jesus, we are moved to repent, to change our behaviors. Repentance includes both dying and rising. Changing our ways is the dying; a new relationship with Christ is the rising. The closer we become to Christ the more able we are to recognize our own sinfulness and repent of our ways. Then we hear Christ say to us, "Neither do I condemn you."



Jesus says that in giving to the poor we receive an enduring treasure in heaven (Luke 12:33). When we give to those in need, God indeed pours his love, peace and mercy into our hearts and into the hearts of those suffering in need.



Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one, sir." Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."


COMMUNION HYMN Return to God
