

#### **PASTOR'S NOTES**

#### Good Shepherd Sunday

The Fourth Sunday of Easter has always been referred to as "Good Shepherd Sunday." The image of the Shepherd is one of intimacy; of listening and being attentive to those that are being watched over: "My sheep hear my voice...and they follow me." When one considers the prevalence of sheep and shepherd images in Scripture we can understand why this is such a powerful image. Sheep are the most frequently mentioned animal in the Bible with about 400 references. The figure of a shepherd gets the honor of about 100 references. In this nomadic and agricultural culture, sheep gained a reputation as symbols of spiritual realities. Shepherds were tenders of flocks and therefore seen as leaders and providers. It was the task of a shepherd to lead his sheep at night away from predators into a safe sheepfold where they could graze, water and sleep. The shepherds never left their flocks for without them, the sheep would die. Shepherds often symbolized moral innocence and their piety was often idealized. It was no accident that the shepherds were the ones to first announce the birth of Jesus.

Although this was a vital and important image for the early Christians, it certainly doesn't have the same impact on people living in this modern world. In fact, people are often insulted when they are referred to as sheep. People often see sheep as being dirty and stupid. When we get right down to it, how many people living in our mostly urban society have ever seen sheep? One can spend a whole lifetime and never even see live sheep.

If we are to believe polls, Christian people do not see their religious leaders as "shepherds" to-day. We often see those pictures and statues of the Good Shepherd with a cute little lamb draped over his shoulder which may mislead us into thinking that following Jesus is a sweet, pious and easy venture. But Jesus is both the Good Shepherd and the Lamb who was slain. Encountering Jesus as the shepherd opens us to his care and love for us; encountering Jesus as the Lamb who was slain open us to the cost of following Jesus. While following the Good Shepherd leads us to "eternal life," the way of discipleship is not easy. As the first reading reminds us, discipleship always takes us through suffering, rejection and persecution. However, no matter what the cost of following Jesus we are not alone nor are we abandoned to our own resources. The risen Jesus is always present within us. No matter what we might encounter in following Jesus, nothing or no one can take us out of his care. This is, indeed Easter Good News.

Longing for wholeness and goodness is at the very center of who we are. However, how we go about finding this is up to us. Some people choose to focus on themselves, amassing as much money or wealth as they can since these seem to promise security and pleasure. Some people control other people, thinking power can make them whole. Others try to be "goody, goody two shoes," attracting others to a false image of themselves that cannot last. Still others withdraw within themselves trying to shut out the evil and sadness and loss of hope which is around us.

And then there are those who get it right: the only true way to wholeness and goodness is to follow Jesus along the path of self-sacrifice, willing to be a lamb for the sake of others. This is what Good Shepherd Sunday is all about; it's about a God who so deeply cares for us that the only Son became the lamb and was slain. We will ultimately be saved not by power, but by pastoral caring and gentleness.

As of April 30th, total pledged is \$118,611.58. That is only 73.2% of our Diocesan goal.



Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia. On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God. On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. When the lews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said. Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth." The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord. All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread through the whole region. The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were Worshipers and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium. The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

#### Creed




