## **PASTOR'S NOTES**

## Greetings Immaculate Conception and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parishes!

As your new Pastor, I am honored to write this first note to you in the bulletin! I am also truly grateful and humbled for the Blessing of being able to be a Shepherd here for you! I have been ordained for 10 years.

I have two sisters and both of my parents close enough to the area that I am sure you'll see them at Mass! I enjoy having a section of the bulletin to share with you some of the clarities I have received in my spiritual life and things that I find helpful. I try to do this weekly, and I hope you find them helpful. A big part of my life is prayer; so I share prayerful things often! I know it is not the Lenten season right now, but I want to give you a way that I have found helpful in my own life in loving our Lord in the Eucharist even more!

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. A Few Lenten seasons ago, I noticed something in my heart during the Stations of the Cross in my former parish. I noticed my lack of engagement of the mind and attention during the praying of the stations. I felt guilt about this lacking in my will and let it be what it was, a place for growth. Not too long after, I experienced a simple but good clarity during a Holy Hour. The clarity was that I needed to pray just two Stations of the Cross per day, year round, and begin immediately.

So, I got started. I had a very simple stations booklet and began with the First and Second Station on a Monday usually at the end of my Holy Hour. In a week's time (2 per day) I prayed all 14 stations (But) this week I didn't just pray them... I meditated on them. I invited them to take root in my mind without even realizing it. Doing this daily practice was a wonderful gift the Holy Spirit prompted me to do. Very quickly, I had memorized the Stations in a new and more fruitful way. I could see them when I closed my eyes and meditated on a certain station.

After a few months of this 2 stations per day habit, I noticed that when I was visiting a different Catholic Church I wasn't regularly at, I would genuflect to the Tabernacle and immediately want to look upon the stations around the Church, especially my new favorite one: Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus! Station #6. I love the way different Artistic Stations depict this most Holy Moment in this prayer from tradition. The next Lenten Season after forming this habit, I looked forward to prayerfully walking the Stations of our Lord and entered more deeply, because they didn't only live now in my book, they lived in my mind. I also experienced a noticeable increase in centering my life around the Holy Eucharist! This is one prayerful way I have found help in centering my mind on our Lord daily in His gift of himself to us in the Eucharist. I hope it is helpful to you!





It is important to note that every penny we raise above our Diocesan goal is ASSESMENT FREE. That means all those dollars stay here at Immaculate Conception parish.



## Creed




