PASTOR'S NOTES

3 Day Reset: Make one small lasting change every month!

I first heard about this spiritual practice a few years ago and have found it to be very fruitful. What's a 3 day reset? This is spending 3 days of special attention and focus on the Holy Spirit's promptings for you in your life at the beginning of each month. Every Christian can use a special 3 day reset to help clarify earthly concerns. (and) The Number 3 is especially important in Scripture. Our Lord Jesus rose from the dead on the 3rd day. Joseph and Mary found the Lord Jesus in the Temple when He was left behind from the traveling caravan after 3 days without him! The Israelites prepared for 3 days at Mount Sinai before God's manifestation on the Mountain in Exodus 19.

So how do I do this practice? Each person's 3 day reset likely will look different. The practice involves fasting from anything you normally partake in too freely and spending more time in quiet with the Holy Spirit! If you have a tendency to spend money too freely; you may pray about a special spiritual budget you follow during these 3 days and try to tell no one about it if possible, other than your spouse. Certainly, a husband and wife can and should be transparent about those types of things (but you get the idea). If overspending is never a problem for you, figure out what your thing *to fast from* should be. Make your 3 days special and penitential and invite the Holy Spirit into it. It's sort of like a *mini lent* each month! Wherever your prayer life and daily habits are at the end of the month, ask the Holy Spirit about what small tweak or lasting change for the better you could make to your routine for the next month. Spend quiet time in prayer or especially in a Holy hour listening for promptings/ideas.

I write down one idea per day of the 3. At the conclusion of the 3 days, I pray about which one the Holy Spirit desires me to stick with for the month, and I write that down on my log. I keep one page at the beginning of each year for this practice with 12 blank spaces, each for the purpose of the 3 day reset each month(they will be filled in throughout the year). You don't have to start this practice perfectly, you can keep it very simple, just get started for the Month of July, if your able and willing!

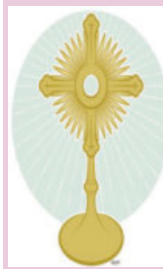

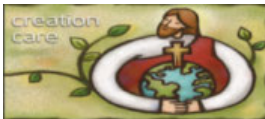

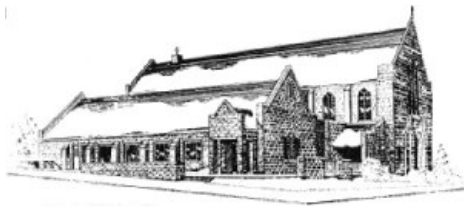

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Acts 12:1-11

In those days, King Herod laid hands upon some members of the Church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also. –It was the feast of Unleavened Bread.– He had him taken into custody and put in prison under the guard of four squads of four soldiers each. He intended to bring him before the people after Passover. Peter thus was being kept in prison, but prayer by the Church was fervently being made to God on his behalf.

On the very night before Herod was to bring him to trial, Peter, secured by double chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while outside the door guards kept watch on the prison. Suddenly the angel of the Lord stood by him and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and awakened him, saying, “Get up quickly.” The chains fell from his wrists. The angel said to him, “Put on your belt and your sandals.” He did so. Then he said to him, “Put on your cloak and follow me.” So he followed him out, not realizing that what was happening through the angel was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. They passed the first guard, then the second, and came to the iron gate leading out to the city, which opened for them by itself. They emerged and made their way down an alley, and suddenly the angel left him. Then Peter recovered his senses and said, “Now I know for certain that the Lord sent his angel and rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all that the Jewish people had been expecting.”




