

PASTOR'S NOTES

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Pray your sufferings by naming them to the Lord in prayer.

In today's second reading from Colossians, Saint Paul says; "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake." What does that mean to rejoice in his sufferings? St. Paul had a heart so conformed to Christ that his sufferings were offered all for the Kingdom of God. He was able to offer them immediately for the Lord no matter what they were. How was he able to do this? The Lord Jesus changed him from a man against the Will of God to a man completed conformed to the Heart of Christ. I love to contemplate how to become more like St. Paul. However, I am weak and have much to learn and many areas I need to grow in holiness each day. But I know it is the Holy Spirit who helps us in our weakness!

All growth begins with small but firm habits incorporated into our daily routine with the help of the Holy Spirit. I want to offer you one habit I find helpful that I have learned to do. You could call this prayer your "Saint Paul Bowl" or your "Rejoice in your daily sufferings bowl." I usually just call them, "praying my daily sufferings"...and I have found this to be a very good form of prayer. How do you do this? Simply find a few (perhaps 5) little crosses around your house or in your drawers and gather them into one place. Get a little bowl or container for them. Enter into some quiet time at the end of the day and contemplate your day. Try to think of 5 different sufferings you received in the day, big or small, and say, "Lord Jesus I love you, I desire a heart that is united to yours. You suffered unimaginably so that we could recover miraculously. In my weakness, I don't want crosses in my day, but they are there and I choose to pray them so that in some small way, I can be united to you." I then simply place one cross in the bowl as I name the suffering of the day. I like the number 5 for the 5 wounds of our Lord. When you pray them, try to forget them, never write them down, let them be offered and try not to complain about them later. I do this before Night Prayer, but you could simply pray an Our Father, and Act of Contrition, or a Hail Holy Queen prayer to conclude.

What are the fruits of this daily prayer? Our sufferings have an impact on our faith, the enemy wants us to turn away from Christ when we suffer, but the Lord calls us to pick up our cross and follow him on the path of light. This prayer has helped me over the years to see inconveniences and stumbling blocks in my day as opportunities for prayer. The crosses in a bowl method just makes it a very tangible way to do this prayer exercise. I also pray my joys every day! I love those and I have many! But I have learned to appreciate the need to pray my sufferings or inconveniences as well. Below is a photo from my kitchen table I took for this bulletin piece of my "Saint Paul Bowl."

Pro Tip: You can still pray asking the Lord to heal or remove sufferings you receive after having prayed them and seek to do better tomorrow so that whatever may have caused them is healed: But you can still pray them today! I'm never perfect at this prayer and you don't have to be either-but it is a gift you and I can give to the Lord in conformity with His Will! May your daily sufferings be light and easy to pray today.

Psalm 20:3,4 "May He remember all your offerings, and regard with favor your burnt sacrifices! May He grant you your hearts desire, and fulfill all your plans."




VOCATIONS PRAYER

Creed


