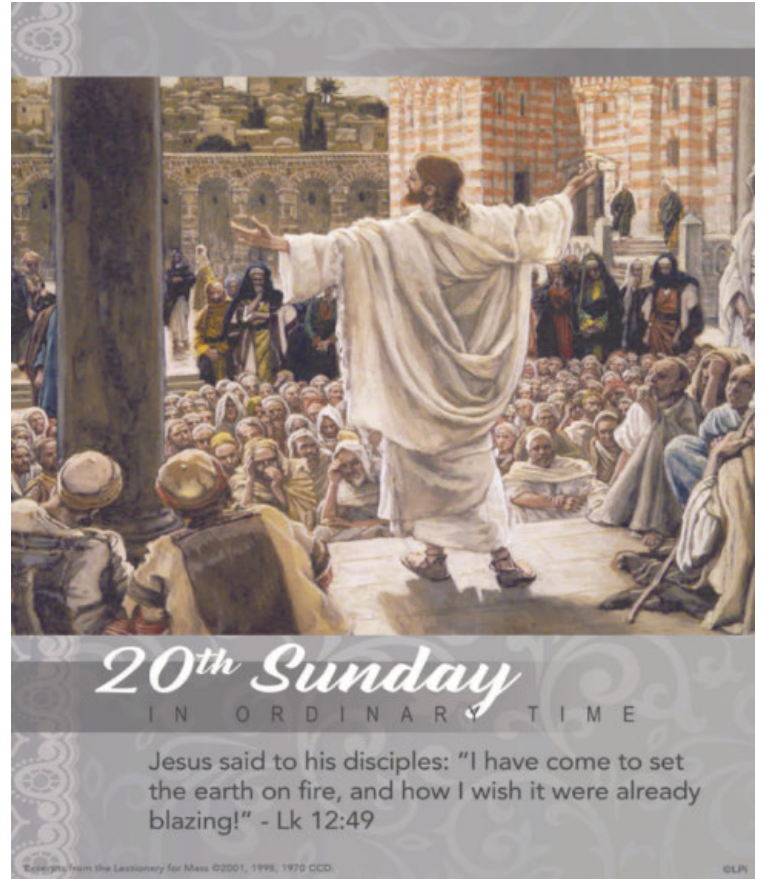

PASTOR'S NOTES

The Spiritual Practice of giving the Lord my first preference:

Gospel

Luke 12:49-53

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I have come to set the earth on fire,
and how I wish it were already blazing!

There is a baptism with which I must be baptized,
and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished!

Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth?

No, I tell you, but rather division."

The Holy Spirit comes to change us and convert us to the Will of the Father. Hearing today's Gospel, in that understanding, gives meaning to the word *division*. This *division* is between God's Will and our fallen nature. We certainly see this division between the spirit of the culture and the teachings of the Church, and this has been true since Christ walked the earth. The Lord Jesus did not come to affirm all that human beings were doing, or are doing today. He came to save them and us from our sins. We pray for help with this when we ask for God's Will to be done every time we pray an Our Father prayer. Saint Paul teaches us that our earthly desires are directly opposed to the Will of God, but this doesn't mean that holiness is not possible for us on Earth. Obviously, the church has produced many great Saints, and we too are called to that same holiness.

So, what's a tangible recipe for holiness? The Lord must increase in my life, and I (my earthly preferences) must decrease a little every day. But *how* do we do this? We grow in holiness first by the sacramental life of the Church, especially in the sacrament of reconciliation and the reception of the most Holy Eucharist at Mass. After that, we grow in holiness through the habit of little daily sacrifices. What kind of sacrifices? Prayer is a great little daily sacrifice because it requires the denial of my earthly will to embrace the ultimate good—time with God. Ok, I pray daily, what else? Another common practice is to offer to the Lord my first preference for something when I have a choice and go with my *second choice* instead of my first. You can give that small gift of your first choice to the Lord, and it's a good spiritual discipline! Don't let yourself think the small things don't matter. If I cannot master the small things, no big accomplishments in the spiritual life will ever follow. Big things build upon the foundation of small *holy habits*. Saint Therese of Lisieux, a Doctor of the Church, taught us this principle quite well (*To focus on the little things with great love*). Ok, how about providing an example for this *second preference* spiritual practice! --Sure!

Start at the store. The next time you are shopping and find two similar options for a thing, see if you can offer to the Lord your first preference, pass it up, and go with your second choice of a similar thing! If you can make this a habit where applicable, you will have an excellent small daily habit of sacrifice even if it's only once per day. Name it to the Lord prayerfully when you do it. You can also name an intention: Lord I offer this sacrifice of my first preference for the healing of _____. (Just like we do in verbal intercessory prayer)

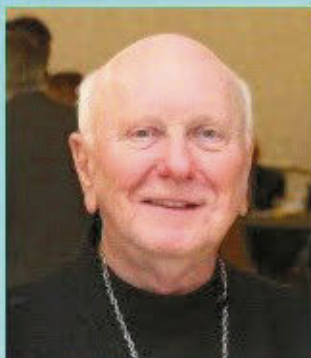

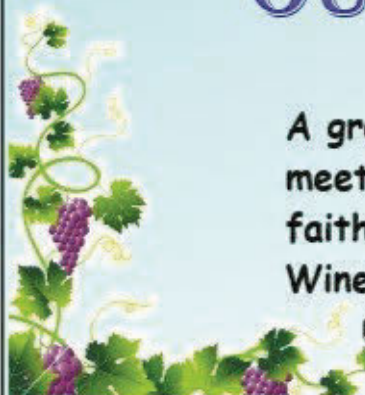

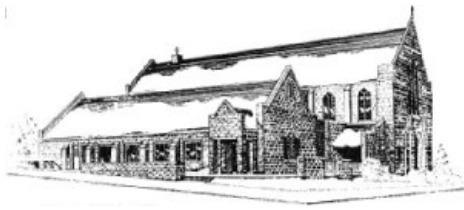

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

In those days, the princes said to the king: "Jeremiah ought to be put to death; he is demoralizing the soldiers who are left in this city, and all the people, by speaking such things to them; he is not interested in the welfare of our people, but in their ruin." King Zedekiah answered: "He is in your power"; for the king could do nothing with them. And so they took Jeremiah and threw him into the cistern of Prince Malchiah, which was in the quarters of the guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the cistern, only mud, and Jeremiah sank into the mud.
