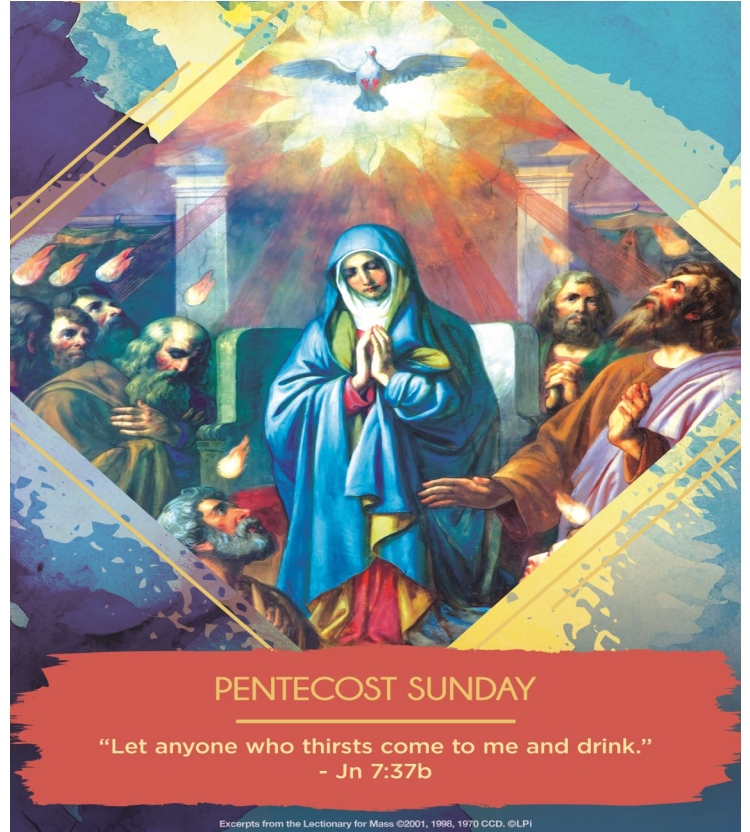

PASTOR'S NOTES

If My Prayers Actually Worked: What Would I Pray For?

One way to focus prayer and daily intentions is to stop and think: What is actually on my mind right now? If my prayers actually worked, what would I pray for?

First, the people of encounter. Who has expressed a need to me today, directly or indirectly? Pray for their intention while discerning what that intention truly is. There is often a point to our encounters with people, and part of that point may be for our prayer time. **Second**, the long-term things. What situations, burdens, people, or concerns have been consistently entering my mind over time? These long-term thoughts often reveal where deeper prayer is needed. **Third**, the more recent fears and anxieties of the past weeks.

If it is something I recently caused, pray for the clarity and wisdom to bring peace to the situation through my words and actions in a way that is level, balanced, and fruitful.

If it is something I did not cause, ask the Holy Spirit what blessing He desires me to send into the situation with my powers. I love that word “powers,” because it means the mind, faith, body, and words I control, which God sustains and animates, giving me freedom to use them either for Him or against Him.

Then there is the world itself. What do I wish I could make a difference in on a world scale simply through prayer to God? Name those things.

Finally, mentally look around my atmosphere. What needs do I notice in the people around me as a whole—in the parish I serve and in daily life? If my prayers actually worked, what would I pray for?
