

TONY MELENDEZ - LIVE IN CONCERT

His family came to America so he could have corrective surgery. By the age 16 Tony taught himself to play the guitar with his toes and became a singer and composer. Tony played for Pope John Paul II. His music and stories are of overcoming life's problems through changes in attitude and discipline. They speak of hope, encouragement and faith.

JESUS AND THE JEWISH ROOTS OF THE EUCHARIST

Dr. Brant Pitre uses the Hebrew Scriptures and Jewish tradition to frame the actions of Jesus at the Last Supper, and to provide a fresh look at the heart of Catholic practice—the Eucharist. By taking us back to the Jewish roots of our faith, Dr. Pitre gives us a powerful lens through which to see anew the bread of the presence, the manna, the Last Supper, and ultimately the meaning of the Eucharist.
