



Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity. We celebrate our belief in Three Persons in One God every time we make the sign of the cross.



# **God's Story**

Every family has its own unique story. Some speak of the immigration of their forebears. Others trace their ancestry back many generations within the place where they live. Some have endured great hardship. Others have received countless blessings. Every family has stories that make it different from every other family.

On his way to the Promised Land, Moses reminded his people of their story.
